
Lent Groups at Holy Trinity

Dear Friends,

This month sees the beginning of Lent - that six week period when we embark upon a quiet journey of self-examination and prayer as we make our way towards Good Friday and Easter. Please do come along to Holy Trinity at 7pm on Ash Wednesday (22nd February) when the Lenten pilgrimage will begin with a service of ashing. We shall be joined by our friends from St Mary's Bridgwater.

A suggestion for one way in which we might draw closer to God's goodness and love during Lent is to commit during this period to pay extra special attention as we take communion on Sundays, and, for some, on Thursdays. The following little reflection is based upon a recent offering in the daily devotional magazine "Word For Today" (published by UCB 220123).

Taking communion can be a meaningless ritual, or an intimate time spent in the presence of Jesus.

Cleopas and his companion met some women who had just been to the empty tomb and reported that Jesus was alive. But try as they might they couldn't believe it. Cleopas and his friends were travelling home to Emmaus when Jesus suddenly appeared and walked along with them. First He opened their eyes to see that the crucifixion wasn't the tragedy they thought, but a fulfilment of prophecy and God's way to redeem a lost world; something to celebrate and not be sad about. Later, as He sat in their home and ate supper with them, 'he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they recognised him' (Luke 24.30-31).

Are you battling fear and doubt today? Are you wondering if God will keep His promise to you? He will! This Emmaus story proves that Jesus loves doubters enough to walk with them, take away their fears, and strengthen their faith; and he did this as they broke bread. So next time you're taking communion, stop and pray, 'Lord, speak to me. Show me Your will and Your way.' That's a prayer He will answer. Your mind may be confused and your anxiety great, but He will show up and meet you at the point of your need.

God bless you for a peaceful, reflective and blessing-filled Lent.
