From the Curate:

So when do you take your Christmas decorations down? Twelfth night is a popular bet - that's the eve of the Feast of the Epiphany (gold, frankincense, myrrh, and a sideways look at that bottle of wine you said you weren't going to touch). But did you know that it's still the Christmas season until 2nd February? That's forty days after the Feast of the Nativity, when the Church celebrates Candlemas. Among the other names for this occasion is the 'Presentation', because in the story we recall from Luke's Gospel, the infant Jesus is brought to the Jerusalem Temple by his parents, and 'presented' to God. By far the most charming turn in the tale, however, is that Jesus is recognised as the world's hope and blessing. Not by the great and the powerful. But by two elderly people - Simeon and Anna - whose quiet, humble faithfulness has guided their whole lives towards this moment. Simeon's words, still recited daily at Evening Prayer, are famous and beautiful: 'Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace...'. As so often in Luke, those who see most clearly, and live most faithfully, are those 'on the margins', who never claim centrestage, but who persist without fanfare in love, kindness, and self-giving service. Pope Benedict XVI, who died at the turn of the year, described such people as those 'with roots in the living waters of God's word'.

Whether or not they would identify themselves in this way, I know from the enormous privilege of ministering here over the past two years, that our local community is full of those who offer countless acts of kindness and self-giving love, day by day. The work of the Church amongst all of this is not anxiously to convert; it is joyfully to foster and support such kindness and love wherever they occur, confident that they have a source and purpose. This is the work which David and Angela blessed so many with during their time here, and it is the work I shall gladly do my very best to continue in the months ahead, as these parishes seek a new pastor. If there is anything at all I can do to assist you, or further the many good causes among us, please don't hesitate to be in touch.

I shall keep you all in my prayers, as we navigate 2023 together!

List of defibrillators – Defibrillators are devices that send an electric pulse or shock to the heart to restore a normal heartbeat. They are used to prevent or correct an arrhythmia, an uneven heartbeat that is too slow or too fast. If the heart suddenly stops, defibrillators can also help it beat again. Defibrillators are kept accessible to parishioners so that in an emergency a member of the general public can use it. The ambulance service knows the access codes for the defibrillators and advises people where their nearest defibrillators are when they phone 999. It is a good idea for you to know where your local defibrillators are:

The New Inn; The Ferry Marina; The Swan Inn; The Village Hall – soon to be back in service; The Sailing Club – limited access

Horning Primary School pupils aim for dizzy heights

Some of the pupils of Horning Primary School scaled the dizzy heights at the beginning of the new year, when members of Fox class had their first taste of wall climbing at Highball in Norwich.

This was the first of three sessions at Highball, and excitement ran high as the pupils aged 7-11 years geared up with the appropriate shoes and safety harnesses, before absorbing initial instruction. After practising their climbing techniques on the training wall, the children headed for the main challenge of the day. Once they had gained confidence with heights, it became clear that there was talent amongst the participants, and many of them climbed to the top of the wall and glided down the safety ropes to the bottom.

"Widening the children's experiences ranks highly in our ethos, so excursions beyond the school boundary are something we try to incorporate into the curriculum as often as possible," commented David Hopkins, Deputy Executive Head of Bacton and Horning Primary Schools. "It was most gratifying to see our pupils tackling wall climbing with such enthusiasm and enjoyment, while boosting their confidence to overcome possible initial qualms. They had tremendous fun, while gaining an important life-skill.

"We try to present as many new experiences and challenges as possible to the children who attend Horning school. These climbing sessions follow on from a visit to the Time and Tide Museum in Great Yarmouth late last year as part of the children's learning based around the Romans. There will also be a visit to West Stow Anglo Saxon Village as part of this term's topic."
