FROM THE VICAR TEMPTATION

It's the first Sunday in Lent, and every year that means that the gospel reading is about temptation - Jesus in the wilderness, hungry and alone, being tempted by Satan, and then our own attitude.

I'm grateful to American pastor and evangelist Charles Swindoll for this story.

"Son," ordered a father, "Don't swim in that canal."

"OK, Dad," he answered. But he came home carrying a wet bathing suit that evening.

"Where have you been?" demanded the father.

"Swimming in the canal," answered the boy. "Didn't I tell you not to swim there?" asked the father.

"Yes, Dad," answered the boy.

"Why did you?" he asked.

"Well, Dad," he explained, "I had my bathing suit with me and I couldn't resist the temptation."

"Why did you take your bathing suit with you?" he questioned.

"So I'd be prepared to swim, in case I was tempted," he replied.

I think part of the problem as we think about temptation is that we often use the passive voice when talking about it—it was something done to us. "I was tempted to do this or that." The reality is that all too often we place ourselves in the way of temptation where it is easy to fall to it. It's one thing to say that Jesus was driven by the Holy Spirit out into the desert to be tempted, and quite another to say that I took myself out into the desert to be tempted.

Mark Twain said, "There are several good protections against temptation, but the surest is cowardice." If you know you are weak in a particular area in your moral life, be careful in that area.

THE PROBLEM OF BEING A CHRISTIAN POLITICIAN



Kate Forbes is an SNP MP—and an active Christian. She does not approve of gay marriage or of having children outside marriage. Neither does she support the

controversial Gender Reform Bill. But she is also one of those who want to become the First Minister and Leader of the SNP following the recent resignation of Nicola Sturgeon.

But there are those who do not support her simply because of her Christian moral beliefs and three key MSPs have already disassociated themselves from her.

Ian Blackford is the former leader of the SNP in Westminster. He commented, not unsympathetically, that as a Christian politician, you need to be very careful about mixing religious views and politics. "For me, my faith is important it shapes who you are. But we are always facing this question, 'how do you align your faith to the responsibility you have as an elected politician to represent all of your constituents'."

CHRISTIAN NAME 'OFFENSIVE'



The University of Kent has asked students to stop using the expression 'Christian name' to avoid offending non-believers.

The institution's new inclusive guidelines encourage using 'first

name', 'given name' or 'family name rather than those which involve "religion and belief". It has also pointed out that 'surname' whilst not unacceptable may originate from sire-name, or the name derived from one's father."

In December, the University of Brighton encouraged staff and students to say "winter closure period" instead of Christmas and in January, the London School of Economics announced it was dropping the traditional Christian titles for its academic term dates

THE GAY MARRIAGE VOTE FALLOUT

The Global South Fellowship of Anglican Churches (GSFA) has announced it will no longer recognise the Archbishop of Canterbury as the "leader of the global communion", following the



decision to allow same-sex couples to be blessed within the Church of England.

The GFSA said that the Church of England (CofE) had "disqualified" itself by allowing same-sex blessings and that they no longer considered the CofE as the "mother church".

The GSFA says it speaks for 75% of Anglicans around the world, officially representing 25 member provinces - mainly in Asia, Latin America and Africa. It said that it would no longer work "in communion" with groups that have "taken the path of false teaching". They accused the Church of England of going against "the historical biblical faith", adding: "This breaks our hearts."

These provinces will not leave the Anglican Communion. But according to the statement, their leaders will "expeditiously meet, consult and work with other orthodox Primates in the Anglican Church across the nations to re-set the Communion on its biblical foundation."

FOOTBALLER ATSU DEAD IN EARTHQUAKES

The body of former
Newcastle footballer
Christian Atsu has been
found under a collapsed
building following Turkey's
recent earthquakes.



The 31-year-old was a devout Christian and would often use his high profile to share his faith. He used to attend Hillsong Church Newcastle during his time at Newcastle United.

In 2018, he told Ghana Sports he became a Christian at the age of 16 and has since tried to "imitate the life that Jesus Christ was living".



ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of Lent, of

course, the 40 day season for self-examination and repentance, prayer, fasting and self denial and also reading and meditating on God's word.

A small group of us gathered at Christ Church for the Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion. And we were reminded that it is the interior faith, our relationship with God, which drives external Christian moral action.

LENT COURSE THE KING'S SPEECH

The last Lent course I attempted to run, on the film *The King's Speech*, was cut off by Covid after only one session. In my opinion the King's Speech is one of the most outstanding films ever to be made, and I have decided that I want to have another go at the course, repeating the first session.

The commitment is to six sessions at the Vicarage. Each session will happen both on a Wednesday evening and a Friday afternoon, to give people the best chance of getting there. You can come to either one. A booklet will be provided.

Tea/coffee and biscuits will be served. Each session will be over in about an hour and a half. It will consist of the showing of two clips of between four and about six minutes, and discussion.




