# FROM THE VICAR "I HAVE A VOICE"



Our Lent course this year is based on the 2010 film *The King's Speech*, which is about the accession of King George VI to the throne, his distressing and debilitating stammer, and the efforts of his Australian speech therapist Lionel Logue to help him. It's an outstanding film, in which arguably the climax is not the

speech itself, but the end of a row between the King and Logue in Westminster Abbey just before the Coronation. After a bitter exchange the King shouts out at fever pitch "I have a right to be heard, I have a voice!" which, in a smart duplication of meaning, means that yes, he can conquer his stammer, and yes, he can lead the nation. It's an utterly marvellous moment. But the reality is that it's only in safety that he can speak.

For me the comparison with our Church is obvious. Christians are adopted sons and heirs of God in Christ, according to the New Testament, and yet we the Church, despite our lofty status, seem to find it almost impossible to speak out a gospel message. We shelter in our palaces - our churches, our liturgies, the places where the general public don't come. And even there it is rare to hear Christians talking in any specific way about their faith - God's love for them in Christ, what they have discovered in their Bible study, how they are refreshed or guided in prayer, who they know who really needs praying for.

Terrified by allegations of arrogance or intolerance, we can't seem speak out the gospel, can't even seem to agree that we should, and instead we try to inhabit easier ground - as the social conscience of the nation, or talking about justice which, while it is undoubtedly a Christian theme, is not *the* Christian theme.

# **CHRISTIAN NEWS**

### CHURCH REJECTS BISHOP



One of the UK's biggest churches, St Helen's Bishopsgate, has announced it will no longer accept episcopal oversight from the Church of England's House of Bishops.

It is in response to the bishops' decision to "exalt their desire for an institutional political consensus above the authority of Jesus's word", following the General Synod's vote to bless couples in same-sex marriage or civil partnerships.

The Vicar, Revd William Taylor, added that "The bishops of the Church of England have walked away from us. By contrast, we will continue to walk in closer union with those who uphold the teaching of God's word, and will actively develop stronger gospel partnerships with them," Rev William added. The Church has asked Most Rev Dr Foley Beach, Chairman of GAFCON (The Global Anglican Future Conference) to provide pastoral oversight.

# **FOLEY MAINTAINS LEAD**



It has been a turbulent week in the Scottish National Party. Since Nicola Sturgeon announced her resignation the race has been on to find her successor and this really looks like being between Hamza Yousaf and Kate

Forbes.

Kate Forbes is a member of the Free Church of Scotland and makes no secret about her faith, which includes unease with sex before marriage, childbirth before marriage, same sex marriage, abortion and the SNP determination to change the definitions of male and female. She has said she believes that a trans woman is a "biological male who identifies as a woman".

Her opponent has said that someone who believes what she does should never be allowed to lead the SNP and the knives have certainly been out for her this week. The battle is far from over, but a poll this week suggested that only 5% of Scottish voters thought that her Christian faith is an issue.

But these are early days, and we won't know who will win this till 27th March.

### TRANS BASED PULL-OUT

An American Christian girls school has dropped out of its state basketball championship after discovering its opponent had a transgender player on its team. They abdicated their participation over



concerns of "fairness" and "safety".

The Head of Mid Vermont Christian School said thee school team withdrew from the Vermont Division IV state tournament because they "believe playing against an opponent with a biological male jeopardizes the fairness of the game and the safety of our players".

Vermont State does not ban transgender women from participating in women's sports and indeed insists that transgender students should be able to compete in line with gender identity.

But the Head said, "As a Christian-based school we have a statutory and constitutional right to make decisions based on our religious beliefs, including those pertaining to marriage and sexuality,"

# N KOREAN 'EXTERMINATION'

Christians in North Korea are being sent to labour camps, a leading persecution charity has warned.



According to Open Doors, there has been a rise in

incidents of persecution against Christians across the last year. Being part of an underground church could be a death sentence for many living under Kim Jong-un; in one incident detailed by the persecution charity, when interviewed by The Telegraph, believers were rounded up and executed after their church was discovered.

North Korea continues to top the Open Doors World Watch List as the most dangerous place to be a Christian. In 2022, it was topped by Afghanistan after years in the top spot. In 2023, it has returned to the list as the most dangerous place in the world to be a Christian. Under 2% of the North Korean population holds to the Christian faith.

# LENT COURSE THE KING'S SPEECH

The last Lent course I attempted to run, on the film *The King's Speech*, was cut off by Covid after only one session. In my opinion the King's Speech is one of the most outstanding films ever to be made, and I decided that I wanted to have another go at the course, repeating the first session.

The course commitment has been to a showing of the film then to five sessions at the Vicarage, parallel sessions each week on a Wednesday evening and a Friday afternoon, to give everyone the maximum chance of getting there. A booklet is provided.

Each session lasts about an hour and a half, including tea, coffee and biscuits. It will consist of the showing of two clips of between four and about six minutes, and discussion. This is Lent, of course, and so the focus is on ourselves, our taking stock and our moving on in faith, so the discussions are in that area.

We have already had the showing of the film and the first session, but you are most welcome to join us for the remaining sessions. If you want to borrow the film

to watch it, just give me a ring.
