Foreword from Bishop John



Earlier in July we launched 'Pray for Growth', a dedicated period of prayer that our diocese will grow both spiritually and numerically over the coming years.

By 2030 we pray that we shall have healthy and sustainable churches throughout the Diocese which are resourced and encouraged to worship God, make disciples, share hope, and transform their communities. We

hope to have double the number of children and young people in our churches, at least 100 new worshipping communities and congregations of 150 people in each major area of population.

None of this will happen without prayer and many of these themes run through this prayer diary. Among other things in this edition, we will pray for new Authorised Lay Ministers, new Readers (Licenced Lay Minsters) and those who will be ordained as part of our Auxiliary Pathway, as well as those in our schools, workplace chaplains and new members of DBF staff.

I hope you will join us in this corporate prayer, that more people will hear the Good News of Jesus' love for them and join us as we share that love with others.

New Readers licensed

Next Saturday, Bishop Martin will be licensing new Licensed Lay Ministers (also known as Readers) for parishes in Worcestershire and Dudley. Licensed Lay Ministry is distinguished from most other lay ministries in requiring the Bishop's licence under the canon law of the Church of England, and candidates must complete a more demanding two-year training course.



This year's candidates have found the last two years both a challenging and exciting time, as they have had their understanding of their faith stimulated and deepened. LLMs are primarily called to be ministers of the Word in pastoral, teaching and mission contexts. They are resources for parishes in thinking about what God's calling for this community in this place might be. Some of them support traditional church communities, and others are engaged in helping build new worshipping communities.

Harvest

Over the coming weeks many of our churches will be holding Harvest Festivals, giving thanks for the gifts we receive from God's creation. Many services will include bringing gifts of fresh produce and other food to church. These will often then be donated to local foodbanks and pantries in our communities.

The service of Harvest is a more modern addition to the church calendar. Its origins are usually traced to an 1843 adaption of Lammas Day (a thanksgiving for the wheat harvest) by Revd R.S. Hawker. He chose the first Sunday in October as this coincided with the traditional, more secular, 'harvest home' celebration.



An annual church celebration of the harvest established itself rapidly with great popularity and was first recognised officially in the Church of England in 1862.

HIII PRISONS WEEK A WEEK OF PRAYER

The diocesan Criminal Justice Affairs Group (CJAG) aims to offer a Christian perspective and advise on criminal justice matters.

On Prisons' Sunday each year, the Cathedral has welcomed CJAG's input on a specific theme. This year's service aims to raise awareness and encourage prayer for everyone affected by imprisonment and the Criminal Justice System. It is clear that the system in Britain is in a state of severe crisis which affects the whole of our society, not just those in prison and their families. Britain has the highest imprisonment rates in Western Europe. Numbers are steadily growing despite evidence that redirecting resources to welfare, housing, education and health and social care would result in holistic investment in communities that would address the root causes of crime and violence. Community sentences cost 10% of the cost of a prison place. Society has lost its sense of justice and humanity, and CJAG asks what does it take for this to be taken seriously and for change to happen?

Meco War Memorial

The Meco war memorial marks the events of 3 October 1940, when a lone German aircraft dropped bombs on the Meco Mining Company factory in Bromyard Road, Worcester. It was the only bombing raid on the city that resulted in the death of civilians. The bombs killed seven workers aged 19 to 77. Doris Tindall lost



her sight and over 50 other staff were injured. In 1947 a memorial plaque was unveiled and dedicated at the factory to commemorate those who had died. Doris Tindall's name was also included.

Due to the closure of the Komatsu Mining Company the memorial needed to be moved and earlier this year, the memorial was rededicated in St John-in-Bedwardine Church in a special service to which the family members of those listed on the memorial were invited. Today we remember all those who have been impacted by conflict and war and those who work for peace.
