From the Rectory

I write this in November surrounded by the dead leaves and dry, subdued tones of late autumn. And in the church calendar there has been the solemnity of the season of remembrance through which we have been journeying. Almost buried underneath all this weight, we look for something new in which we can find hope. But we struggle to find this in the world immediately around us.

And yet God promises to do a new thing. The prophet Isaiah tells us that God is about to do a new thing (see Isaiah 43: 19). And this new thing is fulfilled in the coming of Christ, to which we look forward during Advent and which we celebrate at Christmas.

But the new is not completely unconnected with the old nor is it completely unforeseen. I was reminded of this recently when I was sitting in one of the new classrooms in North Cadbury Church School. The new classroom was still on the same site and its arrival had been prophesied for many years. Apparently, when one teacher was interviewed for a job in the school some thirty five years ago she was promised that the new classroom would be arriving very soon! And now many years later the new has finally come.

So, also with Jesus. His coming was prophesied in many different ways and His ministry fulfilled hopes that people already had. At the beginning of His ministry, Jesus quoted a prophecy of Isaiah about a person known as the Servant, 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon

me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor...' Then, simply and



dramatically, He sat down and said 'Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing' (see Luke 4: 18-21).

Along, however, with the excitement of hearing that in Jesus the new had come and that the old prophecies were fulfilled, there must also have been an element of shock and challenge. For, sometimes, our old ways even if they are not very productive or fulfilling are nonetheless comfortable and familiar. They can be difficult to break out of. Perhaps, for instance, we prefer the comfort of discussing and grumbling about the way the world is going rather than the challenge of actually doing something about it.

So as we look forward to Christmas this is indeed exciting and a celebration of the new thing that God is doing through Jesus. However, we need to welcome those new things which God wants to bring into our lives. Through the Holy Spirit, Jesus may wish to change our lives in many ways. Perhaps, He may make us aware in a fresh way of our need to share in the sufferings of others and to seek to help them. Who knows what God might do with us? Are we ready for the challenge of the new in our lives?



From the Bishop

When I speak to my Mum on my birthday, she often recalls to me the events that surrounded my arrival in the world. These include nearly being born in the hospital lift, my older brother being smuggled in to see me under my dad's overcoat and of various aunts sneaking onto the maternity ward out of visiting hours by wearing their WRVS uniforms.

Each of us has a unique story about our birth. At Christmas we'll be recounting once again the story that we share about another birth - the birth of Jesus. Across the world we'll be re-telling and reenacting what happened in Bethlehem more than 2,000 years ago. We'll recall the journey of Mary and Joseph, the birth in the stable, the arrival of the shepherds, the song of the angels, the visit of the Magi.

Our own birth stories are unique to each of us. Jesus's is common to us all. And not just because we all know about it. For in our recollection of Iesus' birth. we'll also be remembering that that in him, God came to be at one with us. In Jesus God arrived to share fully in our humanity, experiencing complete solidarity with every aspect of our human condition. Jesus is 'God with us' - in trenches in Ukraine, bomb shelters in Israel and Gaza, in hospital wards where loved ones die, in



relationships where there is conflict and distress.

A unique story

Just as much as he is with us in our greatest joys and our deepest woes, Jesus is also for us. One of the earliest teachers of the

Church said this: 'He became what we are so that we might become what he is.' The baby born in Bethlehem stands with us not only in all that we experience. This child also comes to offer us the possibility of opening every part of our lives to the transforming power of God's life of love and joy and peace. He comes so that every day we can become a little more like him.

This is the good news of Christmas and may it be yours this year.







NORTH CADBURY & DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB


We are a small friendly group with a shared interest in gardening who like to meet and chat in North Cadbury Village Hall on the 3rd Wednesday of the month.
