From the Revd Rachel Burdett CJN

As I write this in the middle of November, it's hard to believe that another year is almost over. For me, this acknowledgement that the year is almost at a close happens when we put the clocks back at the ed of October. The chill in the air feels sharper and it's a relief every evening to draw the curtains and shut the dark, cold world out. I noticed with a heavy heart as I prepared the intercessions for Remembrance Sunday that Ukraine still needed our prayers, and as I added the people of Israel and Gaza to the prayers the world seemed like a very cold dark place indeed.

Human beings around the world have celebrated the Winter Solstice for millennia, and in a lot of those celebrations, light is a central element. Even as people in the Northern Hemisphere reach the shortest, and darkest day of the year, there is something to celebrate and look forward too, because from that day, the hours of daylight will gradually get longer, and light, warmth and the signs of new life will return.

For Christians, we celebrate this triumph of light and hope at Midnight Mass on Christmas Eve, when we hear the familiar words from the beginning of St John's Gospel. The words of verse 5 are particularly striking.

The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

In the first nine verses we hear variations of the word 'light' seven times. In the middle of the night, on one of the shortest days of the year, we are reminded that no matter how dark things are, the darkness cannot overcome the light.

Desmond Tutu famously said, "Hope is being able to see that there is light despite all the darkness." He was Bishop of Johannesburg and then Archbishop of Cape Town, during the long years of Apartheid and certainly knew what it meant to live surrounded by darkness. Yet he never gave up hope, and when the light triumphed over the darkness, he literally danced for joy.

In 1908, Minnie Louise Haskins wrote the poem "The Gate Of The Year", and in 1939, King George V1 quoted it in his Christmas broadcast, as people made the best of their first wartime Christmas and looked forward to the new year not knowing what it would bring. I wrote about this poem two years ago, and it is one that I like to read and think about as we enter a new year. It begins with these words:

I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year: "Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown".

Again, we see how light is comfort, a guide, and a beacon of hope, and as we look around the world we probably feel we need all those things. As we stand at the gate of another year, and hope and pray that we and the whole world will be able to "tread safely into the unknown", let us all take comfort in the hope that light represents, and strive to be that light ourselves.



BOOK REVIEW


Burial Rites by Hannah Kent.

This debut novel is based on actual events. It is set in northern Iceland in 1829. Agnes is condemned to death for her part in the brutal murder of her lover.

Agnes is sent to wait out her final months on the farm of a district officer, Jon, his wife and their two daughters. Horrified to have a convicted murderer in their midst the family avoid contact with her as much as they can. Only Toti the young priest appointed as her spiritual guardian is compelled to try and understand her.

There is a real sense of the hardships of rural life, the cold and poverty are so clearly portrayed they are almost tangible. As they are forced to work side by side on the farm Agnes's story begins to emerge and with it the realisation that all is not as it seems.

Hannah Kent creates an incredible realistic portrait of a bleak, cold country where everything is a struggle. It is beautifully written. A compelling read, heartbreaking and uplifting in equal measure.


