#### Dear Resident

By now you should have all received your 2024 bin collection calendar and information from SKDC on the new waste collection scheme. From early 2024 paper and card will be collected in a new purple lidded bin. This is to improve recycling rates. Please use the dedicated phone number 01476 406544 for all bin queries.

There are plans for Greater Lincolnshire Devolution. This new layer of governance would take powers from Westminster and place them in the hands of a single local Mayor who would cover Lincolnshire, North Lincolnshire and North East Lincolnshire. At SKDC we have not had any influence over this decision but are expecting an announcement from the UK Chancellor later this year.

As from 31<sup>st</sup> October residents will be able to apply for a postal vote and certain types of proxy vote forms online by going onto <a href="www.gov.uk/apply-postal-vote">www.gov.uk/apply-proxy-vote</a>, you will be asked to provide your National Insurance Number which would be matched against the information held by the Department of Work & Pensions.

Finally Rosemary & Vanessa would like to congratulate Tallington who came Runners Up in the SKDC Community in Bloom Award which replaces the Best Kept Village Competition. This can only be achieved by working together, well done everyone.

# Barholm with Stowe

Just a quick report on several events that took place in November, a job to keep pace with everything! Here we are thinking & planning for the Festive Season. It creeps up on you! A good number of us enjoyed the 'BONFIRE' on the 5th in the Memorial field, the sparklers took me back to my childhood. Then on to the Five Horseshoes for refreshments and recollections of days gone by. Many thanks Chris & Lorna for all your efforts, always good to get together.

Six villages in the Uffington group held outdoor Remembrance Day services which were well attended. Contributions were passed on to the Royal British Legion.

We celebrated 'Saint Martin of Tours' Patronal service also on the 12th, in the Church. St. Martin has the distinction of being the first Christian pacifist or, at least, the first we know about. He came from a military family, and obediently followed his father into the emperor's legions, patrolling the frontiers. But when war broke out, St. Martin saw, young as he was, that it was a war of aggression, an unjust war, and he resigned his commission. He volunteered to walk in the vanguard carrying a cross, to be killed if need be, but he himself would not kill. The world was baffled by his behaviour and still is: this episode is rarely portrayed. But we can all understand the story here. St. Martin meets a naked beggar. He gives him all he can, which is half his uniform cloak. That night, Christ appeared to him, wearing the half-cloak, saying, "My friend Martin gave me this." St. Martin was still a pagan at the time, but this incident led to his conversion and his dramatic refusal of worldly values. We are shown here, not the actual cutting of the cloak, but his moment of decision. It seemed a smallish thing, to be improperly dressed as an officer for the sake of charity, but it changed his life. C.316-C.400 It is not until the trees have become skeletons that we see the bare bones of the beautiful bough formations. The flowing lines of the smooth, clean beech branches are never seen in the summer when the limbs are draped in the green cloak of the leaves. The majesty of the oak cannot be fully comprehended until the massive thing is stripped and the boughs revealed. Elms take on an entirely different character in the winter; gaunt and naked, they stoop above the lanes, their boughs clotted with the nests of rooks. Chestnuts with their thick brown twigs and scaly buds make their own conspicuous patterns on the December sky. Birches are less emphatic; their outlines are more sketchy, lighter and delicate like Chinese prints.

How still the trees are in winter! Their motionless silence is not the silence of death but of sleep. They wait, they rest, biding their time. They do not murmur to one another as they do in the summertime, and yet in some mysterious way they seem more alive than ever. A bare tree is a sentient tree. Although unmoving and inarticulate it conveys the impression of being aware of itself. Withdrawn and inactive, it is yet a self-conscious entity. You do not walk alone in the winter woods. You are watched; the trees are aware of you; they observe your movements. But not so in the summer when they are busy gossiping with each other and so drunken with the sensuous joy of contact with wind, rain and sun that they have no time to bother about the pygmies roaming beneath their boughs.

May I take this opportunity to wish you all a very Happy Christmas and Happy New year. There are many services on offer throughout the seven villages, so as they say 'there is one near you'. A wonderful time to be shared together so enjoy.


David & Gail Genever wish everyone a Happy Christmas and healthy New Year. They are not sending cards again this year and are making a donation to the publication of Towers and Spires.

#### Toilet refurbishment

The toilet refurbishment is progressing well and thank you to the patience of the hall users while they are being improved. The aim is for a better equipped disabled toilet and more unisex cubicles to reduce the queues, particularly at Scarecrows. It is being partially funded by the National Grid as compensation for the disruption to the village when they were re-wiring the pylons last year.

#### Bulb planting update

The bulb planting that was organised by the Village Hall, Parish Council and the Langdyke Countryside Trust was a great success. Over twenty volunteers turned out to plant over 6,000 bulbs in around two hours. There was a mixture of daffodils, crocuses, snowdrops, white snakes head fritillary, aconites and Chinodoxaon. They went in along the Main Road, Bertie Lay-by, top of Casewick Lane, on school lane, in front of the allotments, near the play area, on the back path near Manners Close, and in the Brickyard wood. Thank you to David Babbs and Caroline Wray who sponsored bulbs, and the Langdyke Countryside Trust, Village Hall and Parish Council for the funding towards the bulbs.

#### SKDC prosperity fund application

Liz Genever (representing Village Hall), Kate Genever (representing the Noticeboard), Susan Genever- Jones and Simon Carr (representing the Parish Council) are working on an application for the SKDC prosperity fund. It will be around nature recovery and embracing the heritage of the parish, while offering lots of opportunities for villagers to come together. This could include building bird box workshops, tree and shrub planting, film screenings, events around the village archive, heritage trail with boards and leaflets, and new walks around the village. An application will be submitted in January after the Parish Council committee are happy with the approach, with the next wave of funding being available from SKDC in April 2024.

Simon and Susan have met with representatives from the Langdyke Countryside Trust to help plan how the end of the allotment area (near the bees and orchard) could be enhanced for wildlife and villagers.




