
A Prayer for Candlemas

From the Vicar's Study ...

By the time you read this the snowdrops will be out. Whatever the weather their delicate milk-flower blooms push up through the chill earth, promising that the darkest days of winter are behind us, and just ahead spring beckons.

On 2nd February the season of Epiphany draws to an end as the church celebrates Candlemas, and remembers the *Presentation of Christ in the Temple*. The holy infant, to whom the Magi bowed down in the stable, is brought to the temple by his parents in accordance with Jewish law. Anna and Simeon have



been waiting for the Messiah all of their lives and now the moment has come. They recognise him instantly. Anna is a prophetess and a widow. She is eighty-four years old and has lived in the temple ever since her husband died. Anna is faithful in her devotions, she prays and fasts both day and night. Simeon lives nearby, he is a righteous and devout man. The Holy Spirit reveals to Simeon that he will come to see the Messiah before he dies. Moved by the Spirit that day Simeon has come to the Temple courts. He holds the infant Christ aloft, lifting him up high and declaring him, 'a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel'. Anna and Simeon have played their part and can step-down, but the baby Jesus will not begin his ministry for another thirty years, when as a young man he will turn water into wine at a boozy wedding in Cana. Anna and Simeon's faithfulness has been rewarded and a time of transition and change has begun.

For many long years across England countless modern day Annas and Simeons have kept faithful watch over their parish churches. Their sense of duty, self-sacrifice and service have been exemplary, but the time is coming for the next generation to pick up the mantle. As a church we are once again entering a period of transition and change, and we must look to the same Holy Spirit that called Simeon to guide us through it. Don't be afraid to answer the Spirit's call, for it may give you the same sense of wholeness and completion it brought to Anna and Simeon, as they stood in the Temple and looked into the eyes of a baby to see a sacred eternity of love gazing back at them.

Nest Box Week 14-21 February

Organised by the British Trust for Ornithology, National Nest Box Week, 14-21 February, encourages people to help the birds by putting up nest boxes. With the nesting season about to start, garden birds will be starting to prepare for their busiest time of year. The main nesting season runs from March to August, but rather aptly, birds are traditionally thought to have paired up by Valentine's Day, 14 February, hence the start of Nest Box Week. As well as feeding birds, the Trust says that it is important they have a suitable shelter



and site for breeding. With natural habitats such as trees and hedgerows being lost to development and the increase in urban housing, some garden birds can struggle to find a safe shelter to rear their young, hence providing a nest box in your garden can be a positive benefit.

Our precious gift

As Christians, while we may look to reduce our own carbon footprint, we are called to be stewards and witnesses of a much more radical resource. The clue is in the word 'ecology'.

'Eco' comes from the Greek word oikos, meaning house, or dwelling place. Ecology is partly about our responsibility to recognise the precious gift of the Earth, as our dwelling place: to be thankful, and play our part. God made humankind to care for the earthly world: Jesus amplifies the call, as He uses 'nature' as the sign of how we can live in order to flourish and to fulfil God's will.

'Logy' comes from a Greek word logos interpreted as reason, the ordering of knowledge, logic. In John's Gospel, logos is a word to describe Jesus – through whom all things are made and from whom all true knowledge comes. Logos is the word, the source of all goodness and grace, for every human life, and for all of creation.

It is the 'logos', the word, who inhabits our lives, our creation – inviting us to recognise His light, and allow it to overcome the darkness of our own limited concerns and agendas. We meet the logos in scripture, in worship, in prayer, and deeper reflection.

In Jesus, as logos, we can find the wisdom, the resources and the commitment to play our part in caring for creation. We are able to invite others to recognise the deeper truths about Eco, our common dwelling place, and to see more clearly how we join with others to work out what to do, how to live, and honour the gift of life that we receive through Him. The Logos is the possibility of good news for humanking and for the Earth.

What a responsibility each Christian disciple is called to bear! And what grace can be ours to enable us to fulfil our calling, and help all of God's children become caught up in the praise and prayer that gives true life to our dwelling place, and to exercise our stewardship appropriately.

Read John 1v1-14. Become an ECO-warrior – committed our common dwelling place – through celebrating the power and presence of the LOGOS.

If planning permission is granted under the appeal, clean up of the site will take approximately 6/7 months.

Make sure you are ready to vote in 2024

Residents in Somerset are being encouraged to get 2024 off to a good start by making sure they are ready to vote in elections – both local and Parliamentary.

The next scheduled elections in Somerset are for the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) for Avon and Somerset on Thursday 2 May 2024. More details will be published nearer the time. The Police and Crime Commissioner is responsible for holding the Chief Constable and police force to account on the public's behalf. They oversee how crime is tackled in their area and aim to make sure that the police are providing a good service.

Voter registration is at the top of the list as everyone who votes must be on the Electoral Register. For those unsure if they are registered, Somerset Council's Electoral Services team on 0300 123 2224 will be able to help. Voters may need to update their details if they have moved house or changed their name. This can be done by re-registering. It's a quick and simple process:

People planning to vote in person at a polling station must provide photo ID to make sure they can cast their ballot. Accepted forms of ID include a passport, driving licence and older person's concessionary travel pass. Documents must be original, not a photocopy – check out the information from the <u>Electoral Commission</u>. Those without suitable ID can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate. Applicants need to provide their name, address, date of birth and National Insurance number.

People can apply for a postal vote if they are away on holiday or because their work schedule means they can't get to polling station. They may also choose to vote by post simply because it would be more convenient.


