

From the Vicar's Study ...

By the time you read this Lent will have started. In recent years it has become fashionable in church circles to take something up for Lent instead of giving something up. I would like to suggest there is merit in doing both.

It is often said that it takes twenty-one days to establish a habit, though when you dig a little deeper studies show that the length of time also depends on our personalities, and on the nature of the habit we want to establish. However with forty days in Lent there is time to do some productive ground work. I



suggest one good habit to work on at this time is that of prayer. This year during Lent I am running a weekly group using Pete Greig's *Prayer Course*. This course covers much of the same ground as his best selling book, reassuringly entitled, *how to pray: a simple guide for normal people*. Using the Lord's Prayer, the course explores different aspects of prayer in a straight forward, accessible way. You definitely don't have to be a world class spiritual athlete to take part, if you were you'd only show the vicar up! As Pete Greig says: "Everyone prays. But no one finds it easy. We all need a little help." Do contact me if you are interested.

These days there is something profoundly countercultural about denying ourselves the things we desire. All around us advertisers encourage splashing out because, as the slogan goes, "you're worth it". But just maybe we are also worth a little self restraint. Sometimes less is more. It can help us focus on what really matters. Nearly all spiritual traditions uphold the value of fasting. But it's not just us religious types who are in favour, Dr Michael Mosley has done much to educate the Great British public on its health benefits too. Perhaps Lent is the perfect opportunity to give mind, body and spirit a rest, to be still for a while in a hectic world, and to learn to breath deeply and live simply.

At the end of our Lenten journey lies the drama and the joy of Easter. Jesus Christ our Saviour will go to the cross for us, and there he will conquer sin and death before rising on the third day, and winning for us the promise of new life. Then will be the time for feasting and celebration.





New life for all the world

Sowing seeds, chitting potatoes, choosing varieties. Easter acts as starter's orders for the gardening year. Beds are cultivated, lawns mown, plans for all the growth and new life that spring and summer will bring made and then turned into action.

There's a much greater connection between gardening and Easter than it merely being the time to dust off forks and spades. For in the Bible, a



garden is the setting for Easter itself. In John's Gospel (Jn 20:1-18) Mary Magdalene meets the risen Jesus in a garden. Indeed, Jesus's appearance to Mary is so unexpected that at first she can't believe it's really him. So she mistakes the man she meets 'supposing him to be the gardener' (John 20:15).

In John's account, all the new life contained in the first Easter chimes with a much earlier story set in a garden too. This is of the new life of another man and woman, the creation story of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden and contained in the book of Genesis (Genesis 2:4- 3:24). In that story, Adam is the gardener (Gen 2:15), only for things to go wrong. In John, Jesus is portrayed as the new Adam – come to bring new life that has no end.

What would happen if we were to think of our churches as gardens, primed to welcome the spring that is the new life of Jesus this Easter? What would happen if we imagined ourselves called to be gardeners – like our father Adam and the new Adam, Jesus? What would we expect to grow? What might need pruning or weeding? What new plans for the coming season would we make and turn into action? What would be the harvest that we'd sow for, tend and then reap?

For I reckon we should see Easter as the starting point of all that God wants to do among us and with us. Jesus's resurrection opens us to being part of God's new creation. Easter offers us a fresh start for life, relationships and the life of our churches: new life for all the world.

Happy gardening and a very Happy Easter to you all.

As we continue our journey through Lent in preparation for the wonderful feast of Easter, we offer two opportunities to join with our Christian friends. The first is a series of five weekly sessions of faith-sharing and meditation groups, based on the Lord's prayer. Late in 2023 South West Coach

Coaches approached Somerset Council to request additional funding OR to change the timetable to be more cost effective. Both these options were not acceptable to the council. South West Coaches have now handed the route back but will run it until the 13th April 2024. The route will then be offered out to all bus operators to tender (put in a price) to run this route. South West Coaches will also put in a price as well. The best price is the one that will be accepted, which could be South West Coaches. The route will continue to operate but may be a new operator.



Don't forget the £2 flat fare introduced in January still applies. Bus users in Somerset are able to continue to travel on most bus routes in the county and beyond for just £2. This initiative applies to cross-boundary services, which means you can travel for example from Shepton Mallet to Yeovil, Street to Bristol or Wells to Bath for just £2.


