The Lenten season this year has felt very in tune with what is happening in the world: Ukraine, unresolved. Gaza, a horror. Government in this country challenging the rule of law! Democracy facing a crisis.

It was good to find time,, as a Parish for an Away Day with Rev'd Steve Clark, who was vicar here some 30+ years ago. He led us in three exercises of listening to God using different senses, quiet and conversation, art, nature, scripture. As one who attended said: "What a memorable day with Steve leading and inspiring us with his thoughts, stories and faith. The day's programme was just right, with time to listen, to discuss, quiet reflection and social time, and of course refreshments."

The House of the Open Door in Childswickham was a wonderful venue for such a day. Gorgeous spring gardens, many rooms, an inspiring chapel.

I'm reminded of a favourite Psalm of mine, Psalm 73 which speaks of the Psalmist's despair at the state of the world, where those in power seem to grow ever more powerful, greedy and ruthless and those who are faithful to God's ways of dignity, inclusion, generosity, sharing seem to be ground into dust. The Psalmist says that they almost lost faith until they entered the sanctuary of God. Spending time with God brings perspective, restores faith, renews energy to persevere in ways of justice and peace.
