#### Why do Christians pray?

This is an interesting question. It also opens up a variety of follow up questions: How do I pray? Does my prayer make a difference? Why has my prayer not been answered?

The simple response is that Christians pray because prayer works.

Prayer is a chance for us to connect with God and there are many different ways and styles of prayer.

Each weekday I say Morning Prayer in one of the five churches in this benefice. Morning Prayer follows a distinct pattern of prayers, psalms, and bible readings. Morning Prayer is an opportunity to ready ourselves for the day. Morning Prayer helps focus the mind on God and on the tasks ahead; it is a helpful reminder that each day is a gift from God.

Evening Prayer is similar, except this time we have the opportunity to give thanks for the events of the day, to reflect on the good and the bad, and to ask God to bless us as the night approaches.

We can also offer silent prayer, which paradoxically should be the easiest form of prayer, but normally ends up being the hardest! Silent prayer challenges us to slow down our hyperactive minds and to simply be present with God; with practice silent prayer can be achieved and be transformative. For those who develop a routine of silent prayer, they often speak of being calmer, closer to God, more reflective and understanding, less stressed. Silent prayer helps us to slow down and to contemplate, to turn down our internal voice and instead hear the voice of God.

Finally, there is intercessory prayer. This is when we pray for ourselves or for other people. The biggest challenge to this form of prayer is when we feel it has not worked, that our prayers have not been answered. However, that is certainly not the case.

We all wish that God could perform a miracle whenever we asked; however, that is sadly unrealistic when we live in a natural world with billions of other people.

Instead, what intercessory prayer does is to help both the Christian who is saying the prayers and also the person who is receiving the prayers. For the person saying the prayers it helps them to remember the other person and to hold them up to God. It is transformative because intercessory prayer shapes the way we think and feel; it helps us to remember and act for

those in need. For the person who is being prayed for, by God's divine power, intercessory prayer gives them strength; they gain strength knowing people are praying for them, and they gain strength knowing that God is with them and will never leave them, no matter what they are experiencing.

Whether it is Morning or Evening Prayer, silent prayer or intercessory prayer:

Why do Christians pray? Because prayer works. Prayer is transformative both for those who are praying, and for those being prayed for.

#### St. Benet's Abbey Celebrates Heritage Open Days



On Sunday 21 September 2025, there will be a variety of different opportunities to participate in Heritage Open Days at St Benet's Abbey. The monument itself will be open to the public, with tour guides on hand to give guided tours of the site, including the Cross of Peace, and there will be meet and greet volunteers for those who just want snippets of information and to stroll the site at their leisure.

The Event Team from NAT will provide activities for all ages, including scrap box crafts where you can make a stained-glass window, create your own model monk and much more. There will also be dragons to find in a search trail. For those with an interest in Natural History as well, a Guided Tour organised by Pathmakers will set off at 10:30 from Ludham with Jerry an experienced environmentalist who will talk about the nature on the riverbanks and the river itself. The walk will also be joined by a tour guide from St Benet's Abbey who will point out interesting stories from the Abbey relating to the river and conclude the walk with a guided tour on arrival at St Benet's. There are limited spaces for this tour and tickets should be booked via the Heritage Open Day website - Pathmakers page.

It does not end there, all our guests – particularly Dragon Hunters – are invited to then visit St Catherine's Church in Ludham. Here they will be greeted by Tour Guides who will assist them to locate the Ludham Dragon and relay tales of the century's old links between the Abbey and the Church. You will be able to buy refreshments in the form of tea and cake whilst visiting the church.

#### Horning Village Hall

The current Hall is owned by the Horning Village Hall Trust – Registered Charity Number 303984; it is independent and self funding. The current hall was erected by Wroxham Builders Ltd and was formally opened on the 23 June 1978 by the then MP Mr Ralph Howell. The present condition of the building after some 47 years is a tribute to their craftsmanship. The current Hall replaced a timber structure which started life in 1925 as a men's club and came to be known as "Horning Memorial Hall".

After 47 years, however, the hall is in need of a little TLC; a recent survey has revealed a number of relatively minor issues and one or two more major matters that if tackled now, will prevent greater problems in the future.

As many of you will have noticed, we have had a major programme of renovations of the Mill Suite; the external cladding and insulation should be complete by the end of this year and many users will have noticed the new ramp.

The trustees are charged with providing a village hall venue for the people of Horning. At the moment, the Village Hall and the Mill Suite is relatively underused and as a result, the income from letting of the village hall does not cover the routine costs of running and maintaining the hall. So if you have a party or family event on the horizon, please consider the Village Hall or the Mill Suite as a venue.

The trustees, often in conjunction with other organisations in the village, are promoting events to raise money to close the shortfall in funding from hiring. We are asking the village to support our events – come and enjoy yourselves and at the same time help ensure the long-term survival of the Village Hall in Horning. By coming to regular events such as cinema, bingo, quiz nights and other entertainment events, you will not only have a thoroughly enjoyable experience, but you will help ensure that Horning Village Hall endures for at least the next 47 years.




#### Horning Hub connecting the community

## The following are two contributions regarding VJ Day. Please read and reflect.



VJ Day 80 Friday 15 August 2025 NEVER FORGOTTEN

In commemoration of the 80th anniversary of VJ Day, Friday 15 August 2025, parishioners are invited from 5.30 to bring a picnic to St. Benet's Green and enjoy food and fellowship as we come together to honour and pay tribute to those who fought in the Far East during the Second World War.

There will be music and at 8:20 pm the Kohima Epitaph will be read, with the Union flag then lowered to the Sunset bugle call.

Parishioners are encouraged to bring portable lanterns to light up the green in a symbolic gesture that the light of remembrance will never be extinguished.

VJ Day 80 will be particularly poignant for many Norfolk families: Three battalions of the Royal Norfolk Regiment - 4BN, 5BN and 6BN - fought in the Far East and were taken prisoner following the fall of Singapore. 538 of these brave men perished in battle or captivity, many of whom were mentioned in despatches for their gallant and meritorious actions.

Services will be held in Norwich Cathedral and at the National Arboretum on August 15th. VJ Day 80 will be an opportunity to reflect on the courage, sacrifice and comradeship of the troops who fought in the Far East, in particular the Burma Campaign, and to remember the suffering of British and Commonwealth prisoners of war under Japanese occupation.

While VE Day on 8 May 1945 marked the end of the Second World War **in Europe**, many thousands of British and Commonwealth soldiers, sailors and airmen were still engaged in bitter fighting in the Far East. Tens of thousands more were suffering in captivity as Japanese prisoners of war. The Burma campaign, in particular, was one of the longest fought by the British. Remote from the experience of most people at home and often sidelined in the press, it became known as the "Forgotten War" and the British and Commonwealth troops who bravely fought there the "Forgotten Army".

In total 9,000 British and Commonwealth troops were killed and 130,000 more became prisoners of war to be held in appalling conditions for years in makeshift jungle camps throughout southeast Asia. Some 13,000 British prisoners of war died in Japanese captivity during the Second World War, the victims of malnutrition, disease and violence.

Japan announced its surrender on 15 August 1945. The formal surrender of Japan occurred on 2 September 1945 aboard the USS Missouri in Tokyo Bay, **finally ending six years of world war.**

#### VJ Day 80 – August 15<sup>th</sup> 2025

VJ Day is often an overlooked part of Second World War history but it left an indelible mark on the collective East Anglian memory from halfway across the world. For almost 25 years as Chaplain to Far East Prisoners of War I have been determined to not let this country forget those members of our Armed Forces that were

still in captivity and sacrificing their lives in the Far East whilst there were celebrations throughout the country celebrating what has become termed as the 'end of the second world war' in May 1945. (VE Day)

The ill-fated 18<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division was a territorial formation of East Anglian battalions including the 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Royal Norfolk's. Whilst originally heading for the middle east, Japan's declaration of war and subsequent rapid march down the Malayan Peninsula saw them divert for the island 'fortress' of Singapore. Despite its reputation, the Battle for Singapore was a brief one, and the British Army surrendered on the 15<sup>th</sup> February 1942.

The men captured in Singapore would go on to suffer three and a half years of brutal treatment at the hands of the Japanese, with many being sent up country to build the Thai-Burma railway, otherwise known as the 'Railway of Death'. Around a quarter of these men would die from starvation, brutality and disease, but their stories stand as testament to the enduring nature of the human spirit in the face of seemingly hopeless circumstances.

With the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of VJ Day on the horizon, I have organised with the permission of the Dean the Very Revd Dr Andrew Braddock, that the hub of commemorations in Norfolk are set to be in Norwich Cathedral.

#### The service is on 15<sup>th</sup> August 2025 at 11am.

I would love to have the support of members of our Benefice Community in the congregation. Please do let me know if you are able to come as it is ticketed event (for security purposes).

Many of you will recall the 70<sup>th</sup> Commemorations shown on TV at St Martin-in-the-Fields, however, I do not anticipate such honoured guests this time – except of course yourselves!


