

parties with foolish behaviour. (Nothing changes!) In 1823 he caught syphilis.

He adored Beethoven, who gave him encouragement, but they did not meet until Beethoven was on his death bed. Schubert was a torch-bearer at his funeral in 1827.

Schubert died in 1828, less than two months before his thirty-second birthday. The cause of death was given as typhoid, not syphilis, which some writers have claimed. He was finally laid to rest close to Beethoven.

One of his very close friends was Franz Eckel who said: Schubert's life was one of inner spiritual thought and was seldom expressed in words, but almost entirely in music.

### The Great Composers the 2nd in an occasional series by Bel Canto

FRANZ SCHUBERT 1797—1828

Schubert is a favourite of many people who love his soul-searching and heartfelt gentleness, so different from the heavier Wagner and Bach. He is included in the Romantic era of music, which says it all.

He was born into a musical family in Vienna, in 1797. When he was only eight years old he sang in a church choir, and his father introduced him to the violin. This exceptionally talented boy was already a good pianist and the violin was now added to his pleasure. Three years later, aged eleven, he was accepted into the Vienna Court Chapel as a chorister, with Salieri as his mentor. He studied composition and wrote a great many works including his first symphony. When he reached the age of sixteen he left the Court Chapel to begin training as a teacher which was the wish of his father who ran his own school.

Music, however, was his only interest and in due course he gave up his work as a teacher. He continued to compose an astounding number of works - sacred, choral, 600 songs, over 70 chamber works, and over 20 piano sonatas.

The Esterhazy family admired Schubert's talent and they employed him as a music teacher to their children. He was then twenty-one, a remarkably young age for such an exceptional musician. By this time he had written another two symphonies and notably his much-loved song cycle The Erl King (D328).

He had many young friends who spent evenings with him at home, where he played his music. These were known as "Schubertiads". They sang, they danced, they drank wine, and there were sometimes wild

### Your own Greenfingers—in your July Garden with Will Barrow

Most gardeners know the importance of the basic rule to use the correct soil for various plants either alkaline, or acid (ericaceous), e.g. Rhododendrons, Camellias, Azaleas, Magnolias must have acid soil, otherwise the results will be disastrous.

Gardening, however, is a strange beast, even a joker, and one adventurous gardener made headlines in a horticultural magazine which showed images of his splendid displays of all the above plants grown in his soil which was loamy chalk with limestone scree. Definitely not ericaceous! His garden had been what he described as 'a limestone quarry'. He decided to experiment and plant acid-lovers. The results speak for themselves with a total of over five hundred glorious plants. This enterprising gardener became a respected member of the RHS's Rhododendron, Camellia and Magnolia Group, and he is much acclaimed world-wide.

Today's news is full of the prohibition of various things, sometimes after a complaint from just one person. How long will it be before some of our treasured plants are unobtainable because someone ate a poisonous berry, or the mental health of a timid lady was affected when she saw one of the (yes, scary!) exotic cacti which resembles a human being? Many flowers and shrubs have a degree of toxicity, especially Aconitum. Others can affect skin and eyes, so always wash your hands after handling them and wear gloves if convenient. Caution must be taken of course when little children are in the garden unsupervised, but refusing to grow flowers such as a few offenders including Peonies, Agapanthus, Echium and Rosemary is not an option and our freedom must be maintained. But please don't be terrified! Gardeners have a habit of living long lives and toxins would not affect everybody. Just be sensible and don't eat berries, leaves or flowers unless you know they are edible, and never rub your eyes after handling plants.

I am told that half the people in prison are dyslexic. Schools have failed to pick this up. As a family we have one grandson who was lucky enough to be diagnosed in primary school. He was interested in cars and now is married with a son and runs his own car business.

No doubt, like me, you find some days seem full of problems and some glide along smoothly. Sunday is a good day. Going to Church wears me out and I feel justified in falling asleep in the afternoon.
