The Word of God

Psalm 138

¹I will give thanks to you, O Lord, with my whole heart; ♦ before the gods will I sing praise to you.

²I will bow down towards your holy temple and praise your name, because of your love and faithfulness; ◆ for you have glorified your name and your word above all things.

³In the day that I called to you, you answered me; ◆ you put new strength in my soul.

⁴All the kings of the earth shall praise you, O Lord, ♦ for they have heard the words of your mouth.

⁵They shall sing of the ways of the Lord, ♦ that great is the glory of the Lord.

⁶Though the Lord be high, he watches over the lowly; ◆ as for the proud, he regards them from afar.

⁷Though I walk in the midst of trouble, you will preserve me; ◆ you will stretch forth your hand against the fury of my enemies; your right hand will save me.

⁸The Lord shall make good his purpose for me; ♦ your loving-kindness, O Lord, endures for ever; forsake not the work of your hands.

First Reading: Colossians 2:6-15

Brothers and sisters, ⁶as you have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, ⁷rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving.

⁸See to it that no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the universe, and not according to Christ. ⁹For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, ¹⁰and you have come to fullness in him, who is the head of every ruler and authority. ¹¹In him also you were circumcised with a spiritual circumcision, by putting off the body of the flesh in the circumcision of Christ; ¹²when you were buried with him in baptism, you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead. ¹³And when you were dead in trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive together with him, when he forgave us all our trespasses, ¹⁴erasing the record that stood against us with its legal demands. He set this aside, nailing it to the cross. ¹⁵He disarmed the rulers and authorities and made a public example of them, triumphing over them in it.

Canticle

¹Blessed are you, God of Israel, for ever and ever, ◆ for yours is the greatness, the power, the glory, the splendour and the majesty.

Second Reading: Luke 11: 1-13

¹He was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, 'Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples.' ²He said to them, 'When you pray, say:

Father, hallowed be your name.

Your kingdom come.

³Give us each day our daily bread.

⁴And forgive us our sins,

for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us.

And do not bring us to the time of trial.'

⁵And he said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say to him, "Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; ⁶for a friend of mine has arrived, and I have nothing to set before him." ⁷And he answers from within, "Do not bother me; the door has already been locked, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot get up and give you anything." ⁸I tell you, even though

he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, at least because of his persistence he will get up and give him whatever he needs.

⁹So I say to you, Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. ¹⁰For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. ¹¹Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for a fish, will give a snake instead of a fish? ¹²Or if the child asks for an egg, will give a scorpion? ¹³If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'

We pray for those going through trying times:

those who are ill, or anxious, for . . .

those who have been bereaved, for . . .

those facing big challenges, for . . .

asking that they, and we, may receive from you

strength and guidance, comfort and hope.

Your kingdom come: your will be done.

We make our prayers in obedience to Jesus Christ. Amen.

Collect

Creator God, you made us all in your image: may we discern you in all that we see, and serve you in all that we do; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**
