have, in pursuance of the Order in Council made the 10th day of March 2004 and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

NOW, THEREFORE, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853, and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that burials shall be discontinued forthwith in the aforesaid places.

Provided that burial may be allowed -

- in the places numbered 2 above, in the Exmouth family vault now existing in the said churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented;
- in the places numbered 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, above, in any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyards, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave;
- (c) in the places numbered 7, 8, 9, 10 above, in the said churchyards, in any grave space to which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.
