

As we said goodbye to Deji and Helen, we presented them with a gift and card and thanked them for all they have been to us in the past 18 months. Thank you to all who contributed to the collection for them.

As the end of term looms, we send our best wishes to those who work in schools... you're nearly there! And we keep in our prayers children and young people moving on from their existing schools.

On July 5th a coachload of people from churches across Southend, will make its way to Bradwell on Sea for the annual Bradwell Pilgrimage. I'm thrilled that so many have decided to attend. Bradwell is the place on the Essex coast where Cedd, a monk from Northumbria, arrived as a missionary and built a chapel in about 660AD. The chapel is still there, perched on the edge of the salt marsh. It's a very special place both in terms of the history of Christianity in Essex but also in its sense of spirituality and peace. The chapel is a large, simple building but which holds a sense of God's presence. If you have never been there, it's worth a day trip!

The Pilgrimage itself is basically a service with Christians of all denominations, from all over Essex in Bradwell village, a 2 mile walk to the Chapel, another service, a picnic, a closing act of worship and a two mile walk back to the village. In many respects it's very simple and quite understated. But there is something beautiful about sharing with many others in worship and walking and company. God is there in all the aspects of the day and I anticipate arriving home tired but reenergised in faith and trust.

Pilgrimage and journey are images sometimes a bit overused in our world. (Think, 'Strictly journey'!). But it's an image that makes sense to us. In life we move from birth to death through many stages, places, times and seasons. A physical pilgrimage such as the journey to Bradwell, gives us chance to reflect and remind ourselves that, just as we have the company of family, friends and fellow Christians in life, so also God walks along beside us.

Recently, for a treat, Lizzy and I took my parents to Brentwood where we used to live. We drove past their old homes, the schools they and I attended and the church they were married in and baptised. We had a picnic... in the churchyard, and then wandered around remembering old friends and family. It was a real pilgrimage, bittersweet and lovely. In fact, my daughter was so inspired by this we then spent her birthday, roaming around east London where we lived for the first year of her life. Again, it was interesting, moving and evoked all sorts of memories.

Of course, we can't all go on a physical Pilgrimage. Physical frailty or caring or work commitments can make it impossible. Does that mean we can't benefit from a Pilgrimage?

Well, we probably all have old photos in our homes. Maybe dig some out and notice the life you have had, the good bits and the struggles. Hunt out a photo of your childhood home and remember when you first heard about God, or love. Dig out your old Sunday School prizes or first Bible. Where were you when you began to realise that God is real and that he walks along beside us? Maybe note down what God has been doing in your life recently, the things you have been learning, the prayers he has answered 'yes' to, as well as those times he seems to have said 'no' or 'wait'.

Have you lost some of your energy, faith and trust? Then maybe remind yourself of all that has been and all the blessings and struggles of this life. Remind yourself of all that God has been to you, all he has done for you. And if you have not really tried faith, if it all feels like something that other people do, then try church, open a Bible, talk to God even if you don't know much about him. Ask him to walk with you in your life's journey and set your heart to find him.

The 23rd Psalm is one of the best-known parts of the Bible. This version is from the Good News Bible. I've used this particular version as it is a bit different and may make us read the psalm as though for the first time. It's beautiful and true and I commend it to you for your life's journey.

Psalm 23

The Lord is my shepherd; I have everything I need.

² He lets me rest in fields of green grass and leads me to quiet pools of fresh water.

³ He gives me new strength.

He guides me in the right paths, as he has promised.

⁴Even if I go through the deepest darkness, I will not be afraid, Lord, for you are with me.

Your shepherd's rod and staff protect me.

5 You prepare a banquet for me, where all my enemies can see me; you welcome me as an honoured guest and fill my cup to the brim.

6 I know that your goodness and love will be with me all my life; and your house will be my home as long as I live.



COPD and Breathlessness Drop In

Shoebury Youth Centre Delaware Road Shoeburyness.

The COPD Drop-In provides a vital support network for individuals in Southend living with COPD and other respiratory conditions. It offers a safe, welcoming space where participants can speak openly with others who share similar experiences, fostering a strong sense of community and mutual understanding.

Group members consistently report feeling heard and valued, with each person encouraged to contribute to discussions and share useful information. This peer-led approach ensures that lived experience, personal insight, and mutual support are central to every session.

In addition to peer support, the drop-in regularly hosts expert guest speakers covering a wide range of practical and relevant topics, such as:

- Pulmonary rehabilitation
- Fraud and security awareness
- Fire prevention and smoke detector safety
- Breathing and psychological wellbeing
- ____Making Every Contact Count" initiatives
- Accessing local support services (e.g. Blue)

Badge applications)

Crucially, the Drop-In goes beyond conversation. It actively combats isolation and promotes both mental and physical wellbeing. It also plays a key role in influencing local policy: issues raised during sessions are captured by Community

Connectors and relayed to senior officials and decision-makers.

This feedback loop has contributed to the ongoing development of more responsive and person-centred services in Southend.

The impact of the COPD Drop-In is far-reaching. It has transformed lives, built lasting friendships, and created a model of support that combines community connection with meaningful influence on local health and care provision.

'NOWHERE TO LAY MY HEAD?' - WHERE NEXT?

Following the recent evening for all churches in Southend considering a Christian response to housing need in the city we wanted to share some possible next steps congregations, or church members, may wish to prayerfully consider. It was lovely that a good number of our churches attended to find out more.

The 'big picture'.

We were grateful to the 4 members of the council's housing team who attended the evening to set the 'big picture' for us. They did an excellent job.

Christian housing initiatives and renting

Representatives from two Christian housing projects in Southend spoke about their experience of serving homeless people, or people at risk of homelessness, motivated by the love of God – 'The Malachi Project' and 'Hope three 16'. And a member of our local landlords' and tenants' association spoke about the implications for people wishing to provide accommodation in Southend through the private rental market.

The Marketplace

A number of housing support organisations were invited to provide a 'stall' advertising their provision and volunteering opportunities which included, in addition to those speaking, HARP, The Isaiah Project, SHAN and Street Pastors

An unexpected outcome

As a result of church leaders seeking a way forward for a social housing project and two members of a Christian organisation which can raise funds and manage large scale housing projects 'happening' to both be at the evening, and an unplanned and unexpected conversation which ensued, the project is now set on a firm pathway from 'dream' to 'realisation'!

Where next?

A prayer agenda

 for the housing team at the Council as they seek to work towards solutions for complex housing needs in our city, facing challenging demands every day

- for more people to provide rental accommodation at affordable prices
- for the many church and community agencies serving the homeless, those at risk of homelessness and those in overcrowded or inadequate housing
- for God's blessing and provision for discussions about a possible winter night shelter this winter

Achievable action

- volunteer for a homeless support or housing provision organisation in Southend
- explore becoming a 'social landlord' providing rented accommodation based on affordability, not purely maximum profit
- explore financial investment in 'Green Pastures', a Christian housing initiative which is actively involved in 'Steven's Place' in Southend, providing currently 35 rooms of supported accommodation.

Camillus is the patron of the sick and of nurses.

3rd July – St Thomas the Apostle, confused and doubting

Thomas, one of Jesus' 12 apostles, was an impulsive, confused, honest sceptic. Jesus could understand and work with such a man. Thomas' impulsiveness was evident when Jesus prepared to visit Lazarus in Bethany. It was a dangerous trip to make, because of the Jews, but Thomas urged his fellow disciples: "Let us also go, that we may die with Him." (John 11:16) Instead, Jesus brought Lazarus back to life.

Thomas' confusion is shown in later talks with Jesus. He was not really sure where Jesus was going long-term (John 14:5). But Jesus accepted this confused commitment, and began to untangle it, patiently explaining: "I am going to my Father", and "No one comes unto the Father but by me."

Finally, Thomas' honest scepticism is revealed after the Resurrection, which he flatly refused to believe – unless he could touch the wounds of the risen Jesus. Sure enough, Jesus appears – but instead of scolding him, shows him the wounds. Thomas

responds: "My Lord and my God" (John 20.26ff).

Thus, Doubting Thomas' honest doubts, turned to honest faith, have become a reassurance for thousands of men and women across the centuries, who also want to follow Jesus, but who require some proof of this amazing event – the Resurrection. In Doubting Thomas' complete affirmation of faith, after meeting the risen, crucified Christ, they can find support for their own faith.

Ancient legends tell how Thomas went on to India as a missionary. There are rumours that Thomas even built a palace for a king's daughter in India, and thus he is the patron saint of architects. It is believed that he was martyred by a spear on 3rd July, 72 AD in Mylapore, near Madras. 46 ancient churches in England were dedicated to him.
