Rachel writes . . .

I am writing this in the curate's house in Belper, which has been my home for four years, but I will soon be moving across Belper to another house, which the diocese has bought to be the new vicarage. Of course, moving is a stressful time, when you put everything you own into boxes, wrapping fragile items in layers of paper and hoping they survive the journey. What do you do if something gets broken? If it's a mug from Morrison's then of course you throw it away and go and buy another, but if it is a precious object, one that is irreplaceable, or holds special memories, what do you do then?

In Japan, there is a particular technique to repair precious objects, called *kintsugi*. It is the art of repairing broken ceramics using pure gold. Since gold is a relatively soft - and also expensive - metal, the repaired object cannot be used anymore. Instead, it becomes a work of art, something to be admired. You may have heard of *kintsugi*, because it is a well-used metaphor by preachers to talk about what God has done for us. But does the metaphor work? Yes - and no!

On August 4th the Church remembers Jean-Baptiste Vianney, an 18th-century French priest who is also known as the Curé d'Ars, or the Priest of Ars. I've written about him before*, because he is one of my favourite saints - he was unassuming and modest, and got on quietly with the job of being a parish priest.

I first heard of him through Sister Pamela, a Sister of the Community of All Hallows', which used to run the guesthouse in Norwich next to St. Julian's church. For several years I ended up on my annual visit there at the beginning of August, and at Morning Prayer on August 4th Sister Pamela would carry in her small statue of Jean Vianney and put him on the altar in the chapel. At some point, her statue of him had been broken, she had dropped him, and his head got knocked off.

What is your approach to mending something you have broken, but want to keep? Some people take great care, and the repaired item might look exactly as it used to, while other people might just fix it so it can continue to be used. We might call this a *kintsugi* vs. Sister-Pamela-with-glue approach. You could certainly see that her little Jean Vianney had been repaired. His head was a bit wonky, but she still loved him and gave him a place of honour on his feast day.

The idea of God taking us in our brokenness and creating something beautiful, repairing us with pure gold, is an appealing one. But that is not the strongest way to fix something, and we can see from the Gospels that Jesus didn't choose the elegant, delicate people to be his disciples. His first disciples were the fishermen, and he himself was a carpenter's son. He chose workmen, because it was time to work hard to preach the Good News and build the kingdom. God has done the same for each of us when he called us to follow him, and I don't believe that he wants us to simply sit on a shelf to be admired. He wants us to be put to work for his people. Surely his approach is more like Sister Pamela's; we might look a little wonky, but we are how he means us to be and ready to do his work for all people.

* I have adapted this month's article from one I wrote about three years ago. When I looked through August for something to write about I thought I'd give Jean Vianney, the Curé d'Ars, another outing because he is dear to my heart. But I must confess that in the intervening three years I found a little statue of Jean Vianney online and bought it so he could stand on my desk and watch me write sermons and monthly magazine articles. Alas, I must also confess that, just like Sister Pamela, I dropped him, and his head was knocked off. I have glued it back on, but I am afraid that he is slightly wonky, and now stands on my desk watching me in my own wonkiness.

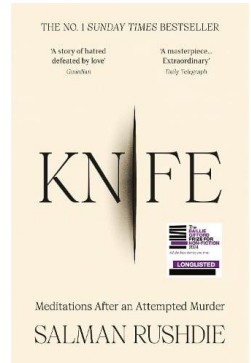

BOOK REVIEW

KNIFE

by

SALMAN RUSHDIE



This is a very moving personal account of an enduring and brutal attack on this author's life, thirty eight years after a fatwa was ordered against him.

On the morning of August 12th 2022, Salman Rushdie was standing onstage at the Chautauqua Institution in upstate New York preparing to give a lecture on the importance of keeping writers safe from harm, when a man in black- black clothes and a black mask, rushed down the aisle towards him wielding a knife. What followed was a horrific act of violence that shook the world.

In this account Rushdie relives the trauma of that day and its aftermath; the journey towards recovery and the healing made possible by the love and support of his wife, family, doctors and therapists.

I found this book so moving and so powerful. It is written with such honesty and gravitas and confirms the human spirit's capacity to find strength to stand up again.

July Well-Read Book Club at the Wonderful Well Kitchen Cafe!

The themes for the July meeting were *Coming of Age & Conspiracy*. A small but select group met together and Amita was able to join in between catering for her customers. As always grateful thanks to her for hosting the group, excellent food and great conversation!

Winter's Bone by Daniel Woodrell. This 2006 novella addresses the coming of age theme, it is about 17 year old Ree Dolly who lives in poverty in the Ozark Mountain region of Missouri. Ree has a mother with severe mental illness and an absent father so she is the sole carer for her two young brothers. This she does with devotion.

Her father is a crystal meth manufacturer and has a pending court case but he has put the family house and land up for bail and disappeared. Ree must find him or prove him dead otherwise her family will lose their house and land. She sets out to find her father and encounters brutal treatment from her violent, criminal extended family who obstruct her search due to longstanding feuds. The novel is bleak and shocking but there are beautiful descriptions of the landscape. Ree's courage and determination are uplifting and profound, leading to the upbeat ending.

The Beijing Conspiracy by Shamini Flint

Multiple conspiracies going on in a very complex plot which encompasses Tiananmen Square 1989, Chinese Politics, American Politics, spies and army life, including after effects of serving in Afghanistan, friendship, love, parenting, homosexuality, kidnap & ultimately the de-escalation of nuclear war.

None of the characters is 'who they say they are' and as the plot develops so does the deception as the hero -Jack Ford - attempts to get to the truth through the web of conspiracies and deceptions.

Lots of fighting, double dealing, death & brutality -a very good story/plot. Not desperately easy to read- although that may be due to translation as the author is Malaysian.

French Foreign Legion - Commando by Harry A Dobson.

A very different coming of age story. Harry's autobiography tells of his five year stint from 18 year old boy to becoming a fully trained Foreign Legion Commando. Entering as an angry young boy he leaves the Legion, a determined, disciplined young man.

The Kitchen God's Wife by Amy Tan

Heart breaking, funny, sad, brutal shocking and more. The Kitchen God's Wife tells the story of Pearl's mother. It's a coming of age theme in the sense that Winnie, Pearl's mum, a Chinese Refugee who has lived in America for many years, has lots of secrets she has never told. Helen, Winnie's friend, has kept these secrets but decides it's time for them to be told, forcing Winnie's hand. Pearl is an adult but does some more growing up when she hears her Mum's tale. It is a difficult read but well worth sticking with. Feel good in the end but quite a journey for the reader!

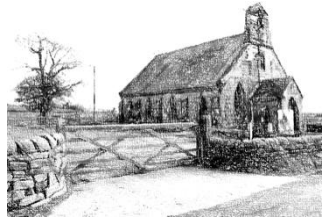

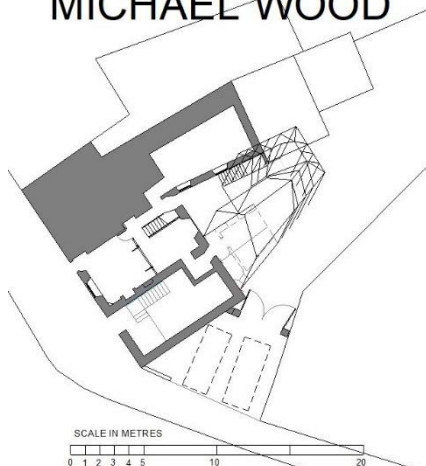

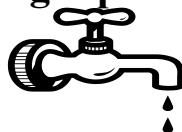
