Letter from our Rector, the Rev Dr Ian Mills

Dear Friends,

'Hope'. How often do we use that word each day? For Christians, hope is not a vague optimism or wishful thinking—hope is a powerful, sustaining force rooted in God's promises. In our parishes and wider community, hope is more than just an idea; it's visible in action, conversation, and care—especially in our schools.

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future" (Jeremiah 29:11).

Since January our Flourish Chaplain, Verity Eastwood Dewing, has been at work in Chew Valley School. In this new role she has brought light, encouragement and hope into the lives of both students and staff. Funded by the Church of England, the Flourish Chaplaincy programme was designed to help young people build confidence in their faith, discover their value, and flourish in both school and life. It's a ministry of presence, listening, and accompaniment—and it's bearing wonderful fruit.

From quiet chats over a cup of tea to group reflection sessions, Verity's work is rooted in Christ's call to love and serve. As Paul writes, "Encourage one another and build each other up" (1 Thessalonians 5:11), and I pray that's exactly what is happening in the heart of Chew Valley School.

Verity helps run creative wellbeing spaces, provides a listening ear for those going through difficulties, and coordinates moments of stillness and prayer. Whether it's supporting someone through bereavement or simply helping them feel seen and valued, these small acts of compassion have a profound impact.

A flourishing community is one where every individual knows that they matter. It is where we carry one another's burdens, celebrate each other's victories, and create a culture of kindness. That's the kind of community Jesus envisioned when He told us to 'love your neighbour as yourself' (Mark 12:31).

So, let's celebrate the quiet miracles happening in classrooms and corridors. Let's give thanks for the young people growing in confidence, the friendships being formed, and the love of God being shared in gentle, real ways.

As we continue to pray for our schools and families, may we all become agents of hope—joining in the work of building flourishing communities where everyone has the chance to thrive.

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit" (Romans 15:13).

<u>Parish Council Vacancies</u> – We currently have two vacancies on the Parish Council. We would love to hear from you if you are interested in joining our team, it offers a valuable opportunity to contribute to your community. No prior experience is necessary; however, candidates must live or work within the parish, be over 18 years of age, and be a UK resident. For more information about the role, please contact us at

<u>clerk@chewstoke.org.uk</u> or speak with one of the current councillors. We will look to coopt new members at our September meeting, so the deadline to apply will be 31st August. <u>Ducks and ducklings</u> are currently residing at the ford in Pilgrim's Way. It is a wonderful sight, but we need to keep them safe, please keep all dogs on leads in the area, and drive slowly.

<u>Road Safety Working Group</u> – Agreed to purchase a Community Speedwatch Camera for Chew Stoke. Parking on the zigzag lines outside the Primary School persists at drop off and pick up times. Clerk to contact the school and ask for their help in reminding parents this is illegal and unsafe. The increase in parking in Bilbie Road by school parents has been noted and is appreciated, as it helps to alleviate parking congestion closer to the school. <u>Community Bloom 2025</u> – the Working Group continue to meet fortnightly on Saturdays, and the PC is very grateful for their hard work, the village is looking fantastic. The Bloom Team have been offered a sailing boat to fill with flowers, possible location is on Walley Court Road, but to be finalised. Agreed to purchase anti-slip strips for the bridge in Rectory Field. Bloom Working Group offered to fit them.

<u>Update on the Local Plan Reset</u> - BANES emphasized that this 're-set' is predominantly about finding locations to build more houses. Various option locations will be considered as part of this process. The stage we are now entering is the 'pre-options consultation period' leading to an options document being submitted to BANES Cabinet on 11th Sept. A public options consultation from mid-Sept to end Oct will then follow. What housing development may be proposed in Chew Stoke?

Because Chew Stoke is classified as a 'sustainable community' (having 2x schools, shop, employment opportunities, doctors' surgery and some public transport), it may attract a 5% housing allocation which would equal 20 houses. BANES may review the whole housing development boundary for the village – although unlikely given the HELAA sites (Housing and Economic Land Availability Assessment) already being put forward. They will be considering the 3 HELAA sites put forward by landowners. These include Hedgehogs field, land off the west side of Stoke Hill, and a backfill parcel of land off Stoke Hill to the east side behind Fairhaven. The PC has been asked to provide local knowledge on the suitability of these sites. The allocation of these sites is in the public domain although the allocation map on the BANES website has not yet been updated.

<u>Ward Councillors report</u> - Care leavers in B&NES are now entitled to free bus passes. Parking in Chew Lane remains problematic, it is anticipated that the situation will ease shortly due to the end of A levels and any cars parked by 6^{th} form students. CSPC to monitor and discuss with school in the new school year.

News from Chew Stoke Village Hall

Thanks to monies raised by the Winter Ball team, the main hall interior has been redecorated over the last week- it's looking smart and fresh! We also have a steam cleaner now, thanks to money donated from the Film Club, allowing us to clean the chairs more easily.

Thanks to all the groups that regularly use the hall; we really appreciate your ongoing support. From the WI, to fitness groups, Soup Lunch, Film Club, singing groups, am dram and the Cub Scouts, the hall provides an essential space for such a range in the community. It is also a perfect space for private parties and events and we thank all that use it in this way, particularly Valley Arts.

We have a new booking website, found by putting in Chew Stoke Village Hall which allows you to see which slots are available and book directly. It'll hopefully make our invoicing easier too.

Finance needed to cover costs of the hall (which includes utilities, maintenance, cleaning and insurances) is currently not quite met by the money raised by bookings- despite us raising the hire cost to meet other local hall prices. Hence our need to fundraise regularly to make sure we have funds to cover everything. But more bookings would help too! Do think of the hall for any event- it's a great facility, particularly for children's parties.

If there are any youngsters doing D of E who need something for their volunteer section, we can easily set you up with an hour's volunteering a week at the hall; there are always small jobs to do and volunteering youngsters would be supervised (contact Ruth- see below).

We have a friendly and fun committee team who look after the hall but we are few in number! Always looking for anyone who'd like to come and join us. In particular, we need a member who'd be happy to be Secretary; this involves taking minutes at our quarterly meetings (yes- only 4 a year- not too onerous!) and keeping an eye on what maintenance is needed through the calendar year; ie boiler service, PAT testing, music licence etc. It's all set up- just needs someone to oversee it. 
