I love the Messy Church Conferences. They only happen every three years and they're packed with

enthusiasm, ideas, people passionate about all generations engaging with Christian faith together.

Messy in a Bucket was particularly inspiring. It developed in Cornwall during Covid but continued. As each family arrives, they collect a bucket which will have all they need to engage with the theme as a family unit. The group can elect to do all the activities or spend their time on just one or two. All is gathered in a short service and food is shared. Families love it.

After the Conference I headed up to Norwich to park my car at a friend's home. My fellow pilgrim and I got a lift to Walsingham where our pilgrimage to Norwich Cathedral and then Julian of Norwich's Shrine began. We visited the Shrine Church in Walsingham, tasted the water from the well, orientated ourselves, bought an ice cream and started out.

For three and half days we would be on the back lanes and public footpaths of Norfolk carrying a change of clothing, a toothbrush and Deo stick, spare shoes, walking poles (seldom used), blister plasters (not needed), a charger, lots of water and some snacks. Ah! And sun cream. The route was 37 miles (59 km), it turned out to be 44 miles (72 km) with no getting lost and lodging close to the route. No wonder we were footsore by the end of each day!

Our silence was punctuated by military aircraft reminding us of the world beyond these dreamy lanes. The occasional car went by reminding us of family and friends, of people at work. A distant siren reminded us of the sick and infirm (Rev Allison's daughter, rushed to hospital and still there, was very much in our prayer). Farm vehicles trundled past us and fields bleached with heat, reminding us to pray for another difficult harvest.

Hospitality in churches along the way put a smile on our faces. People offering us a drink, or drink stations with a 'help yourself' sign, cake in Great Ryburgh! Every blessing! Rev'd Katryn
