

Reverend Clifford's Weekly Blog 'I'm in the ship with you'

12th July 2025

A big thank you to all who were able to attend, visit the Rectory Garden last Sunday, a big thank you to God as well, as the dark clouds gathered and thunder and heavy rain drenched half of Kent, the Cliffe micro climate did its thing, and the sun shone down upon us for the duration. Then a couple of minutes past 5pm when we had said we would close the afternoons activities the first drops of rain made their appearance; we had been truly blessed to share conversation with so many of you. More so we were blessed with what I would describe as good fellowship as well as plenty of tea and cake that we all consumed.

Once everyone had left Cathy and myself then did a quick flick over to Tonbridge to meet up with members of my old congregation St. Mary's Hadlow. Amongst whom was my training incumbent (always the Boss) but also good friend Gwen. It was a late night, not returning home till gone midnight but again wonderful fellowship and a good time of catching up and sharing stories.

Life offers us many opportunities to share in fellowship together; this week I have

conducted two wonderful funerals celebrating the lives of those who have been called home, Tom and Ron. In-between the sadness of losing our loved ones there is this sense of celebration and again the gathering of family and friends who might not have seen each other for years, a wake then becomes an opportunity to share with each other in the name of the one we have lost, true fellowship.

Over the next month I will take two weddings, a different celebration of life and love but also a time when family and friends gather and as speeches are made and glasses and toasts raised conversations and catching up with each other continues in another act of fellowship.

I have used this word fellowship several times now in this blog but what is it. Well it is what it says on the tin, when we meet together for any of the above then we meet as fellow human beings and as it were we travel together in a ship, that ship might be the celebration of a wedding or a birthday, it might be at a funeral, attending a church service or belonging to a club that shares an interest, noting the Cliffe Darts team this week all identified by the same top at Tom's funeral.

I know I have written somewhere before about this word fellowship for it is a wonderful old English word with ancient Norse connections. Biblically the Greek uses a different word which has the same undertones in its meaning, Koinonia κοινωνία meaning, to have something in common that we share with each other to which we eventually derive the word and act of communion, sharing 'fellowship' in breaking bread and drinking wine together at our gathered meal times in memory of Jesus. Basically, in its earliest form, toasting the name of Jesus at every meal we share with others, making sure that he as it were, in the same ship as us. Thinking then about the times Jesus gets into a boat in the gospels with his disciples, suggests that having him aboard is always a good thing, he is the one who can bring calm and peace to our storms, the storms of life that sometimes overwhelm us all.

As I write, our family life has had its storms this week as our daughter was taken ill again, rushing here and there sorting her and grandchildren out might have seemed like a boat being tossed about on the ocean whilst managing our own work lives too. But I know that we have not been alone that God has been there even when sometimes it seems not, protecting and guiding, comforting and upholding. Partly because I know we share in fellowship the belief of prayer and instantly we could share with others our need for prayer knowing that others in some way had entered our ship for metaphorically part of the journey. That simply means that we are never alone, and for us having travelled around in ministry those prayers reach out far and wide and in return we are often called to pray for the needs of others. You see, what we share is a basic humanity that means however great or small we may think we are, each of us faces the same experience of life, we are all on a journey and that journey never mind who we are, always results in the same final page, there is always one last final breath. Faith gives us a hope that although it might be the final page there is always, if you like, a sequel where a new chapter begins within the belief of the Christian faith, with God through living out a life like Jesus taught us to live. His so simple example was to step down from heaven and enter into the same ship as us, to share the same experiences that we all face from day to day, it was about being in communion with us, becoming a fellow.

Whatever you have experienced this week and shared with others, I pray that you have not had to endure it alone but have found in any way you can that fellowship that can really bring the best out of us and reflect what true humanity is really all about.
