

Letter from the Vicarage, September 2025

Invitation

You are cordially invited to come on
Wednesday 3rd September 2025 at 6:15pm to St Giles' Church,
Hartington for the licensing of **Revd Dr Nicola McNally**as Priest in Charge of Fenny Bentley, Thorpe, Tissington, Parwich,
Alsop-en-le-Dale, Biggin and Hartington and afterwards for
refreshments in Hartington Village Hall.

The wheels of life turn and here we are at the start of a new School year. It is the start of a new 'era' for me too since, as I hope many of you are aware, I am being licenced to a permanent role with you, plus the parishes of Hartington and Biggin, When I came to Peak Five just over two years ago, I was licensed to a 3 year role as interim Priest in Charge of Peak five, and also two other roles in other benefices since Peak Five on its own can only be a part-time role due the number of people (approximately 1000) who live within the Benefice.

I am feeling hopeful about this change — it will be a case of stronger together in terms of our relatively small parishes being able to join combine their own differing strengths and talents for mission and ministry whilst retaining their own distinctive parish characteristics. It will raise the total numbers living in our parishes to approximately 2000.

Carrying on with my start of the school year analogy, in many ways it is like changing class in school rather than going to a new school, since I remain in my house in Ashbourne and carry on with the many activities I already have in Peak Five. However, as with going to a new class there will be a new things to get used to and new timetables, for you and for me, as we work out how Sundays with 7 churches will work! For September and probably October, services in Peak Five and Hartingon churches will go on as already planned but after this transition, we will need to change our service rotas to accommodate our new members. The church wardens and I are already working on what this might look like. I hope to carry on with two services every month for most of the churches. (Currently

Biggin church is closed for services due to falling lumps of plaster being a safety hazard. However, I would hope that this can be addressed in the coming months.) I would continue to encourage you to consider attending church in one of the other churches in the Benefice on Sundays when there is no service in your village. We are all members of one body, the body of Christ.

Finally, on the subject of moving forward with 7 parishes, I will need administrative help! With the approval of the all the PCC's, I am in the process of compiling an advert and job description for a Benefice administrator who we would pay for one or two hours a week. Job content would include keeping the A Church Near You website up to date with service and event details, helping with baptism, wedding and funeral administration, Benefice email correspondence and, perhaps, taking notes at some meetings. The role would involve close collaboration with me but would be carried out remotely at their own home and at times convenient for the role holder. Do get in touch if you think you might be interested.

September 2025

Bishop Malcolm writes...

'When through the woods and forest glades I wander....

September, October – what a glorious time for trees! - transient, dancing, swaying in the equinoctial gales, their leaves a kaleidoscope of changing colours, some fading, some ever deeper red or gold, eventually and inevitably floating to and fro down to the ground.

Even now I like to kick through piles of leaves in the garden or on the footpath. Each leaf is a unique work of art telling its tale of life and growth and beauty and decay, finding its way to mulch down for the winter, ready to energise future springs.

I love that verse from Revelation 22:2 reminding us of 'the tree of life' whose leaves 'were for the healing of the nations.' In Jesus we know the faithfulness of God, and find hope in every season of the year.

This month Bishop Libby's Harvest Appeal focuses on 'Trees for Peace – Burundi'. We are working along with the diocese of Bujumbura, helping them plant trees, as we did in 2023, but this time with a fresh emphasis on peacebuilding among people living on the hills around their city.

The work we helped with in 2023 has been very effective in stabilising the slopes against mudslide risk, and has enabled self help groups amongst women and young people. Setting up businesses to grow and sell and plant seedlings has been transformative for those involved – but the church has identified further potential benefits that can spring from this working together in partnership: peacebuilding and community cohesion.

These hills are home to families divided by ethnic and political loyalties. In living memory and more recently in times of elections these divisions have been exploited by groups eager to stir up conflict, and prone to exciting violence. By bringing people together across the divides to grow seedlings, to form self help groups, and to plant young saplings, the church is learning how to help break down barriers and build strong and resilient relationships for the future.



In this new project, which the Diocese of Bujumbura have named 'Integrated Environmental Restoration and Community Peacebuilding' alongside the tree planting there will be a range of activities including 'intergenerational dialogue groups', 'Memory and Hope trauma sharing workshops' and two new 'Youth Peace Brigades'.

The focus is on helping local people of all ages work together come to terms with their divided past and look to an economically productive future – this makes young and old less likely to be drawn into political or ethnic conflict, as with an income and something worth working for there is more to lose.

I thank God for the vision of the Diocese of Bujumbura in supporting parish ministry in these hills in such a down to earth and transformative way. It is a privilege for us to be involved. Following Jesus brings people together for good.

There are pictures of these slopes torn apart by ravines created by climate change induced flooding and mudslides, physically dividing communities, literally tearing the landscape apart. Worse still are the human divisions caused by traumas from previous conflict, exacerbated by extreme poverty. This integrated programme will bring healing for past hurts and unite both land and people in hope for a better, more peaceful future.



Nigel Mace (1939 - 2025)

Good Morning for those of you who don't me I'm Keith Wesley a good friend and neighbour of Nigel.

It is a great honour to be asked by the family to say a few words about Nige. He was a larger than life character, a unique man who loved company and would readily engage with everyone whether he knew them, they were just passing by the gate or just having dinner at the table next to him. Wow betide anyone if they didn't engage with him.



I am sure many of you will have your own stories involving Nigel that will stay in your memory, some repeatable and some maybe not. But not everyone will know everything about the man behind smile.

Nigel William Mace was born on July 21st 1939 here in Parwich and therein lies a remarkable story. His mum then Bessie Steeples worked as a doctors assistant in Parwich. When the doctor moved to London to work in Harley street she accompanied him to continue working with him. It was in London that she met Nigel's dad William (Bill) George Mace who was serving in the Grenadier Guards and assigned to Palace duties. After a whirlwind courtship they married at Windsor Chapel a privilege allowed because of Bill's status as a Kings Guard.

After completing his time in the Guards, Bill and Bessie moved back to Parwich.

Nigel was born in the July but in September of 1939 Bill was called up into the Army and as I'm sure many of you know he did not survive the war, being fatally wounded in 1944. This left Bessie to bring up a 5 year old Nigel on her own.

Sadly Nigel had very few memories of his Dad but he can remember him walking towards him in Parwich with a tricycle under his arm that he had bought for him on his way home while on leave from the front line His father's service was a matter of pride to Nigel and in later life he was proud to make 2 visits to his grave in Normandy, most recently including Sam and Cathy.

After the war Bessie's health declined and she sadly died in 1955 at the very young age of 42. This was a difficult time for the teenage Nigel, him and Mum had moved in with Granny and she continued to look after Nigel. Nigel was conscripted into National service at the age of 18 – he was one of the last group to be called up.

Nigel always had very fond memories of his teenage years in Parwich and there are many stories of his exploits but serving in the army was the making of the Nige we all knew. He served in the Far East for 2 years and then signed on for 5 extra years with time spent with the Royal Fusiliers in Germany as a military policeman. He was very proud of his blue and gold hackle on his beret.

However it was in the Army boxing ring where he really excelled. Nige had always been a good sportsman fiercely competitive in whatever he was playing football and cricket but when introduced to boxing he really succeeded. The bigger the opponent, the better and Nige would be aiming to win with a knock-out blow (and often did).

On leave from the army Nigel met Irene in the Green Man and they married in 1961. Irene was one of the few people who could make him tow the line. When Rob started seeing Tina he was worried about meeting Nige but was advised it was Irene he needed to be wary of.

Adrian, Derek and Tina were born in the 1960's and they too were all good at sport especially Athletics breaking QEGS School records.

Granddaughter Amy continued the family sporting prowess when she started Cross Country Running – Amy Fast Feet was his pet name for her. More recently Nigel was proud to tell us of Pam's grandson George's football achievements.

After leaving the Army Nigel served for a short time as a policeman before starting the job he loved as a lorry driver at Ballidon.

He didn't need a map or Sat Nav as he had an encyclopedic knowledge of roads he could give you a route to anywhere plus timings. Success was If you had chosen an approved Mace route. Nige was so proud his Grandson Sam had followed in his lorry driving steps.

Besides Trucks Nigel loved his caravan, enjoying many holidays with family and friends. Many happy weekends were spent at Tilcon Bay in Wales

however being fiercely competitive in whatever he was doing completing the quickest journey time there was a source of pride especially if he beat Ron Dykes. Having the best caravan and awning on a site was important but there was always a better one that he couldn't live without.

Nigel loved his music and U tube could have been invented for him as it allowed him to watch his favourite artists and then suggest new ones which he would write in a book for future reference. The problem was often he'd either lost the book or the page he was looking for.

An evening with Nigel would involve red wine, music on the telly and in earlier years maybe dancing. Occasionally you were even allowed the remote to choose the music. His music tastes were wide and varied from Andre Rieu to country music and sometimes very random choices. BZN (look them up) who often sang country/pop in Dutch or German and were a recent favourite. In fact Nige was very proud of his ability to speak German 'Ich Libe Dich' was an affectionate phrase he used frequently.

Retirement brought a new chapter in his life he enjoyed time with Grandchildren and Great Grandchildren. His last years were spent living with Pam a lifelong friend from Parwich whom he had known since childhood.

The stories and exploits of Mr Mace could fill a book, memorable ones and oft repeated were:

- the handing over of a shrovetide ball as a young man which denied him that much coverted ball and the honour of goaling it.
- how he could have played football for Derby and cricket for Derbyshire.
- ladies would often catch his eye ... to Nige a fit bit was not a watch.
- the younger members of his family will also be familiar with trying to sort his phone, laptop and caravan heating system out as he battled with modern technology.

Nigel was loved by many and will be remembered by all; once met never forgotten. I will end by just saying Nigel's oft used phrase, 'God Love'.
