North Downs Walk - the sun shone on the righteous

The Rotary Club of the Weald of Kent held its annual North Downs Walk on Sunday 8th June. After a week of dodgy weather, and a Met Office warning of thunderstorms the day before, the 340 walkers were blessed with superb weather – dry, sunny and with a cooling breeze.

The event is a sponsored walk in support of Cancer Research UK (CRUK) and of the walkers' own choice of good causes. With a variety of routes from 1 mile (fully paved, therefore suitable for wheelchairs or baby buggies) to 9 miles including a climb up the North Downs, we attracted a full range of ages and abilities of walkers, including Scouts, Guides, Air Cadets, keen hikers and some family teams.

Early indications, based on the pledges on walkers' sponsorship forms are that the Walk will have raised about £20,000 once Gift Aid is included, of which about two-thirds will go to CRUK and the rest to causes nominated by the walkers (many of which are also cancer-related).

Chas Bedford, chairman of the organising committee paid tribute to the small army of volunteers, drawn from families and friends of members, other Rotary clubs and the sixth form of Oakwood Park Grammar School, They acted as route marshals, greeted walkers at checkpoints, registered walkers and sponsor forms, and staffed the kitchen producing 450 ploughman's lunches, strawberries and cream,



and hot and cold drinks. "A lot of walkers have praised how friendly and professional our helpers were. I want to thank all of them. I also want to thank Family Funeral Service, our event sponsor, who have underwritten all our expenses again, meaning that every penny raised in sponsorship has gone to the charities and not to overheads."

Weald of Kent Rotary have been running the North Downs Walk since 1985, missing only 2020 due to lockdowns, and intend to continue running it as long as there are walkers. Planning for the 2026 walk has already started. Save the date: 14th June 2026.

How to spot parcel delivery scams

Parcel delivery scams are becoming increasingly common. They are known as phishing scams, and aim to trick you into giving away your personal information and financial details, so your bank account and money can be accessed.

One way scammers do this is by enticing people to click on links, which can lead to fake websites, in the hope that this information will be entered. This can be in the form of a text, or an email or phone call. There are also reports of fake 'Something For You' cards, which Royal Mail leave when a delivery is attempted, but no-one is home.

Here are some tips on how you can stay vigilant and spot the signs of a parcel delivery scam:

- If you're waiting for a parcel, and get a message that asks you to pay to get it, it's usually a scam.
- Don't click any links or attachments in the text or email. Delivery companies won't ask you to pay them through a link in an email or text.
- To check if a link is genuine, hover your mouse over the link without clicking on it, or press and hold on the link on a mobile device. You should be able to see the address the link goes to, and check it's the same as the company's official website address.
- Make sure you check the address carefully fake link addresses can look similar to the genuine address.
- Other signs of a message that is a scam include bad spelling and grammar, and when it starts with a general greeting instead of your name. But, scam messages can sometimes be sophisticated - so don't rely on obvious mistakes only.
- If you get an email, check if the email address matches the sender's name or organisation - you might have to click on their name to see the email address.
- If there's something you're unsure about, don't feel pressured to act. You can find the official details for the company the person who has contacted you says they're from, and ask the company if they've contacted you.

You can check if you think something might be a scam, using an online tool on the Citizens Advice website. If you have been scammed, you can report it on the Citizens Advice website, and check what else you need to do - including protecting yourself from further risks. Find out more at www.citizensadvice.org.uk/consumer/scams

Being targeted by a scammer or falling victim to a scam can make people feel anxious or embarrassed, but it's important to remember scammers are clever and scams can happen to anyone. Reporting them helps track down and stop scammers, and prevent other people from ending up in the same situation.

Kent Fire and Rescue Service

is inviting people across the county to give their views on its forward plans to protect rural residents and businesses. The consultation closes on 1 October 2025.



prepare · act · protect

From 8th July 2025, people across Kent and Medway are being invited to have their say on Kent Fire and Rescue Service's (KFRS) forward plans to protect rural residents and businesses from the risk of fire or other emergencies.

And with around 85% of the county classed as rural, it's important to give your views.

The plan outlines how KFRS already supports people who live and work in the countryside, and how the service intends to enhance its response to risks associated with rural living.

The proposal also considers the relocation of a water rescue vehicle.

The rural plan has been approved by the Kent and Medway Fire and Rescue Authority - the body that governs KFRS and is now open for public consultation.

Helping rural communities to prepare, act and protect

Rural homes and businesses face unique risks, including timber-framed buildings, thatched roofs, isolated properties, mobile homes, wildfires, and limited water supplies.

To help alleviate these hazards and reduce the chance of a fire or other emergency, KFRS' rural plan aims to support people in rural communities to prepare, act and protect themselves, by:

Prepare – Helping you to understand the risks in rural areas and provide you with guidance and advice on how to stay safe.

Act – Supporting you in putting measures in place and taking action to improve your safety.

Protect – Protecting you and your home in times of need.

To achieve this over the next four years, KFRS is proposing a number of targeted prevention and protection activities, including:

Positioning dedicated wildfire response teams at key locations, with the right vehicles and equipment to reach incidents in difficult rural areas quickly and safely.

Working with local people, landowners and other organisations to manage green spaces, helping to stop fires from reaching homes and businesses.

Work with farming and local community groups to increase awareness of fire safety issues

Helping people to prepare for and recover from emergencies within rural communities.

Exploring ways to recruit more on-call firefighters for daytime shifts, and how they can offer more local support.

Increase our business engagement, working with small business groups and rural organisations, to improve awareness of building safety legislation and responsibilities for business owners.

"Reflect the ever-changing needs of our rural communities"

KFRS Chief Executive Ann Millington said: "To help us provide the very best service, it's important to identify the unique risks associated with living and working in small towns and villages.

"We want to ensure the support we deliver reflects the everchanging needs of the people we serve across Kent and Medway.

"And with one in three people living in rural areas, it's vital we have your views on our proposed plans to enhance our operational response and prevention work."

Many people living in the countryside are in isolated locations, with some residents who might not have access to the internet.

Ann added: "To help us reach as many people as possible, we're asking everyone to share the link to our survey.

"Or, if you know of someone who doesn't have access to the internet, please pop by and help them to give their views."





So the crunch question is: what do you get out of coming to a church service?

Reflecting Faith: Saying 'Farewell

The ideal is: You have been met with a friendly welcome followed by music you love, played at the perfect speed with no squeaky singers in the congregation. Then, an inspiring sermon which gives you something to think about for the coming week. After that, prayers that speak of what is on your heart and what you have heard on the news that week. Finally, good fellowship and a cuppa after the service, where you can feel part of 'them', rather than ignored because you are only visiting.

Following all that good stuff, you go out of the church with a spring in your step!

Of course, in the real world not all those boxes get ticked.

But still we can go to church with hope, and ideally, we leave it in peace. The time that we spend together is the 'easy' bit. The real challenge begins when we go out the door and back into the daily round of home life and work. But we can be sure that we do not leave God at the church door. He always comes home with us, and He is there to help us throughout the coming week. That is why we can indeed 'go in peace'.


