






### Welcome

"She never left the temple but worshipped there with fasting and prayer night and day" Luke 2:37

This is part of the description of the prophet Anna, as we read at the Feast of Candlemas the story of how Jesus was presented in the Temple, and Anna and Simeon greet him with great rejoicing, offering thanksgiving, and powerful prophetic insights.



Wisdom is gift bestowed on those who are faithful. Being faithful is not an accident, it is a daily choice to follow Jesus, to nourish our souls in prayer, in the reading of Scripture, in worship, in fasting, and in other spiritual disciplines. There are no short cuts to creating healthy souls, just as there are no short cuts to creating healthy bodies and minds. Every day time must be set aside to dwell in the presence of God and in this way we find ourselves nourished, healed and transformed. As St Paul says, we should not give up on gathering together to worship, but there are so many ways in which we can attend to our souls in private individual prayer also in the meantime. How do you pray and read the Scriptures? Are you open to encouraging others, or to explore new ways of being nourished spiritually?

This Lent I feel we are being challenged to examine our souls and to ask God to refresh them with a new hope and confidence in the Gospel. Just as each day we set aside time to work, to eat, to rest, can we also increase the time we set aside to pray, to be disciplined and devoted in our desire to connect with God? We often read of stories of health or physical transformation, where attention to diet and exercise have brought healing and new energy and my prayer is that as we journey through Lent, our individual attention to prayer will generate similar stories of spiritual hope and transformation in our lives, which will be of great blessing and encouragement to our Church communities.

### Remembering St. John's Fifty Years Ago

- † St Oswald's, St Mary's and St John's were beginning life as a United Benefice.
- † St John's vicarage was for sale.
- St John's annual events included a spring bulb show with up to 18 entry classes, a summer fete, held in a different village garden each year, a pie and peas harvest supper for about 100 people and a Christmas Fair, held in the old village hall on the first Saturday in December.
- Yealand Sunday school was ecumenical, in The Old School next to the Meeting House, with three classes and a rota of twelve teachers.
- Ton occasions the St John's Sunday service was a family service, often involving Yealand school, with no communion but with hymns, prayers and a talk.
- Meeting parish share was a challenge, even though it was only £166 for St John's.





Bubble Church, a monthly service specifically for families with young children, continues to flourish at St Oswald's! In January we celebrated our first year with cake and asked for feedback about how we are getting on and what we could do better.

The feedback was overwhelmingly positive. The families love how warm, welcoming and friendly it is.

They love how interactive it is and how the children are engaged through the use of many different media – puppets, video, songs, actions and activities.

They also really appreciate the meal that is provided free of charge afterwards.

They would like more people to know how fantastic it is!

### Junior Church Lent Challenge



Many people choose to give something up during Lent but there are many others for whom going without is not a choice but a reality. This Lent, Junior Church are challenging every household in the benefice to join them by rather than giving something up, giving something each week to those experiencing food poverty.

This year the charity we will be supporting is Eggcup. This is a local charity based in Lancaster, Morecambe and Carnforth that stops surplus food from going to waste and gets it to people who need it at a price they can afford.

It works like this – Eggcup intercepts food that would otherwise go to waste from farms, factories, distribution centres, shops and other food businesses. The food is safely stored at their Community Food Hub and sorted by a team of volunteers. The food is then taken to three Community Food Outlets – one in Lancaster, one in the West End of Morecambe and one in Carnforth. There, Egg Cup members come and pay £5 for a carrier bag of mixed fruit and vegetables, some store cupboard items like pasta sauces, biscuits and beans and fresh items such as meat, cheese or ready meals.

This scheme helps those with limited finances to be able to buy good quality food while also helping the planet by cutting down on food waste.

The items required by Eggcup will be listed each week on the weekly sheet and on social media and there will be boxes at the back of each of the churches. Each household is invited to donate at least one item a week throughout Lent. The donations will be delivered to the Community Food Hub so that they can be distributed straight away.

As well as collecting donations, the children in Junior Church will be learning about the charity, food poverty and food waste. They will also visit the charity so that they can see how it works and give a helping hand.

Please do join in this challenge – by pooling our donations we will be able to help some of the many people who are struggling to make ends meet and be supporting a charity that is preventing food waste.





### **Gardening**



### Spring by Christina Rossetti (1830-1894)

"Frost-locked all the winter, seeds, and roots, and stones of fruits, what shall make their sap ascend that they may put forth shoots? "

Rossetti, famous for the beautiful carol "In the bleak mid-Winter" seems to have been influenced by the seasons. One wonders whether Winters in Victorian Bloomsbury were colder than those of today? The Autumn & Winter of 2024 were relentlessly dull, wet, windy and occasionally frosty; we are ready to embrace Spring. As the days lengthen and the clocks move forward on 30<sup>th</sup> March, we breathe a huge sigh of relief. With renewed vitality, we are keen to keep on top of the garden, before it gets on top of us!

This year, prompted by a special Christmas gift, we are going to follow "Gardening by the Moon". For moon gardening cynics, it also works as a guide to the month's gardening! We might challenge the theory ourselves and succession sow a seed packet over 4 weeks; we will report back! The waxing of the moon is associated with rising vitality and upward growth. Towards the end of the moon's first quarter is a suitable time to sow anything which develops crops above ground. Make a note on your calendar for the period 7<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> March to sow tomatoes, chillis, peppers and aubergine indoors with some bottom heat. The following 7 days, 14<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> March brings a "drawing down" energy which is a the time to plant root crops, bulbs and perennials. We wonder if slugs munch by the moon….?

Good Friday falls on 18<sup>th</sup> April this year and is traditionally the best time to plant your chitted potatoes. Coincidentally this falls within a "drawing down" period; so maybe those "Old Wives Tales" are beginning to make sense? What else should we be doing in the months of March & April; we hear you ask? Perennials will be starting to shoot and may need to be divided to replant or potted up to give to a friend. Summer annuals can be sown in small seed trays; my absolute favourites are Ammi Visnaga, Nicotiana, Cosmos and Daucus Carota, all of which give frothy pleasure to the tiniest of plots. Plant in a sunny well-drained spot adding Verbena Bonariensis, for season long gorgeousness and a perfect larder for Butterflies and Bees. Somehow, nature always knows best, especially with "self-seeders" in paths and edges of flower beds. Our favourite, Erigeron Karvinskianus (Fleabane or Mexican daisy), dances its way into path crevices, clings to dry stone walls and delights with its tiny perfect daisy blooms; month upon glorious month.

As advocates of no mow May, we hope that we have converted more of you to leave areas longer and mow "rides" through the lawn. Early April is a perfect time to plan the journey your paths will take. Since the 1930's we have lost a staggering 97% of flower rich meadows. Studies show that they provide a feast for pollinators, tackle pollution, reduce urban heat extremes and lock away atmospheric carbon below ground. Every garden, no matter how small, has its part to play.

As always, don't be caught out by Jack Frost; have fleece ready to protect your tender plants until late May. Our water catchers are full; have you invested in some water butts yet? Investigate offers for basic water butts with your provider.

The NGS Yellow Booklets are out and about in the village and at local garden centres; start planning a summer of visits to our beautiful gardens, where inspiration, flowers and cakes abound! Thank you to those who supported the NGS Charity Coffee Morning helping us raise £450.


