A Reflection on the Easter Season in the Thurton Benefice



"Alleluia, He is Risen He is Risen Indeed, Alleluia."

The Thurton Benefice has had a very busy lead up to the Easter Season, as did the Rockland Benefice.

The Lent course was also a busy and interesting time, prepared by Canon Revd Nick and Revd Helen over a period of four weeks. The theme being **Out of Darkness, Light**. Using The Barn as an art gallery for local talent producing some extraordinary paintings and poems on the theme. The last week being an interesting talk from Lorie Lain-Rogers recalling the journey she took with others from Emmaus, walking from St David's Head in Pembrokeshire across the country to the South Pier in Lowestoft. Some 450 miles and taking several weeks. Stopping at the Emmaus Way Stations, hostels and churches on route. All proceeds raised from the Lent course went towards YANA.

The Thurton Benefice lead up to Easter Sunday began with the Palm Sunday Benefice service.....processing from Alpington and Bergh Apton School to St Mary's Church, Yelverton with Alpington. (In fine weather too and sadly no donkey).

Palm Sunday is a Christian celebration that marks the beginning of the Holy Week leading to Easter Sunday. It is also the day we remember and celebrate the day Jesus entered Jerusalem as Savior and King.

It is also a reminder of the selfless love Jesus showed by laying down his life for us, and it is a time to reflect on our own lives and how we can show that same love to those around us.

Palm Sunday is a movable holiday that changes yearly based on Lent and the spring equinox. It commemorates Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem riding on a donkey. Large crowds had gathered and laid palm branches and their cloaks across the road, giving Jesus royal treatment. The hundreds of people shouted:



"Hosanna to the son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

But while this is a triumphal entry, only Jesus knew it was the first step toward His death.

Matthew 20:18-19

We are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be delivered over to the chief priests and the teachers of the law. They will condemn him to death and will hand him over to the Gentiles to be mocked and flogged and crucified. On the third day he will be raised to life!

Moving on: Fr Chris prepared (with Melanie's administration assistance) all the services in Holy Week. A short Compline service with Homily beginning with:-

Fig Monday - at St Mary's Church, Yelverton. Traditionally Monday of Holy Week is known as 'Fig Monday' because the Gospel of the day used to be the account in St Mark's Gospel of Christ cursing the fig tree.

Temple Tuesday - at St. Peter and St Paul Church, Bergh Apton. Tuesday afternoon would be the last time Jesus would publicly teach in the temple as a free man. His words on that day would be His closing argument. His manifesto.

Spy Wednesday - at St Mary's Church, Ashby St Mary. The designation "Spy" is linked to Judas Iscariot's clandestine arrangement with the chief priests to betray Jesus to them. Leading up to the crucifixion

Maundy Thursday - at St Andrew's Church, Framingham Pigot. Mass of the Last Supper, washing of feet, Stripping the altar.

Good Friday - The Benefice Pilgrimage. This year starting at St Andrew's Church, Framingham Pigot - St Mary's Church, Yelverton - St. Peter and St. Paul's Church, Bergh Apton - St. Ethelbert's Church, Thurton - St Mary's Church, Ashby St. Mary.

Unfortunately I was not able to walk this year due to a knee injury but I drove and this gave me more time to sit in each church along the way before the others arrived to pray and reflect on the Liturgy of Good Friday which included the readings from:

John 18: 1-11 Jesus is betrayed and arrested John 18: 12-19:11 Jesus before the High Priest and Pilate John 19:12-19:42 Jesus is sentenced to death and crucified

I did miss the reason for our walking and also the banter from my friends along the way.

Holy Saturday - at St. Ethelbert's Church, Thurton. Easter Vigil and First Mass of Easter. Lighting of the fire.

Set out in the Meditation Mary, Peter, Judas and Pilate all questioned themselves to being at fault for the terrible thing that had happened. They felt guilty that they had all failed HIM.

What if.....

We, as the meditators, were given questions to think over how we would have reacted and dealt with the situation....would we have blamed ourselves..... What if......

A Prayer

Lord, we all share responsibility for the brokenness of the world, the world for which you were broken.

As we followed your steps through this painful week help us to walk through guilt to active love, that we might live lives dedicated in service to your praise and glory. Amen

One of the projects we have been supporting has been the installation of a pipe organ, as well as the repainting of the church gate and porch light and restoration of the tower flagpole.






