

#### Walk the Ancient Paths

There is intense interest today in Celtic spirituality. It is based on belief that in those many centuries past of isolation, that the early Celtic Christians developed a culture that was in many respects closer to the early church, to "true Christianity," rather than any of the forms of institutionalized Christianity that replaced it.

Some consider the "defeat" of Celtic Christians at Whitby a disaster of planetary proportions. Bradley quotes a 1998 speculation from *The Plain Truth*, the magazine of the Worldwide Church of God: "If the Celts had won at Whitby, our world might be less materialistic and less steeped in consumerism. Our waters might be less polluted, our rain forests and ozone layer might still be intact, and our fellow creatures might be less endangered. Life might be simpler, less frantic, and happier."

Celtic Christianity offers a rich worship tradition; fosters prayer in everyday language of creation and the natural world; is 'green' in its stewardship of the earth; affirms women and men equally; is committed to living in community; is passionate about peace and justice; has no divide between sacred and secular; engages critically with contemporary culture; and is rooted in mission not maintenance.

Join us on the 13th September 2025 9.30 - 4.00pm at St Mary's Church Beverley, led by Rev Roy Searle, and explore the riches of the Celtic Christian spirituality of the Saints and how they carried the light of Christ in the dark age in which they lived and what we can glean from their lives for our life and faith in a changing and uncertain world today. The day will finish with a candlelit, reflective and meditative Celtic Eucharist.
