That's the Gospel Truth!

We will often say- 'that's the Gospel truth' to emphasise that the point we are making is unquestionably true; without even a hint of doubt. It is an old English phrase that was created because there is nothing more truthful than the spoken words of Jesus Christ as recorded in the Gospels. Christians believe that the entire Bible is significant. The authors of the Holy Scriptures were inspired by God to write their words. Of course, some chapters are challenging and context needs to be taken along with careful interpretation; the message is not always clear!

However, there is something uniquely special about the Gospels; these chapters of the Bible contain the actual words and teachings of Jesus Christ, the Son of God: these words are unquestionably true and provide us with the wisdom required to live life to the full. The importance of the Gospels is highlighted in Church on a Sunday as our Gospel reading is read from a large, decorated 'Gospel book'; its large size and design being a helpful sign to highlight the importance of the words.

The Gospel reading is also delivered from the centre of the church, with the congregation physically turning to face and listen to the words. This is another important action. The words of Jesus are at the heart and centre of Christianity and they spread out across the entire world, on a Sunday, we also let those Gospel words spread out from the very centre of the church.

Finally, after I have finished reading from the Gospel, I will kiss the page, and if a bishop is present, they will also use the Gospel book to give the congregation a blessing. Both of these actions help to emphasise the importance and respect that we offer to the words of Christ; words that change lives, the words of God. Some years ago, the late Pope Francis suggested that all Christians should carry a small gospel book with them at all times, either in their pocket or in their bag. Pope Francis suggested that when Christians had a spare moment, that instead of reaching for their phone, they should reach for the Gospels. I followed the Pope's advice and I now carry a very small gospel book with me at all times. I must admit, it is not always easy to resist the temptation to avoid the phone

and instead to read the Gospels, however, just having it in my pocket provides a constant source of hope and reassurance.

During the World Wars, every soldier was issued with a small gospel book to keep in their pockets. The Church teaches that the Word of God will always bring us comfort and strength; therefore, it is important that we always keep it near us.

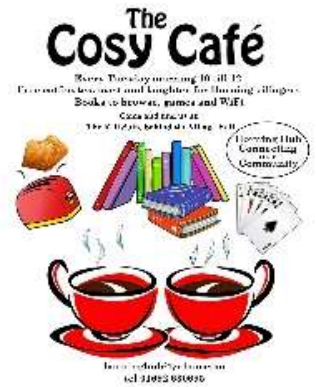

ST BENET'S ABBEY CELEBRATES HERITAGE OPEN DAYS.



On Sunday 21 September 2025, there will be a variety of different opportunities to participate in Heritage Open Days at St Benet's Abbey. The monument itself will be open to the public, with tour guides on hand to give guided tours of the site, including the Cross of Peace, and there will be meet and greet volunteers for those who just want snippets of information and to stroll the site at their leisure.

The Event Team from NAT will provide activities for all ages, including scrap box crafts where you can make a stained-glass window, create your own model monk and much more. There will also be dragons to find in a search trail. For those with an interest in Natural History as well, a Guided Tour organised by Pathmakers will set off at 10:30 from Ludham with Jerry an experienced environmentalist who will talk about the nature on the riverbanks and the river itself. The walk will also be joined by a tour guide from St Benet's Abbey who will point out interesting stories from the Abbey relating to the river and conclude the walk with a guided tour on arrival at St Benet's. There are limited spaces for this tour and tickets should be booked via the Heritage Open Day website - Pathmakers page.

It does not end there, all our guests – particularly Dragon Hunters – are invited to then visit St Catherine's Church in Ludham. Here they will be greeted by Tour Guides who will assist them to locate the Ludham Dragon and relay tales of the century's old links between the Abbey and the Church. You will be able to buy refreshments in the form of tea and cake whilst visiting the church.

Parish Staithe update

Many of you will be aware that the Staithe used by the Broads Authority (BA) for 24-hour moorings in the Village are leased from Horning Parish Council (HPC). As the lease was coming to an end this year, HPC have been negotiating with the BA to look at how best to restart that relationship.

The first concern for HPC was that the existing lease offered no protection from the liabilities associated with maintenance of the quay heading and piling. Continuing this lease could have exposed HPC to a very expensive piece of maintenance in the next 10-20 years.

A secondary consideration, was a desire to try and move away from the 24-hour mooring model to encourage a greater turnover of visitors during the day. This is in the aim to support our local businesses.

After nearly a year of discussion, we are nearing an agreement whereby HPC will lease BA the Staithe for a term of 99 years and the BA will take on all maintenance obligations in that timeframe. HPC will receive a small index linked rent during the period of the lease.

BA have agreed, sperate to the lease finalisation, to work with HPC to look at different models for the use of the moorings to encourage greater access to the village by the boating community. This will hopefully see a different model for the moorings from the 24-hour currently in place. At this stage there is no preferred model for the future and there are a lot of options on the table to be discussed in the coming months.

Visit Egypt Themed Wherry on the Norfolk Broads During Heritage Open Days

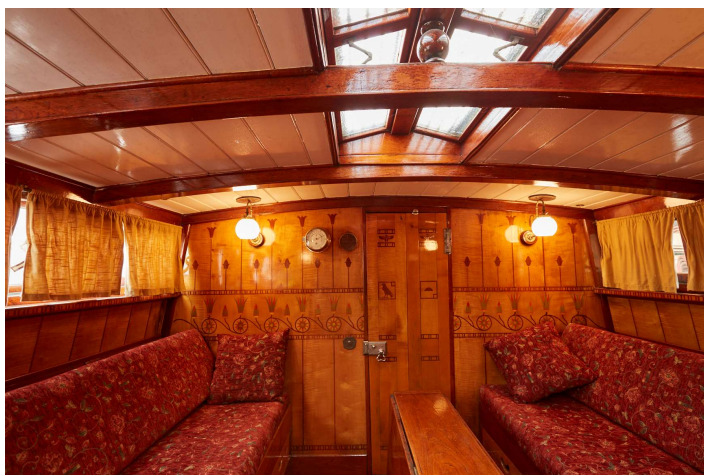
#A Norfolk pleasure wherry featuring a lavish Egyptian themed interior designed by one of the county's most prominent architects can be viewed during Heritage Open Days from 12 to 21 September.

Wherry Yacht Charter Charitable Trust is taking part in the annual festival of history and culture, which this year has the theme of Architecture.

Prominent Victorian architect Edward Boardman, from Norwich, drafted the plans for the inlaid wooden panels inside the wherry in memory of Alan Colman, a young son of the famous Colman's Mustard family. He contracted tuberculosis and his doctors suggested that the warm air of Egypt might help him. His family chartered a dahabeah (passenger boat) called Hathor to take him down the Nile, but he sadly died just after reaching Luxor.

The wherry was commissioned in his memory in 1904 by his heartbroken sisters and the Egyptian themed interior commemorates Alan's final journey.

"It is a fascinating story that our volunteer guides love sharing with visitors to the wherry – many of whom are amazed by what they see when they first step foot inside the boat," says Wherry Yacht Charter Trustee Director Judith Keogh.



"Our charity exists to maintain, preserve and operate five of the last remaining eight Norfolk wherries to keep history sailing for future generations. Taking part in the national Heritage Open Days event is a fantastic way to highlight what we do and tell people about these iconic boats," she adds.

Moored on the bank of the River Ant at How Hill, near Ludham on the Norfolk Broads (Postcode NR29 5PG), Hathor will be open from 10am to 4pm during the Heritage Open Days event. No booking is required, and entry is free.

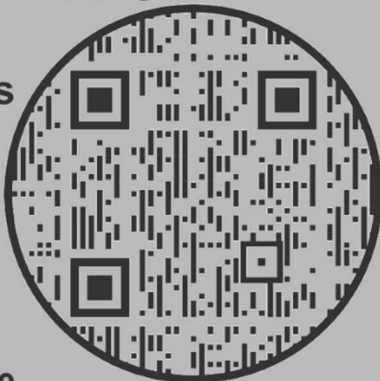
