

Reverend Clifford's Weekly Blog 'Area Dean?'

2nd August 2025

As some of you might have heard or read on my personal social media pages I have accepted the role as Area Dean for Strood. What does that mean for those who don't know how the Church of England works. Well, it is not a promotion or a role that will take me away from my role as Parish Priest that is still my main vocation as I try to serve the community of Cliffe with Cooling. It doesn't mean I have a pay increase either, it does mean that I take on more responsibilities and become more active in the wider life of our diocese. An Area Dean helps with the tendering of the deanery in assisting the Bishop and Archdeacon by being as it were eyes and ears on the ground, supporting other clergy and laity in the deanery, meeting regularly with them and assisting parishes in interregnum, some paperwork that only incumbents can complete or process go in these cases to the Area Dean to sign as a fellow priest.

I have been an Area Dean before sharing the role with the current Bishop of Dover's chaplain Reverend Richard Braddy back in Thanet, that was a huge deanery of 24 parishes and churches. Strood is a lot smaller and consists of all the Peninsula churches, Frindsbury and Strood churches and stretches across down the river

Medway to Cuxton and Halling.

I guess I have taken this role on as I believe we are in exciting times as the diocese looks at how we change, serve and grow our communities for the Kingdom of God, being an Area Dean will enable me to be at the heart of many of the conventions that arise from this mission, and I would like to see St. Helen's involved with this so that we have a real community church thriving for the next generation. There will need to be changes not least here on the peninsula as we use resources and limited finances to shape us and deploy ministry where it is most needed, I can be your voice in that process. I am not just a member of the house of clergy I have vested interest in Medway because it is and has been for a longtime my home, the place where one day we will retire, the place where we raised our children and now they our grandchildren it is also our spiritual home.

Sometime shortly I will be commissioned to the role by Archdeacon Sandra taking over from Reverend Nicholas Cooper who has done a wonderful job, and we pray that God will be with him as he seeks what God wants him to do next as he and the family move to Sheffield at the end of September.

In the meanwhile, I am having some time off so no blogs for a fortnight as I recharge, which I am sure will give me plenty of material for future blogs.

It's now time to relax and enjoy the creation of God's handiwork.

Next blog from me will be Saturday 23rd August.
