

# Reverend Clifford's Weekly Blog 'I'm back'



#### **23rd August 2025**

Hi all, I'm back from a couple of weeks off, I'll be off again soon as we try to use some of the six Sunday's a year I am entitled to, I'm around for the other 46 Sunday's if you are worried. As we have a 'new to us' tent that we are using since our May holiday where the old one sort of gave up in the storm force winds and rain we do not want to pitch up in the late autumn or winter. The nice thing about taking a break was to just sit and relax, and allow our surrounding to just soak in. We spent eight nights in Woodhall Spa in Lincolnshire and enjoyed the time away, we cycled to a few places enjoying the quiet roads (no potholes either). I spent three years of my life in ministry in March in the Cambridgeshire Fens which was a quieter slower place of life to the mad rush of the Southeast, but I have to say a little further north across the fens, Lincolnshire is even more laid back, I highly recommend it if you haven't been before, dare I say it, we never smelt the sickly smell of cannabis anywhere, proving I guess people can enjoy a laid back life without the need to fry their minds.

Anyway, whilst I sat there I did think of a few things I could use to write about in my blogs, so I apologise now for the next few weeks inclusions. You see life is about observance, Jesus used this model time and time again, he spoke about everyday things, he used the things and people around him to tell us about his Father, God and how we should live our lives in a way that shares God's love and forgiveness. If I get

this right the following titles will be 'The Stall', 'Bat out of Hell', 'The Imp perfection' 'Defenders of the Sky' and 'The Swan.'

Right then for this week, 'The Stall' not just any stall but my stall. A stall that is a tool for cooking, a kitchen stall that I place before my camp stove and have sat on in all weathers in many parts of Europe and the UK. It has travelled with me and our family for tens of thousands of miles and seen hundreds of meals provided and cooked my myself for my family. It is getting on a bit now, tried and tested over almost three decades and still as supportive as it has ever been from the first day I purchased it in Gillingham. Reliable it is, taking my great weight. It has become a family joke, dad's stall, we can't set up camp without it, maybe one day I will bequest it to one of my children or grandchildren as they are all now enjoying the life of camping. If that stall could speak it could tell you of all the places we have seen over the years, it could tell you of heatwaves and storms, it could describe the many languages that it has heard and the sound of people just enjoying life. It could describe how infants have grown and become adults and now have infants of their own, it could tell you how valued it is.

My stall, three simple short legs bound together by a plastic grommet thing, rising up to a red fabric clothe which forms the seat. What image can I get from this that reminds me of God. Well, the obvious I guess, the Trinity, that is God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit three persons in one. You see I take that stall on every camping trip and God in Trinity I know is always with me when I travel, He is the constant, the one who sets up camp beside us, the one who supports us in all that we do. He is the one who can tell our stories who has seen all that we have said and done. From the foundation up this heavenly union gives us a base to place ourselves on, to allow us to do the things that we need to do, we are invited to take our rest with them. It reminds me that we need all three supports to accomplish anything that we might want to do.

Take away a leg from the stall and collapse, I'm on the floor bruised and unsupported. You can believe in God alone, but would you sit on just the one leg, a bit like a spike, you can accept God has a son, but two legs aren't much better than one, because we need also the Holy Spirit that finally gives us true support, equally with the other two. It is simple engineering and the law of gravity and a few other scientific bits and bobs that I don't really understand. It is the same with the Trinity we don't have to understand every part of it, we just have to accept that like my stall it works. We can see it with our own eyes, we can experience it from allowing ourselves to trust that it will support us, that's how basic faith works.

If we allow the Trinity to support us then like my trusted stall we would not leave it behind, it becomes part of us, an essential to every place we go.

I'll be taking the stall with me again soon and there I'll sit securely knowing I have sat there before and will again and hopefully again. May God bless you in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, Amen.
