### All Nature has a Feeling

All nature has a feeling: woods, fields, brooks
Are life eternal; and in silence they
Speak happiness beyond the reach of books;
There's nothing mortal in them; their decay
Is the green life of change; to pass away
And come again in blooms revivified.
Its birth was heaven, eternal is its stay,
And with the sun and moon shall still abide
Beneath their day and night and heaven wide.

Early nineteenth century poet John Clare, author of these words, was closely attuned to the life of the land, lamenting the loss of both species and our connection with nature brought about the Enclosure Acts and agricultural industrialisation. Knowing his patch intimately, his many verses expressively and observantly articulate the complex interweaving of humanity and creation. Clare suffered this environmental depredation so keenly that it contributed to a breakdown of his mental health. As he experienced new industries working against nature rather than with it, so he felt in his bones a debilitating spiritual disconnection from the land washing through the population.

Richard Brock was, like John Clare, a close observer or nature and critic of our tendency to tread on, rather than in it. However, his chosen tool for drawing this to our attention was a TV camera. So, it is fitting that this year's Chew Valley Nature Photography Festival (12-14 September), which celebrates the remarkable biodiversity of our parishes, opens with a Friday night preview and premiere of Pete Brownlee's new film *Richard Brock: A Life Devoted to Nature*. Over the weekend St Andrew's Church will be full of amazing photographs taken locally, along with stalls, displays, children's craft, musical performances and much more to help strengthen our connections with the natural world.

John Clare believed in the resilience of nature, visible in the resurgence of British butterflies this year following the emergency caused by 2024's wet spring. He also understood, long before the current crop of wildlife writers, the restorative power of nature for our own mental and spiritual health. We hope to welcome you to the Festival where perhaps you may also sense the 'green life of change' and come away revivified.
