Rev'd. Kat is getting excited about ...



At the beginning of August Paul and Sue Standley from Canal Ministries will be bringing their Canal Boat (called 10,000 Reasons) over to Burnley for the week. They will also be joined by a team of people from Canal Ministries who are usually based elsewhere in the country but will be coming to Burnley to lead a week of activities.

Paul and Sue will be sharing about Canal Ministries during the Family Service on Sunday 3^{rd} August. The first event of the week will be on Monday evening from 7-9pm at Finsley Gate Wharf. It will be an evening of music and storytelling with pie & peas. Tickets will cost £5, ask Rev'd Kat for more information.

On Wednesday 6^{th} August St Matthew's have 5 boat trips booked. 8 people can go on each trip. The trips take just under an hour and start and end at Finsley Gate Wharf. The trips will leave at 10am, 11am, 12noon, 2pm & 3pm. There will be a sheet in church at the end of July on which you'll be able to book your place.

Recommended donation is £2 per adult and 50p per child. On Thursday 7th August the Bishop of Burnley will be visiting the boat so you may be able to catch him down at Finsley Gate Wharf in the afternoon. There will also be a canal and parks walk from 7pm-8.30pm starting and ending at Finsley Gate Wharf, this is free of charge.

To draw the week to a close there will be an open afternoon from 2-4pm on Saturday 9th August. There will be craft and prayer activities available free of charge on the quay side at Finsley Gate Wharf.

Sabbath Rest and Sabbaticals: a reflection by Fr. Rod.

In the letter to the Hebrews we read about 'a sabbath rest for the people of God', a promise of renewal, re-creation, restoration. The writer echoes the Old Testament call to 'keep the sabbath day holy' which is the fourth of the ten commandments given to Moses to guide the people. This commandment is placed as a kind of hinge between the first three (which are about God) and the last six (which are about how we live in relation to one another). Being placed there suggests that keeping a sabbath rhythm is pretty important in maintaining a balance between God and neighbour.

We all now live in a culture and society that finds rest — as a restorative and renewing discipline - very difficult to experience. Everything is on offer 24/7. Shops are open all night. Sunday is pretty much like any other day. Our phones are permanently on. Research now tells us that constant exposure to the demands of a permanently open society with messages, information, data, entertainment and excitement perpetually on offer is not easy to cope with.

It's something we have to work at to acquire as part of our following of Jesus, who said 'the sabbath is made for humanity' — as a necessary gift if you like. One of my favourite spiritual books of recent years is one called 'The Ruthless Elimination of Hurry' by an American pastor called John Mark Comer. It's an appeal for us to make space and time for rest and renewal. It challenges us, within the circumstances of our life, to make some decisions about carving out a sabbath space. Sometimes we need some help in sorting out how we might do this. It's not easy and there are many voices saying we always must be available, on call. We can't let the phone ring without answering it. We can't waste time with God or our nearest. We have to be always at it.

And I have news for you. Clergy are not immune to these pressures – if anything research shows how tricky it is for us to maintain clear boundaries, to switch off and to give adequate time for renewal and recreation. I've also got bad news as well – if clergy don't find this time their ministry is less effective. In my own life as a priest the times when I've got things wrong are related to lack of sabbath time.

I was blessed to be given a period of <u>sabbatical</u> time in 2018. Although it wasn't planned like this it came just at the right time as that year proved to be the most difficult I've experienced in Christian ministry. It was a life saver. I spent my time doing various things – for a sabbatical gift is not exactly a holiday. I attended a conference in Bruges, Belgium, looking at contemplative responses to the crisis of change that was beginning to engulf Europe post Brexit. I spent some time in Belfast sharing in the ministry of the Divine Healing Ministries, which had been set up in the Troubles by an Anglican priest and a Catholic nun to offer a new way forward in a divided and poisoned society. Later on I spent eight days in silent retreat in North Wales – seeking God in silent prayer, meditation and nature. I also did some touring round the music capitals of the southern states of America and read lots of poetry. The whole experience was a great gift and helped orientate my ministry from then on.

Not everyone has the luxury of such a time out – but it's worth thinking about - whether we can carve out smaller periods for sabbath rest, to receive, to assimilate and take on board new insights. At the start of September, Father Alex is starting a sabbatical. He'll be doing different things to me but we pray it will be a time of deep renewal and refreshment that will inform his ongoing ministry. We will pull together during his absence but inevitability some things will be done differently, and maybe some things not at all. Above all we can help ensure that those who will carry an extra load during the period – especially Revd Kat – are able to maintain their own sabbath rhythm and that St. Matthew's as a whole may be a church which is not so over-busy that renewal time is squeezed out.

Ichthyosis Support Group


On Sunday 25th May 2025, families and friends came together in Burnley for a powerful and uplifting 5km sponsored walk — inspired by the Ichthyosis Support Group and held in honour of Ichthyosis Awareness Month.

The walk was led by an incredible family whose youngest son, Henry, lives with X-linked ichthyosis. Their journey hasn't been easy, but through support from ISG, they've gained knowledge, confidence, and a community that truly understands.

They tell us: "Our theme was 'Embrace Your Scales'. Henry lives with scales on his skin all year round — just when we think they've gone, they return. So we asked people to walk in his shoes for a day by dressing up as dragons, dinosaurs, and mermaids — magical, mythical, and strong. Not fish — because of the stigma often unfairly attached to 'fish skin.'"

With costumes, face paint, and big hearts, participants showed that while we can take off our scales at the end of the walk, Henry — and others with ichthyosis — cannot. The walk wasn't just fun; it was a powerful act of awareness, empathy, and solidarity.

The group included everyone from babies in prams to grandparents, and even some curious passers-by who cheered them on. Despite the forecast, the weather held, and spirits soared.



This walk reminds us that raising awareness doesn't have to be loud — it just has to be real. Through creativity, courage, and community, this family turned their journey into hope for others.
