The Word of God

Psalm 82

¹God has taken his stand in the council of heaven; ◆ in the midst of the gods he gives judgement:

² 'How long will you judge unjustly ◆ and show such favour to the wicked?

- ³ You were to judge the weak and the orphan; ◆ defend the right of the humble and needy;
- ⁴ Rescue the weak and the poor; ♦ deliver them from the hand of the wicked.
- 5'They have no knowledge or wisdom; they walk on still in darkness: ♦ all the foundations of the earth are shaken.
- 6. Therefore I say that though you are gods ♦ and all of you children of the Most High,
- 7'Nevertheless, you shall die like mortals ◆ and fall like one of their princes.'
- ⁸Arise, O God and judge the earth, ♦ for it is you that shall take all nations for your possession.

First Reading: Hebrews 11:29-12:2

²⁹By faith the people of Israel passed through the Red Sea as if it were dry land, but when the Egyptians attempted to do so they were drowned. ³⁰By faith the walls of Jericho fell after they had been encircled for seven days. ³¹By faith Rahab the prostitute did not perish with those who were disobedient, because she had received the spies in peace.

³²And what more should I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets – ³³who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, ³⁴quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. ³⁵Women received their dead by resurrection. Others were tortured, refusing to accept release, in order to obtain a better resurrection. ³⁶Others suffered mocking and flogging, and even chains and imprisonment. ³⁷They were stoned to death, they were sawn in two, they were killed by the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, persecuted, tormented – ³⁸of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, and in caves and holes in the ground.

³⁹Yet all these, though they were commended for their faith, did not receive what was promised, ⁴⁰since God had provided something better so that they would not, apart from us, be made perfect.

¹Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, ²looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.

⁵⁴He also said to the crowds, 'When you see a cloud rising in the west, you immediately say, "It is going to rain"; and so it happens. ⁵⁵And when you see the south wind blowing, you say, "There will be scorching heat"; and it happens. ⁵⁶You hypocrites! You know how to interpret the appearance of earth and sky, but why do you not know how to interpret the present time?

We pray for those who stir up dissension disturbing us with new visions and ideas; criticising our apathy and complacency; provoking us to think afresh about our calling. In your love and mercy: hear our prayer. Amen.
