Tuesday 16th September – Ninian, Bishop pf Galloway, Apostle of the Picts, 432, Edward Bouverie Pusey, Priest, Tractarian, 1882. The tradition that Ninian evangelised the Picts, one of the early inhabitants of Scotland, over 150 years earlier than Augustine was sent to Kent by Pope Gregory, reminds us of the ancient roots of Christianity in these Isles. Pusey was a leader in what came to be known as the catholic revival in the Church of England. They put forth their views in written articles known as 'Tracts'

She is one of the best-known composers of sacred monophony (single line of melody), as well as the most recorded in modern history
