Some years ago the Australian government returned to the Aboriginal nations, lands which past governments had taken for development. Title deeds were formally handed to the leaders of the various tribes – who promptly burnt them!

When asked why, they said "the land doesn't belong to us, we belong to the land. In smoke the land returns to its true owner, the creator spirit -".

Whether you accept the biblical Creation narrative or you go for some 'big-bang' theory we too belong to the land and can't escape our responsibility to care for it. Whether you accept that in Genesis God gave us that job or not, there's no doubt that we are responsible for the damage 'progress' has done to the environment and so we are responsible for building a better, cleaner future.

We know, reducing carbon emissions will save lives in lands already being devastated by climate change. We also know it will have a positive impact at home, improving air quality and public health, creating jobs and reducing inequality.

But it's such a massive issue that I'm often left wondering, what can I do?

The artist Vincent Van Gogh wrote: "Great things are done by lots of small things brought together."

Recently scientists at the Grantham Institute drew up a list of simple ways we personally can make a difference. Here are just some of their suggestions...

Save the planet, one meal at a time: Cutting down consumption of meat and dairy products is one of the biggest ways to reduce your environmental impact on the planet. Buying fresh, produce grown locally cuts carbon emissions from transportation, and preservation. Minimise food waste by planning meals and properly storing leftovers - and consider composting organic waste.

Is your journey really necessary? Transport accounted for around 26%_of UK greenhouse gas emissions in 2021. So leave the car at home – for short journeys walk or cycle – for longer journeys, use public transport. And just a thought... instead of flying to that meeting could you use video-conferencing instead?

Small changes will cut your carbon footprint and your energy bills: Put on an extra layer and turn down the heating a degree or two. Only fill the kettle with as much water as you need and use the washing machine at 30°. Turn off lights and appliances when you don't need them. Avoid single-use items. Repair, reuse, recycle; If it does the job, why replace it?

Respect and protect green spaces: Parks and gardens absorb carbon dioxide and so lower levels of air pollution. From not covering your garden with paving or artificial turf to lobbying MPs and Councils against development on green spaces, you can make a difference.

In Genesis, God gave humankind responsibility for the care of everything on this planet and we <u>can</u> each play a part. Remember "Great things are done by lots of small things brought together."





SHOREHAM & DISTRICT HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The Royal Marines in the Second World War will be the focus of our next meeting, at 8pm on Friday 17 October in the Village Hall. The combat story of one Marine – Colour Sergeant Albert Elliott – will feature in the talk by Dr Martin Watts, a highly regarded historian and Honorary Secretary of the Chatham Naval Officers Association. Colour Sergeant Elliott served almost continuously in the Atlantic, Mediterranean and Pacific theatres of war.

Our September meeting saw a very well attended and much appreciated talk by David Carder on the history of maps. David showed us some of the earliest surviving maps, from Ptolemy's "world map" of AD 150 through to Matthew Paris's quite detailed depiction of Britain from about 1250. Then he discussed some maps of Kent, such as one by William Lambarde from 1570 which included Shoreham and its bridge.

INVITATION TO BE A TRUSTEE OF THE WALNUT TREE TRUST

The Walnut Tree Trust, a registered charity (no 1182220) operating since 1932, is seeking two new trustees. We own the three cottages at 29-33 High Street, just south of Shoreham Village Stores, and including three outbuildings. The trustees are responsible for maintaining and letting these properties to fulfil the objects of the Trust.

Trustees must have a connection to Shoreham. Trustees must act in the charity's best interests; manage the charity's resources responsibly, and act with reasonable care and skill.

Since sometime in the 1950's the property had been managed to provide low-income housing for deserving individuals with Shoreham connections. More recent boards have returned to managing the property at market rents with the profit margin donated to charitable causes in Shoreham or elsewhere. This approach is in fact a legal requirement of both our 2019 Constitution and the Charities Act.

The Trust relies upon the unpaid commitment of Shoreham residents willing to offer their time and talents to create a balanced board of varied skills and perspectives to provide sound management. It is an appreciable time commitment. There are generally between five and eight board meetings per year. Papers are circulated in advance and must be read and considered prior to these meetings. Between board meetings there are other tasks requiring attention. The rewards are making a huge contribution to our community as well as working with interesting and similarly involved individuals.

Cameron class travelled to London to visit the Coliseum, the home of the English National Opera. When we got there, we had a talk to find out about the building eg that it was inspired by the Romans and there was a mosaic on the floor by the entrance that said 'Salve' which means welcome in Roman.

Joe was very impressed with our singing and our ideas. He also complimented our music teacher. Joe played different genres for us and we chose the style of music for the words we had written. It ended up starting with a sweeping romantic sound and then changed to a jazzy Calypso beat and finished with a calm diminuendo.

Overall, it was the best school trip I've ever been on... And maybe the best day ever.


Our twice yearly big village clean-up is on Saturday 11 October

The course is free, and subsidised by the organisers, but donations will be welcomed. There are several defibs in the village and the course will give you the confidence to know what to do in an emergency. Do please come along whether it's your first time or if you need a refresher.

SARAH PARKES

Many people in the village were saddened to hear of the recent death of Sarah Parkes, a longstanding supporter and committee member of the Shoreham Society and a redoubtable defender of our village and our valley.

Her neighbour, Lesley Spence, helped Sarah to the end, and says that she will sorely miss a very dear friend. Lesley wrote this tribute:

"It's difficult to think of anything that Sarah was not involved in at some time in the village. Sarah would not give up with KCC about making Preston Hill accessible for walkers. At Parish Council meetings, she would remind Roger Gough of what needed to be done to ensure that this happened over a period of many years. When we encountered broken or unstable stiles, Sarah was straight onto KCC and ensured that they were mended. Likewise, any road or footpath obstructions were quickly reported; to the appropriate authority and not just blasted out on Facebook!!

She was the eyes of all the village amenities and noted and reported when trees were posing a problem (or likely to and required attention) such as on the village green and beside the river.

Long before my time, she held rank within the Brownie and Girl Guide Troops. We were talking last Monday: she was likely Tawney Owl! She was a member of the Parochial Church Council for many years. She also was a reliable baker for the Pulpit Tea Room. She was a valued member of the Parish Council and her long and accurate memory was greatly valued when the Planning Committee considered responses to applications. Sarah also made costumes for the Players. The planning and planting of the Centenary Wood was our closest long term project. Once the land had been restored to the Parish Council, we had to decide how to manage this. Sarah's encyclopaedic knowledge of trees: which were native and which were not, left me in awe.

Whenever contributions were requested for so many fundraising events, Sarah was the first to get baking. Her cheesy biscuits were legendary.

At one time, Sarah managed an allotment before the time when the cisterns were installed for access to water. I think we owe it to her to continue her legacy!"

MEADOW MAKER

There's a brilliant plant that can really help you to manage your wildflower meadows; it's called Yellow Rattle and September and October are good times to sow it. Yellow Rattle, or Hay Rattle, is a British wildflower, also known as the Meadow Maker due to its ability to supress grass, encouraging wildflowers to thrive.

Yellow Rattle is partially parasitic on grass, tapping into the roots of grass plants and extracting extra nutrition (as well as photosynthesising like most plants). This weakens the grass to such an extent that an area of grassland containing Yellow Rattle has a visibly shorter sward than the neighbouring patch without. So, less chance of flowers being overtopped and squeezed out, less grass to cut and fewer heavy grass cuttings to rake up and remove. It is an annual plant so doesn't over-winter but it sets seed in June or early July so seed will have scattered by the time you cut your meadow, and once established it spreads itself. Listen for the 'rattle' of the ripe seeds in their pods.

Yellow Rattle can be tricky though, it needs a little care to get it established but is well worth it:

- 1) Cut the area where you will be sowing really short, giving it a firm raking to pull out any dead grass that may be lodged there. Get down to the soil!
- 2) Sow Yellow Rattle seed from now until the end of November, making sure the seed reaches bare soil by scraping away the turf in small patches. Sprinkle a few seeds onto the soil and press down with your foot.
- 4) Give the area another short mow in the spring so the germinating plants have some sunlight. March or April are good times to cut.

Yellow Rattle seed is widely available online, and it is also a component of the Wildflower Seed mix that can be purchased from the Caring for God's Acre website.
