Notes of Leconfield Inter-Faith Group, St Catherine's Church, Leconfield 8.9.25

Just six of us met this time, with three apologies



The starting point for our discussion this time was an account of a **Quaker interfaith** meeting held in Leeds in June. Three speakers, two from ecumenical groups in Lancashire and West Yorkshire, respectively - and an Imam from a Leeds mosque had contributed from their own perspective of inter-faith engagement. They had described their experience of the value of inter-faith dialogue to their own faith. Sharing with others of different faiths was seen as enriching.

Our own discussion was, as we are now regularly finding for ourselves, both wideranging and deep. As we each spoke of our experience and understandings of our own faith, we came closer to an appreciation of our common humanity. Our shared perspectives helped us to feel united in our yearning for 'the peace which passeth understanding'.

At our next meeting to be held on **Monday 13th October, 7.00pm** at **St Catherine's Church**, when **Andrew Proctor** will share his experience of what it means to be a **Catholic**. Do please join us.

Church-run bereavement course having 'profound and wide-reaching impact'

A church-run bereavement course is having a "profound and wide-reaching impact on adults of all ages," according to a recent independent evaluation.

The Bereavement Journey, run by the Christian charity AtaLoss, is "addressing a national need for bereavement support", and is "ideal for the significant majority — 85-90 per cent — of bereaved people who do not require or will not benefit from a clinical intervention".

AtaLoss was founded in 2016 by the Revd Yvonne Tulloch, a former Canon for Mission at Coventry Cathedral, whose husband died suddenly in 2008. She says: "We are a society where people have grown up not expecting death and where we have lost the art of support."

The course is made up of seven sessions of films and peer-group discussion. It is currently being run by churches in more than 400 communities across the UK.
