Compiling my report, I was humbled by the number of helpers we have serving in our church. Anyone who serves in this way deserves a heartfelt thanks. The fruit of the spirit obviously lives in you.


This month we celebrate Pentecost, a time that marks the end of the Easter season. Pentecost commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles, enabling them to speak in different languages to spread the message about Jesus to all nations. This coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles represented the fulfilment of a promise made by Christ to baptise his followers with the Holy Spirit. A promise that remains at the very heart of our Christian faith and worship today.

Environment Day is on the 5th of this month, and the theme this year is ending plastic pollution. A topic that is prominent in our news. Did you know that your church is helping the environment too? Recently Rev Tracy had solar panels fitted to the vicarage roof to utilise the sun's energy to power some of the vicarage's electricity. To add to this, the church's gas contract is now provided by a company that derives its power from a green gas Source. Also the church plans to install LED light bulbs to illuminate the churchyard at night. Statistics show that LED light bulbs consume less energy, last longer, so they'll need replacing less often, .making less waste to going to our rubbish tips.

Finally, I am sure all fathers are looking forward to Father's Day on the 15th of June. Perhaps many don't know that the first celebration of Father's Day took place on June 19th, 1910, to honour the father of Sonora Dodd, a Civil War veteran. Dodd was raised by her father along with her five brothers following her mother's death. On listening to a sermon on Mother's Day she thought her father deserved some sort of recognition for the care she and her brothers had received. She convinced Spokane Ministry Alliance (her local church) to recognise a special Father's Day. The rest is history, and Father's Day was born.

Our Mother's Union meeting on Wednesday 23rd of April was well attended by our members plus four visitors. We had the pleasure of meeting Ruby Currell, who came to talk to our group. Ruby is a member of Holy Trinity Church and Freckleton M.U. and was a survivor of the Freckleton Air Disaster.

On the 23rd August 1944, there was a sudden thunderstorm and an American aircraft crashed into the centre of the village, destroying the school and surrounding area. Ruby, who was born Ruby Whittle, was aged 5 and sat at the front of the class. Hearing a big bang, she dived under a table and stayed there until someone came to get her out; many were not so fortunate. Ruby had 50% burns and spent the next 18 months in hospital. 61 people lost their lives; 38 of those were children between the ages of 4 and 6.

She told us that there wasn't a family in the village that wasn't affected and it took a long time for the village to heal. Ruby regularly talks to groups about the air disaster to make people aware and to keep the childrens' memories alive, many of whom were her friends, making sure that they are not forgotten. She married and moved away with her husband's job, but moved back to Freckleton when he retired. She said that she has had a good life, with love of family and the people of the village.



A donation of £70 given during the meeting was given to Macmillan Cancer support, a charity very close to Ruby's heart.

After the talk we had tea and cakes, and the meeting ended with prayers.

Our next meeting is on Wednesday 28th May, 2pm. Greg Anderton from Lytham Hall will be coming to talk to us about Creating Gardens. Again, anyone is welcome, but please could you let me know if you intend to come, so that we have an idea of numbers.




