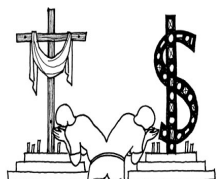

human, ⁶ who gave himself a ransom for all - this was attested at the right time. ⁷ For this I was appointed a herald and an apostle (I am telling the truth, I am not lying), a teacher of the Gentiles in faith and truth.

Give me an account of your management, because you cannot be my manager any longer."' ³ Then the manager said to himself, "What will I do, now that my master is taking the position away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. ⁴ I have decided what to do so that, when I am dismissed as manager, people may welcome me into their homes." ⁵ So, summoning his master's debtors one by one, he asked the first, "How much do you owe my master?" ⁶ He answered, "A hundred jugs of olive oil." He said to him, "Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it fifty." ⁷ Then he asked another, "And how much do you owe?" He replied, "A hundred containers of wheat." He said to him, "Take your bill and make it eighty." ⁸ And his master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly; for the children of this age are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. ⁹ And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so that when it is gone, they may welcome you into the eternal homes. ¹⁰ Whoever is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much; and whoever is dishonest in a very little is dishonest also in much. ¹¹ If then you have not been faithful with the dishonest wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? ¹² And if you have not been faithful with what belongs to another, who will give you what is your own? ¹³ No slave can serve two masters; for a slave will either hate the one and love the other, or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and *wealth'. [¹⁴Greek: mammon]

The Homily

Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed

Stand
We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, (Genuflect) was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made human. (Rise) For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, ✠ and the life of the age to come. Amen.

Pierce, O my sweet Lord Jesus,

your courts, and long to be dissolved and to be with you.

upon you, upon whom the angels desire to look, and may
my inmost soul be filled with the sweetness of your savour;

of wisdom and knowledge, the fountain of eternal light,
the torrent of pleasure, the richness of the house of God;
may it ever compass you, seek you, find you, run to you,
attain you, meditate upon you, speak of you and do all things
to the praise and glory of your name, with humility and
discretion, with love and delight, with ease and affection,
and with perseverance unto the end;

may you alone be ever my hope, my entire assistance,
my riches, my delight, my pleasure, my joy,
my rest and tranquillity, my peace, my sweetness,
my fragrance, my sweet savour, my food, my refreshment,
my refuge, my help, my wisdom, my portion, my possession
and my treasure, in whom may my mind
and my heart be fixed and firm and rooted immovably,
henceforth and forever. Amen.

Saint Bonaventure OFM, 'the Seraphic Doctor'

*Original name, Giovanni Di Fidanza, born c. 1217 in Bagnoregio, Province
of Viterbo in central Italy, died July 15, 1274 at Lyon, France.*

*Bonaventure was a leading medieval theologian, the 7th Minister General
of the Franciscan order (1257-1274), and Cardinal Bishop of Albano. He
was a close friend of the Dominican theologian, S. Thomas Aquinas OP.*

*Bonaventure was formally canonised on April 14, 1482 by the Franciscan
Pope Sixtus IV and ranked along with Thomas Aquinas as the greatest of
the Doctors of the Church by another Franciscan, Pope Sixtus V, in 1587
and became known as 'the Seraphic Doctor'. His feast day is July 15.*

*Bonaventure was regarded as one of the greatest philosophers of the
Middle Ages. His works, as arranged in the most recent Critical Edition by
the Quaracchi Fathers (Collegio S. Bonaventura), consist of a 'Commentary
on the Sentences of Lombard', in four volumes, and eight other volumes,
including a 'Commentary on the Gospel of S. Luke' and a number of
smaller works; the most famous of which are 'The Mind's Road to God'
(Itinerarium mentis in Deum), an outline of his theology or Brief Reading
(Breviloquium), 'Reduction of the Arts to Theology' (De reductione artium
ad theologiam), and 'Soliloquy on the Four Spiritual Exercises'
(Soliloquium de quatuor mentalibus exercitiis), 'The Tree of Life' (Lignum
vitae), and 'The Triple Way' (De Triplici via), the latter three written for
the spiritual direction of his fellow Franciscans. He also recodified the
constitution of his order (1260).*

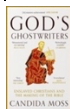

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

'The Lord loves a cheerful giver.'

The Church, based upon biblical teaching, asks every Christian to give a
 Tithe, 10% of their time, talents & money to God's work. In particular, that
 the faithful might give 5% of their Income to church where they attend.

E.g. If you earn:

£5000 a year or, £96 a week = Give £5 a week to S. Paul's.

£10000 a year, £192 a week = £10 a week.

£20000 a year, £385 a week = £20 a week.

£25000 a year, £480 a week = £25 a week.

£30000 a year, £577 a week = £30 a week.

Over the year our costs run to almost £1,000 a week. We receive no
 external subsidies, and all monies must be raised from the parishioners,
 through lettings, or voluntary donations.

Thank you for all financial contributions which help to pay for: - the:
 Utility bills of the church, (gas, electricity, water) - Costs of maintaining the
 worship, (e.g. candles, wine, wafers, incense) - Maintenance, cleaning, &
 repair of our Grade I Listed church, (substantial costs) - Office costs (e.g.
 postage, printing, paper) - Monthly Diocesan Parish Share to the Diocese,
 (80p out of every £1 we give to the Diocese goes towards clergy stipends).

**We ask everyone, who can, to please give via Direct Debit,
 Standing Order, or, via the Weekly Envelope Scheme.**
