

#### From Bishop Christopher

Our new parish priest's arrival is imminent. With excitement and anticipation – as well as some relief – we are looking forward to Keith's licensing in mid- October and to Rachel and him moving into our communities a little beforehand. We are about to begin the next phase of our mission and ministry in our villages, building on the past, for the past is never more than a guide to today and tomorrow's changing circumstances, and ready willingly to embrace new and different ways and times of worshipping, serving and reaching out to our communities. If we are genuinely excited then we must expect to be a bit unsettled and uncertain because even the best and most welcome changes come with both risk and cost.

Our waiting feels to me rather like Advent. The month before Christmas is a time of waiting and wanting with excitement for a small and humble event that carried the potential radically to change everything. I won't press the analogy too hard but perhaps you see what I mean.

A parish priest's arrival heralds a new chapter in our parishes' life and we should be open to new ideas and new ways of being the people of God, the church. We can use this month to prepare ourselves. If we didn't want anything to change we should not have asked for a new parish priest but been content to stay as we are. Keith will be commissioned to be the priest for the parishioners, all the people of the villages, and not chaplain to the congregations; his priorities will reflect that.

As we welcome Keith we express our enormous gratitude and admiration to our churchwardens and lay leaders who have supported us so well over the last eighteen months. They have been brilliant. But they, like us, cannot expect to step back in the coming months once a priest has started! It will be years – if ever - before Keith knows as many people in the communities as together we know. The outreach we seek, the growing congregations we want, depend principally on you and me inviting and encouraging our friends and neighbours.

We will mostly do this quietly and sensitively in the name of Jesus and to proclaim the Kingdom of God. That will be a great partnership of congregations and clergy, Keith and us, for our villages and for the Gospel.

#### Letter from Michael Beasley, Bishop of Bath and Wells Generosity begets generosity

In August I was privileged to dedicate the restored clock in the tower of Montacute church. It's not just any old clock. In fact, Montacute's is amongst the oldest in the country. Built in the village in around 1400, the clock is so old that it is held in place by iron wedges. At the time of its construction, the nut and the bolt wouldn't be invented for another hundred years!

The Montacute clock is an artefact that seems to generate generosity. In the 1980s the clock was restored by Humphrey Hamlin, for whom it is now named. Humphrey poured time and energy into its mechanism, preventing it from being scrapped. During the last two years, heroic efforts by the people of Montacute have led to its further restoration. All this was marked last month by a whole village gathering. The community choir sang, morris men danced, the local pub provided a hog roast, cake was dispensed in huge quantities.

Montacute is a beautiful example of how generosity begets generosity. Like a chain reaction, one act of generosity, the restoration of the clock, led to another, another and another. As a result, a whole community was brought together in celebration and joy.

In his second letter to the Church in Corinth, Paul writes of the church in Macedonia that 'their abundant joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity' (2 Cor 8:2). Having nothing, the Macedonians discovered that they could still give. In turn, their generosity enabled Paul to challenge and encourage the church in Corinth to do the same. All to help the struggling Church in Jerusalem.

As I travel around our diocese, I see this pattern of generosity begetting generosity happening in so many places. One person starts, another adds their contribution, more join in and soon we learn that together we are so much more than the sum of our parts. This is the economy of God. It's an economy that all of us are invited to join.

#### News from the Diocese



#### Bringing Somerset's waterways to life through art

An eco-arts festival celebrating the vital waterways of Somerset and the rich tapestry of plant and animal life they support took place in Shepton Mallet. Flock, a growing creative Christian community in the town, organised the event in collaboration with Somerset Wildlife Trust to highlight the importance of water ecosystems. Pioneer Priest in the Arts, Revd Gill Sakakini, said: 'At the heart of the event was the Water Life Trail, which featured 50 striking sculptures made by local artists from recycled materials.'



#### **East Mendlp Gardening Club**

September is here, and there's plenty to be done while you're outside enjoying the last of the year's warmth. Harvesting crops will keep you busy this month, and there's plenty of work to do tidying and maintaining plants and equipment.

Divide your herbaceous perennials. This will keep your plants healthy and vigorous year after year and multiply your stock.

Keep camellias and rhododendrons well watered at this time of year to ensure that next year's buds develop well.

Pinch out the tips of outdoor cordon tomato plants to concentrate the plant's energy into ripening fruits, and not producing further growth.

Help pumpkins ripen in time for Halloween by removing any leaves shading the fruits.

Raise pumpkins and squashes off the ground to prevent rotting. Place them on a piece of slate or wood.

Cut bean and pea plants away at ground level when they have finished cropping. Leave the roots, as this will slowly release nitrogen back into the soil as they break down.

Pot up some mint and parsley for the kitchen windowsill for fresh herbs through the winter.

Cover your brassicas with netting to prevent birds making a meal out of them.

Tidy up your strawberry plants and clear away any used straw, as this will harbour pests and diseases over winter. Pot up strawberry runners to make extra plants for next year.

If you haven't already, cut back the fruited canes of your summer raspberries, leaving the new green canes for next year's crop. Tie in next year's raspberry canes to support wires or fencing.

Take hardwood cuttings of currants, gooseberries and figs to increase your stock.

Order your strawberries, raspberries, currant bushes and other berry fruits for cropping next year as these plants are best planted during their dormant season.

Plant spring-flowering bulbs now, such as daffodils, crocus and hyacinths, for glorious colour next year.

Sow perennial salvias into pots and trays outdoors and leave in a cold frame or unheated greenhouse through the winter.

Sow Ammi majus 'Graceland' (Bishop's Weed) directly in the ground now where you'd like it to flower. Autumn sowing will produce bigger, more robust plants to grow.

Direct sow hardy annuals, such as cornflowers, poached egg plant, annual poppies and larkspur, for bigger plants next year.

Direct sow Love-in-a-Mist (nigella) — it will over-winter quite happily and will self-seed prolifically!

Plant hyacinth and amaryllis bulbs for forcing, to ensure a crowd of colourful blooms at Christmas. Keep them in a dark, cool place like a shed or garage and bring them indoors when the shoots are 5cm tall. Perfect for a homemade Christmas present!

Order sweet pea seeds to sow in cold frames in October.

Direct sow spinach now and offer cloche protection as the weather cools. This will ensure harvests throughout autumn and winter.

Sow corn salad (lamb's lettuce) now — it's a fully hardy crop which can be sown outdoors now for cropping throughout the autumn and winter.

Sow winter-hardy spring onions, such as 'White Lisbon' and 'Performer' for crops next spring.

Start planting garlic sets at the end of the month for cropping next year. Net ponds now before autumn leaf fall gets underway to reduce the amount of debris entering the water.

Clean out cold frames and greenhouses ahead of autumn sowing and growing.


