It was also wonderful to receive a grant towards the work of St. Matthew's Lunch Club from Lancashire & South Cumbria Integrated Care Board and Burnley Pendle & Rossendale Council for Voluntary Service. This grant will enable us to keep Lunch Club free, and will also mean we can purchase some new kitchen equipment. Thank you to Mandi Vercoe for the time and effort she put into the grant application. We continue to be in a challenging financial position as a church - meaning that every contribution is extremely important. Thank you to all of you who gave generously to our Gift Day on the 21st September.

These months whilst Fr. Alex is on Sabbatical are busy ones, so I want to thank everyone who has stepped up to take on extra responsibilities during this time. It's been lovely to welcome some visitors to our church during this time. We look forward to welcoming Rev'd. Michelle Delves on Sunday 26th October, Canon James Lawrence on Sunday 23rd November and Bishop Philip North on Sunday 30th November. We continue to pray for Fr. Alex, that this time of retreat and reflection would be nourishing, and we look forward to his return at the beginning of Advent.

Before Fr. Alex began his Sabbatical we had a clergy 'Away Day' at Shekinah Christian Centre near Newchurch-in-Pendle, when Fr. Rod led us through some reflections and discussions about healing ministry.

We spent time praying together and Fr. Alex invited Fr. Rod, Mother Enid and me to look at ways we could develop the healing ministry offered at St. Matthew's. Watch this space!

I am looking forward to celebrating Harvest Festival on Sunday 5th October. I'll also be leading celebrations with the local schools in the weeks following our service in church. We continue to partner with Burnley Community Grocery, who are extremely grateful for all the Harvest gifts they receive.

Following Harvest, we move into the season of remembrance. Our Remembrance Sunday Eucharist and Parade Service, including an Act of Remembrance at the War Memorial, will begin at 10.30am on Sunday 9th November.

#### Linda Clark brings ...... News from your Church Council

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) meets every couple of months throughout the year. As we want to try harder to keep you up to date with what has been discussed, from now onwards I shall (try to!) make a regular brief report in the magazine. Before each meeting, I shall post the agenda at the back of the church, so please look out for that and pray for us as we consider important matters. Once the minutes have been confirmed - at the following meeting – you will also find them posted in the same place.

We met in May, immediately after the APCM and one of our first actions was to confirm the vote for Treasurer (Howard Mitchell), Secretary (Linda Clark) and Lay Chair (Nigel Baldwin). At each meeting we discuss the church's financial position and any issues we face in keeping the church running. It is always a challenge to ensure that we have sufficient funds, as you can imagine. A new requirement has been received by churches to register with the Charity Commission, so the treasurer, secretary and wardens will be meeting to complete that on your behalf.

One major item which we discussed (and continue to do so) is the potential application to Blackburn Diocese for funding a Pioneer post which would help to build on and continue the sterling work of Revd. Kat in her community outreach role. The PCC would greatly appreciate your ongoing prayers for this, as it is a major concern. Thank you.

At each meeting we consider Safeguarding issues – this is extremely important for us as a church. While we cannot report on any individual issues, be assured that all PCC members and volunteers working with vulnerable adults take the training and guidance very seriously.

Other issues discussed in May were improving our communications, streamlining the church accounts and moving forward on St. Matthew's becoming more environmentally aware and eco-friendly – which will be led by Barbara Baldwin as she finishes her ALM accreditation in this subject.

If you have any matters that you want the PCC to discuss, please let me know. Until the next time!

#### Fr. Rod writes ... Journeying in Health and Healing

At St. Matthew's we reach out with care and support to all in need. Week by week in our intercessions in public worship we pray for people who are struggling with health issues. Week by week, through pastoral care, both formal and informal, we offer the touch of Jesus, the good shepherd who cares for his sheep. Our inclusive church principles help us to offer welcome and hospitality to all we come into contact with.

Recently St. Matthew's clergy spent half a day exploring how the ministry of healing could be developed from these foundations; Fr. Alex has asked us to continue this journey during his Sabbatical. To help us do so, we will celebrate the ministry of St. Luke the Evangelist on Sunday, 19th October. Luke was a doctor as well as the author both of the gospel which bears his name and the Acts of the Apostles. The sermon that day will focus on Jesus' call to his disciples to be a community of healers, who extend the touch of Jesus through word, sacrament and prayer.

The explorations in prayer will continue through our Parish Prayers which will for the next couple of months take place on Thursday evenings at 7pm. We realise that many have deep questions about health, wholeness and healing, and so we will offer a couple of opportunities after these prayer meetings to explore what the Church of England teaches about the healing ministry, to outline the principles of safeguarding and good practice which surround the offering of this ministry, and to introduce some of the healing material found in Church of England liturgies. All are welcome to these conversations – whether curious, sceptical or intrigued. Look out for further details in the Sunday notices and via our other communication platforms.

As clergy, we want you to know that prayer for healing and wholeness is always available to those who ask, and that an opportunity will be available from early October, after each Friday morning Eucharist, for any who wish to receive prayer with the laying on of hands, or anointing for healing (or both).

#### Creation Care Co-ordinator Barbara writes ...

I've recently been authorised, at the Cathedral, as St. Matthew's Creation Care co-ordinator! 'Co-ordinator' is the word - I'm here to help <u>you all</u> to Care for Creation: the earth was created by God and caring for it is everyone's responsibility. We're all aware of ways in which we human beings are damaging it, and all other living things, by not sharing it equally, through over-exploitation of its resources and by spending more money on war than on working for peace. We've reached the stage now that our climate is being permanently changed by our selfish behaviour.

My first task after completing the Creation Care course has been to complete the Eco Church online survey, and by answering truthfully about what we are currently doing, and making several commitments to things we realistically can do in the next year, I am pleased to say we have qualified for the Bronze Award.

A requirement of the Award was a commitment to celebrate 'Creation Season'. If you've never heard of this, don't be surprised, as it's the first time it's been celebrated at St Matthew's: it's quite a new idea, especially in the Church of England. The Season runs for the whole of September, which fits in nicely with celebrating Harvest Thanksgiving on the first Sunday in October.

**Ken Spencer**, local historian and good friend to St. Matthew's, has drawn our attention to the death, on 1<sup>st</sup> July, of stained glass artist **Sir Brian Clarke**.

Sir Brian was born in Oldham in 1953, and always maintained that his art was created for working-class people like himself. He was first drawn to stained glass by a childhood visit to York Minister, when he was so overwhelmed by the effect of light through the 15<sup>th</sup> century east window that he fainted! His second influence was the punk movement, and he re-invented stained glass for this generation, using a method which allowed him to create large-scale works without the need for supporting leadwork.

At 13, he became a full-time scholarship pupil at Oldham School of Art, where he was regarded as a prodigy; but when he and his family moved to Burnley he found that, at 15, he was too young to gain entrance to Burnley College of Art: he lied about his age and was accepted on the strength of his previous work! At 17, he began a course in architectural stained glass at North Devon College of Art and Design. During a trip across Europe to study religious art, he was drawn to the work of Germany's post-war stained glass artists, and his own first major work, in 1975 - at the age of only 22 - was a set of 20 windows for St. Lawrence's Church, Longridge. Probably the nearest work to us is his 1976 east window in All Saints', Habergham.

However, work for the Church of England came to an abrupt end in 1978 when he publicly condemned what he considered the architecturally unsympathetic restoration of St. Gabriel's Church, at Brownhill, Blackburn, which affected - amongst other things - windows which he had designed.

Over a 50-year career, his output also included sculpture, painting and mosaics - and stage designs for two of his friend Paul McCartney's world tours. But his major works include the Holocaust Memorial Synagogue in Darmstadt and the Royal Mosque at King Khaled International Airport in Riyadh. His last work, in 2024, was stained glass windows for the new extension to Westminster Coroner's Court, which he said were not to give people an artistic ecstasy, but to say 'I am with you', 'I know what you're going through', to put an arm around people's shoulders.

Why might our readers be interested in Sir Brian? In 1972, at St. Matthew's, he married Elizabeth (Liz) Finch, daughter of our Vicar, the Rev'd. John Finch.

If we raise some money for the church funds or a specific purpose it is a bonus which is ranked second to the success of each event.

#### THANK YOU FOR YOUR CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP

Christian Stewardship is not a programme, nor is it about raising money. Instead, it is part of our life-long discipleship journey. Stewardship is a way of life in which we regard ourselves and our possessions as being held in trust from God, to be used for His service. God has made us His stewards or managers of everything that He has given to us: our time, our abilities, our possessions, our money, our whole lives!

Stewardship for Christians is not about giving money so that the church can "make ends meet" but rather acknowledging how generously God has given to us and then generously giving back to God and seeing His church grow.

#### JOYFUL GENEROUS STEWARDS

The Diocesan Vision 2026 calls us to give generously of our time, talents and money to the cause of Christ. We really value the time that you give to our vibrant Parish life, the time that you devote to prayer and exploring the bible and to sharing worship and the celebration of Holy Communion. We admire your many wonderful talents such as singing, baking and flower-arranging plus the equally vital ability to make our buildings clean and tidy or change a light bulb and top up the supply of loo rolls! We also value your generous donations to the cost of running our busy Parish. We sincerely hope that you give joyfully in the knowledge that you are giving generously to enable the work of God to flourish in our Parish.

As disciples, our giving is a sincere way of showing our love for God and an expression of our thanks for His endless care and generosity. Please remember that God gave His only Son that we might live.

We all give presents joyfully and generously to our families and friends at Christmas and birthdays so we hope that you will give joyfully and generously to God's work here at St Matthew's.

#### THANK YOU FOR YOUR GENEROUS REGULAR GIVING

We also thank everyone who generously contributes to the cost of running our church by weekly envelopes, monthly standing orders or simply cash on the collection plates. It really is your church, as we receive no funding from the government and we need to be self-financing so we are very grateful for all contributions — no matter how small or large. As well as paying for insurance, heating, lighting and other running costs, we need to pay our Parish Share to the Diocese so that we may be eligible to request a Priest of our choice and benefit from their administrative and financial support. (It is worth noting that many churches need to share their vicar with other churches or experience a long wait for a new vicar.)

#### THE PARISH SHARE

What exactly is the Parish Share? Where does the money go; how is it spent and what impact does it make?

The Diocese explains: "We would like to say a big 'thank you' for your contributions to Parish Share. We're really grateful for your generosity and for all you do in the service of Jesus Christ in our communities across the Lancashire area. The vast majority of these contributions come back to parishes to keep the ministries of our churches running. We believe that stipendiary clergy are a critical part of the ministry of the Church in Lancashire and our commitment to maintain clergy numbers at their current level is only possible because of your generosity.

The Diocese of Blackburn is made up of 231 parishes with 272 churches, serving a population of around 1.4 million people. We are all part of one Diocese and, brought together, our Parish Share contributions help us to foster healthy churches that, in turn, transform communities across Lancashire. So let's take a look at where the money goes; how it is spent and the impact it makes.

The first bit of good news is that most of the money you contribute comes back to you in one form or another: as ministry, services and support. Every parish gives, and every parish receives. The largest portion of Parish Share, around

70%, is allocated to parish ministry. This includes placing priests in every benefice. It also covers stipends, pensions, clergy housing and training for current and future clergy.

As a type of charity, it's important we have robust administrative and governance processes that are transparent and efficient. We manage to do this for less than 1% of share contributions. Five per cent goes to the national church, including contributions to retired clergy housing and national training. Another 5% is used to support our churches through investment in community projects, mission, outreach and initiatives for children and young people. This includes clergy study days, Diocesan Conferences and much more. And a further 5% is dedicated to lay ministry and formation, including training, from which so many of our churches benefit.

Around 10% of the funds support the work of 'enabler teams' at the Diocesan Offices who keep everything running smoothly, including safeguarding, property management, communications, HR, stewardship, accounting support and some support for Whalley Abbey. People sometimes think we get money from the government but, just to be clear, we really don't!

And while we are dispelling myths, contrary to what some people think your Parish Share does not pay for anything at our Cathedral in Blackburn. All Church of England cathedrals are structurally independent from dioceses and they receive a limited amount of direct funding from the Church Commissioners.

While we can (and do) secure funding from the national church for specific projects, the money from these rigorously assessed bids can only be used for the projects it is allocated to.

For everything else the responsibility rests with us collectively as a Diocese, through Parish Share contributions. In fact, the majority of our income comes from parishes. The balance of our income is made up of rents, grants for specific work and projects, and interest and dividends on our investments. Thank you for being a beacon of hope in Lancashire and making a lasting impact on the communities we serve in the County; it's your generosity that makes the difference!"

St Matthew's has always managed to pay its Parish Share and a Diocesan Certificate is proudly displayed in the Narthex. We hope and pray that we will be able to continue to do so.
