
CLOVERFIELD NEWS



As you tidy your garden for winter...



Gardens are preparing to go to sleep, but next Spring will soon be here. So why not consider some changes now:

- ~ Install a water butt now, to store up the winter rain for the Spring.
- ~ Reduce the hard standing in your garden. Instead, let rain soak into the soil, rather than go down a drain.
- ~ Plant something tall to create shade in your garden next year the soil will remain wetter.
- ~ Put in more plants the more you have, the more protection they give the ground. Try to use native species, as your local wildlife depends on them.
- ~ Consider adding a pond it will be a great boost to your local wildlife!



Being a pastor in the Ukraine

Pastor Evgeniy continues to minister in the war-torn Kherson region of Ukraine bringing comfort, hope and food to their beleaguered

congregations in the most frightening and desperate war-torn situations.



Evgeniy and his team, wearing bright, civilian clothing, chosen to identify them as volunteers, not military, came recently to a village that had been shelled. They dug through rubble, searching for survivors.

40 minutes later a reconnaissance drone circled above them ominously. Then came a different sound — sharper, lower, and closer. A small military drone headed straight for them. In a moment that could only be described as divine intervention, it clipped a tree branch and crashed to the ground.

Minutes later, a second drone appeared aiming for the fallen drone, possibly to trigger an explosion by striking the first. But it too missed its target—crashing about six meters from the car. No one was injured.

But they were under attack. They gathered their tools, helped the survivors into the vehicle, and drove away. Just seconds after they left, a third drone struck — right where their car had been parked. The resulting explosion could have easily taken their lives. But once again, by what they all believe was God's hand, they were spared.

Reflecting on the events, Pastor Evgeniy was asked if he ever felt hatred or the desire for revenge. His answer was quiet, but unshakable. 'No. I just understand. I understand the pain. I understand the fear. But if we don't bring light into this darkness, who will?'

For Evgeniy, war is not a reason to harden the heart—it's a call to deeper compassion. Even as drones fly overhead and homes crumble, he continues his ministry, bringing food, prayer, and humanity into places others flee from.

This is what faith looks like in the ruins. It looks like a small group in bright vests, carrying hope into danger. It looks like a pastor who chooses grace over vengeance. And it looks like a God who protects, even when the bombs fall close.

Since the talks involving the US and a possible ceasefire, the local leaders testify that instead of de-escalation, they've experienced a significant rise in attacks and shelling.

Transform Europe Network (TEN) asks Christians in the UK:

Please pray for pastors and church teams, exhausted by serving many people on the frontline.

Pray for those who are confused, discouraged and angry, even with each other. Pray for healing and comfort from the Holy Spirit. Churches in Ukraine do all they can to reconcile local people, but it is getting harder and harder.

Mothers are afraid that their teenage sons will be taken away for conscription, which has become increasingly aggressive. This also causes men to run away from home and so many families are fractured and deeply stressed as the war grinds on.

The Poppy is a powerful symbol worn by people right across the UK to

commemorate the sacrifices of our Armed Forces and to show support to those still serving today.

The Royal British Legion was first set up to help those returning from the First World War. Almost a century on, they're still helping today's Service people, veterans, and their families coping with bereavement, living with disability or finding employment.

However, it would not be able to continue without the dedicated teams of volunteers who stand in the streets, shops and supermarkets.

I enjoy a good harvest lunch. We used to have really good ones in the parish, and it brought out people who were not regular church goers but occasional attenders, mainly when food was on the table. I like a buffet because you can choose what you want and how much of it, and if you are clever, you can get two helpings.

My advice is let the polite people go first, as they eat little and then go for it when most people have had their fill. No! don't be greedy but do tuck in and make sure you help others.

God invites us to a banquet where there is plenty to eat for everyone and it is for us to makes sure all have their fill.

All in the month of October...

125 years ago, on 20th **Oct 1900** American aviation pioneers the Wright Brothers made their first glider flight at Kill Devil Hills, in North Carolina.

100 years ago, on 13th Oct 1925 Margaret Thatcher, Baroness Thatcher, was born. She was the first woman Prime Minister of Britain (1979-90).

90 years ago, on 12th Oct 1935 Luciano Pavorotti, Italian operatic tenor, was born. Considered one of the finest tenors of the 20th century, and one of the most commercially successful of all time. (Died 2007.)

80 years ago, on 12th Oct 1945 US Army combat medic Desmond Doss became the first conscientious objector in US history to receive a Medal of Honour for heroic actions. He saved the lives of 75 men during the Battle of Okinawa. The film *Hacksaw Ridge* told his story.

65 years ago, on 12th Oct 1960, at the UN General Assembly in New York, the Soviet leader Nikita Khrushchev is reported to have removed his shoe and pounded his table, in protest at a speech by another delegate.

65 years ago, on 30th **Oct 1965** Diego Maradona was born. The Argentine football player, manager and coach is regarded as one of the greatest football players in history. (Died 2020.)

60 years ago, on 8th Oct 1965 the Post Office Tower (now the BT Tower) in London was officially opened. It was the tallest building in the UK until 1980.

40 years ago, on 1st **Oct 1985** riots broke out in Toxteth in Liverpool and Peckham in London. Five days later (6th Oct) Met Police Constable Keith Blacklock was killed in the Broadwater Farm housing estate riot in Tottenham - the first British constable to be killed in a riot since 1833.

20 years ago, on 3rd Oct 2005 Ronnie Barker, TV comedian, actor and writer, died. Known for *The Frost Report, The Two Ronnies, Porridge, Going Straight* and *Open All Hours*.

15 years ago, on 13th **Oct 2010** 33 Chilean miners who had been trapped underground for 69 days following the collapse of the San Jose copper-gold mine were rescued. Around one billion TV viewers around the world watched them being pulled to the surface one-by-one, in a specially designed capsule.

Surge in violent attacks on A&E nurses

18th October is the feast day of St Luke, who is the patron saint of physicians. So this is a good month to pray for those in the NHS...



A&E nurses face an increasing barrage of punches, kicks and spitting - and having weapons aimed at them. One was even threatened with acid.

The violence has been blamed on enforced long waits in A&E departments, corridor care, and chronic staffing problems.

The Royal College of Nursing report that the number of attacks has doubled in five years, from 2093 cases in 2019, to 4054 in 2024.

One senior charge nurse in the East Midlands said: "Even patients you would expect to be placid are becoming irate because of just how long they have to wait. So, you can only imagine the behaviour of those who are already prone to violence." She herself has been punched in the face by a "drunken six-foot-two bloke."

A senior sister in East London was knocked unconscious after being punched in the head by a patient. "The violence is awful," she said. "And it's just constant. Nurses, doctors, receptionists – none of us feels safe."

Another nurse said: "It's not going to help with our retention and recruitment if you think you're going to be clobbered every shift."

The RCN warns that such attacks lead to both physical and mental scarring, lengthy time off and sometimes staff never returning

Plastic carrier bags

This year marks ten years since England introduced the 5p charge for single-use plastic carrier bags.

The charge has had a dramatic effect – with a reduction of 98% in sales.

The average person in the UK now buys only about two single-use plastic bags per year.



The Iron Lady of Britain



One hundred years ago, on 13th October 1925, Margaret Thatcher, Baroness Thatcher of Kesteven, was born. She was the first woman Prime Minister of Britain (1979-90).

Her father, Alfred Roberts, was a grocer and Methodist local preacher in Grantham, and she was brought up as a strict Wesleyan Methodist. At one point just before the Second World War, the family gave sanctuary to a young Jewish girl who had escaped the Nazis.

Margaret later became a lay preacher herself, and was married at Wesley's Chapel in City Road, London, where her children were baptised. Afterwards she and her husband Denis (later Sir Denis) attended Church of England services and became Anglicans. She felt her policies as a Conservative aligned closely with Christianity.

She was the longest-serving Prime Minister of the 20th century and, partly because of her resilience, aroused strong feelings both for and against, having to weather difficulties and misjudgements, such as the poll tax. Those opposing her described her policies as 'Thatcherism', but others put a positive slant on this. Her nickname of Iron Lady – first used by a Soviet journalist – aptly described her leadership style and lack of compromise.

Before becoming Prime Minister, she had studied chemistry at Oxford, and then the law, qualifying as a barrister. She became an MP – for Finchley – in 1959 and progressed to Secretary of State for Education and Science before defeating Edward Heath in the 1975 Tory leadership election, making her leader of the Opposition and the first woman to lead a major UK political party.

When she arrived at Downing Street, she adapted a prayer of St Francis beginning "Where there is discord, may we bring harmony". She died from a stroke while staying at the Ritz Hotel in London in 2013 at the age of 87, having been unwell for some years.


