Dear Supporters

We were welcomed back warmly by all who joined us today. Members were keen to pass on their news and stay and chat in the tea and coffee area. Sixty-one couples/families and 42

single people attended the Food Co-op to choose and collect food (152 adults and 112 children). All members were well supported by the 16 volunteers who came throughout the morning. They all have specific responsibilities, but will willingly act as translators and take on a variety of tasks including cleaning and hoovering at the end of the session.

Donations were received from several local churches, Food Waste Champions and individual supporters, including fresh vegetables from allotment gardens. The allocation from Fareshare included carrots, potatoes, spring onions and cabbages which meant that all members left with fresh fruit and vegetables, despite the high numbers. Thank you for all these donations that enable us to continue to provide food for people in need in our community. It is very much appreciated by members and volunteers. Thank you.
