

FROM THE VICARAGE

Dear friends,

As the nights draw in and autumn deepens, October brings with it the season of Hallowe'en. For many today, it is seen as a time for costumes, pumpkins, and trick-or-treating. But at its heart, Hallowe'en has Christian roots worth rediscovering – far from being a celebration of the spooky ghoulies and ghosts, Hallowe'en is a time for us to celebrate God's great gift to us – eternal life with the saints.



The very name *Hallowe'en* comes from "All Hallows' Eve" – the evening before All Saints' Day when the Church celebrates all the holy men and women who have gone before us in faith. This was followed by All Souls' Day when we remember before God all those we love but see no longer. Far from being a celebration of darkness or fear, the festival was originally about giving thanks for the great cloud of witnesses who have shone with Christ's light and about trusting God with those who rest in His care.

This year at St Mary's our All Souls service will be on Saturday 1st November at 3pm and our All Saints Celebration will be at 10am on Sunday 2nd November.

This time of year also marks the drawing in of the long winter nights, and the colder weather returning. As Christians, we are not called to hide from the darkness, but to shine light into it. Jesus said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life" (John 8:12). So, we mustn't feel that the end of the summer marks the end of our joyful worship – that continues all year long here at St Mary's!

There is something especially joyful about autumn days: the sound of crunchy leaves underfoot, the beautiful colours created by our many trees in West Moors, and the simple pleasure of returning home to warmth after a chilly walk. It is a season that invites us to slow down, gather in, and enjoy a sense of cosiness and contentment – a reminder that God's creation has its rhythms, and that rest and reflection are as much a part of life as growth and harvest.


On the subject of Harvest, we give thanks for all of the donations and support that we received at our Harvest Festival from St Mary's school, St Martin's URC and the congregation here. All donations will be split between the Sharing Shed and the Castleman Community Larder.

I am delighted that our Sharing Shed is continuing to make such a difference. Each week, people from our community place tins, jars, and fresh produce on its shelves, and each week, those who need them most come and take what helps them get by. It is Harvest lived out in miniature: those with a little extra leaving it for those who are in need. Thank you to all who give so faithfully!






AFTERNOON TEA VOLUNTEERS PLEASE


