The Word of God

Psalm I

¹Blessed are they who have not walked in the counsel of the wicked, ◆ nor lingered in the way of sinners, nor sat in the assembly of the scornful.

²Their delight is in the law of the Lord ♦ and they meditate on his law day and night.

³Like a tree planted by streams of water bearing fruit in due season, with leaves that do not wither, ◆ whatever they do, it shall prosper.

⁴As for the wicked, it is not so with them; ♦ they are like chaff which the wind blows away.

⁵Therefore the wicked shall not be able to stand in the judgement, ◆ nor the sinner in the congregation of the righteous.

⁶For the Lord knows the way of the righteous, ♦ but the way of the wicked shall perish.

First Reading: Deuteronomy 30:15-20

¹⁵See, I have set before you today life and prosperity, death and adversity. ¹⁶If you obey the commandments of the LORD your God that I am commanding you today, by loving the LORD your God, walking in his ways, and observing his commandments, decrees, and ordinances, then you shall live and become numerous, and the LORD your God will bless you in the land that you are entering to possess. ¹⁷But if your heart turns away and you do not hear, but are led astray to bow down to other gods and serve them, ¹⁸I declare to you today that you shall perish; you shall not live long in the land that you are crossing the Jordan to enter and possess. ¹⁹I call heaven and earth to witness against you today that I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Choose life so that you and your descendants may live, ²⁰loving the LORD your God, obeying him, and holding fast to him; for that means life to you and length of days, so that you may live in the land that the LORD swore to give to your ancestors, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob.

Second Reading: Luke 14:25-33

²⁵Large crowds were travelling with Jesus; and he turned and said to them, ²⁶ Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple. ²⁷ Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. ²⁸ For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it? ²⁹ Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it will begin to ridicule him, ³⁰ saying, "This fellow began to build and was not able to finish." ³¹ Or what king, going out to wage war against another king, will not sit down first and consider whether he is able with ten thousand to oppose the one who comes against him with twenty thousand? ³² If he cannot, then, while the other is still far away, he sends a delegation and asks for the terms of peace. ³³ So therefore, none of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions.'

We pray for the lonely, unloved or despairing, for . . . Loving God, help us to be prepared to befriend them, that through us they might experience your arms around them.

Fill us with your Holy Spirit, so that: when we pray for forgiveness we may be ready to forgive; when we pray to know your saving love we may be ready to take up our cross; when we pray for eternal life we may be ready to give our lives to you.

God of wisdom and generosity, open our eyes to see the cost of the things we pray for; and open our hearts to make us willing to pay that cost.

In the name of your Son, Jesus Christ, who laid down his life for his friends. **Amen.**

Collect

God of constant mercy, who sent your Son to save us: remind us of your goodness, increase your grace within us, that our thankfulness may grow, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**
