the challenge And is growing with:

- More vulnerable people susceptible to false promises
- Increasingly flexible working arrangements which gives space for criminal agencies to provide goods and services based on exploitation and slave labour
- Police and prevention resources being ever overstretched
- And our own insatiable appetite for cheap products

There is much we need to learn to oppose and abolish.



But. facing these almost overwhelming challenges we must not neglect what is primary for our Christian witness, the call to notice, reach out, rescue and restore. The call to For or love, to be for those who are hidden. against: neglected, hurting

and ignored.



Help with The Beacon

I have been the Editor of first the Excalibur and now The Beacon magazines for the last twenty-five years. I have enjoyed the role tremendously - and I hope you have found the end result worth reading.

Unfortunately, all things must come to an end and the administrative demands on the Parish Administrator have increased significantly the last couple of years. The number of weddings in St Michael's as a result of the wedding venue at North Cadbury Court - with all the complications of couples who live outside the parish - is one factor and taking on other roles, such

as the Parish Safeguarding Officer, which requires much more attention, is another.

As a result I no longer have the time needed to spend editing the magazine as part of my role as the parish administrator and so we are looking for a volunteer to take this on.

The volunteer editor will need to be computer literate and have publishing software capable of producing a 32 page magazine. Ideally, this would be Microsoft Publisher - and we may be able to supply a copy if needed.

The editor needs to take items for the magazine (deadline the 15th) and put these into the template provided by the previous month's magazine in time for printing in the Parish Office during the last week of the month. We will provide sources of material to fill any spaces in the magazine.

Editing is a regular commitment each month (except December) that takes on average 10-15 hours a month (depending on how familiar you are with the process).

If you would be interested in this role, please contact the Parish Administrator for more information (contact details on page 2).

It would also be helpful to have an advertising editor, who can send reminders to advertisers when their adverts are due to be renewed and can deal with requests for advertising before sending the adverts to the editor for inclusion.

Finally, it would be very helpful to have someone willing to assist with the printing of the magazine. Someone willing to learn how to operate the photocopier, setting it going and replacing paper, toner and staples as needed. Operation is straightforward as the magazine is stored electronically on the photocopier.



What Endures?

From our holiday cottage on the Northumbrian coast we could see the dramatic ruins of Dunstanburgh Castle. 600 years ago John of Gaunt, Duke of Lancaster, built Dunstanburgh, and Henry Percy, Earl of Northumberland, built nearby Warkworth Castle. These strongholds were built not only for defence, but as statements of the wealth and power of their owners. Today they are both ruins, though being rescued from further decay by English Heritage.

We visited both castles, and also some local village churches. We found that many of these have some stonework that is 900-1100 years old, from just before or 100 years after the battle of Hastings in 1066. Some can trace even earlier foundations, built in the 7th and 8th centuries when Christianity was new to this area. To pray and worship where Christians have worshipped regularly for over 1400 years is a tremendous privilege. Over those centuries the buildings have decayed, and been rebuilt or extended at various times: they are an architectural hotch-potch. Most are small, unlike the huge castles, but through the centuries they have been a

place of faithful witness at the heart of their communities. They have remained, and changed, through the good times and the bad – enduring symbols of God's kingdom rather than the transient earthly power symbolised by the castles.

Many of the churches were open, welcoming visitors. As well as details of their architecture and history, many offered invitations or encouragements to prayer and spirituality: a prayer walk around the church; prayer corners, for specific requests; an icon or statue as a focus for prayer. Votive candles are risky in an empty church, but one had provided a deep glass bowl, three quarters filled with water, and two glasses with 'fish tank' gravel in them. Visitors were invited to choose a gravel chip to represent someone or something they wished to bring before God, and to drop it gently in the water as a symbol of the person or problem being immersed in God's all-embracing love. Some of these aids to prayer would be unfamiliar to pilgrims of old. This is today's church reaching out to people in ways that may be relevant to them, so that they may respond to the God they many not yet know.

INTERVIEW - If it looks wrong ...

John Dickinson is a Trustee at Sparrows Project which raises awareness of modern-day slavery locally and to provides support to survivors.



Many people think slavery doesn't happen in places like Bath and Wells. Is that right?

That isn't the case at all. Somerset and the south west may look peaceful, but slavery happens here just as it does in cities. The countryside looks soft and safe, so it's hard for people to imagine. But it does take place.

Who are the people being exploited?

It's often the most vulnerable. Many assume it's mainly people from overseas, but the largest group on the government's support scheme are UK nationals. Vulnerabilities such as homelessness, drug abuse, and family breakdowns, are exploited.

How can we spot if slavery might be happening locally?

There are no definitive signs, but there are indicators. Our view is: if it looks wrong, it probably is wrong.

Where is it happening?

We see abuse in nail bars, car washes, and the construction industry. Pop-up

brothels are another issue, particularly around the Hinkley area. And increasingly, we're seeing exploitation in the care sector.

Why is the care sector such a concern?

There are over 130,000 vacancies in the care sector, and traffickers know this. People are being brought in, particularly from abroad, to fill the gap. Many of them end up trapped and exploited. It's a hidden crisis.

What can people or communities do?

Churches and communities can play a big role. Many parishioners either live in care homes or work in them, so they're in a position to notice the signs. The key is not to close your eyes, think "if it looks wrong, it probably is wrong."



Lord's Prayer top of the recognisable quotes

"Give us this day our daily bread" topped a poll for the most recognisable words in the UK narrowly beating "May the force be with you" from the Star Wars films. "Give us this day our daily bread" was recognised as coming from the Lord's Prayer by 80.3% of the 2,000 people polled. Surprisingly 89% of people said that they had prayed The Lord's Prayer at some point, including 88% of those who claimed they have no religion.

The Most Revd Stephen Cottrell, Archbishop of York, explained that the meaning is actually quite challenging, meaning 'give me what I need for today and stop me wanting more than my fair share' and that 'The whole human race urgently needs to learn what 'enough' looks like: so that the world is fed, but also in order for the planet to be saved'.

Other quotes included in the survey included Churchill's "Never in the field of human conflict was so much owed by so many to so few"; "It was the best of times, it was the worst of times" from A Tale of Two Cities by Charles Dickens; "You'll never walk alone" from the Rodgers and Hammerstein song popularised by Gerry and the Pacemakers and sung by Liverpool football fans; "Happy and glorious, long to reign over us" from the National anthem and "to be or not to be" from Shakespeare's Hamlet.

The polling was done by Thy Kingdom Come, a global ecumenical prayer movement.


