Having just binned 150 old sermons I found myself wondering if anything I had said in ANY of them had been of the slightest use! From the pulpit you notice the "glazed eyes".

There's a wonderful description of the dire effect of bad preaching which has long haunted me. It comes from Trollope's Barchester Towers and is a diatribe of the odious Mr Slope - chaplain to the Bishop of Barchester. "There is he writes "perhaps no greater hardship inflicted on humankind than the requirement of listening to sermons! No one but a preaching clergyman has the power to compel an audience to sit in silence and to be tortured. No one can rid himself of the preaching clergyman.... We are not forced to come to Church. No! But we desire more than this. We desire not to be forced away...... We desire to be allowed to leave the House of God without that anxious longing for escape which is the common consequence of common Sermons " Wow!

What follows in the rest of this letter is a personal memorandum to myself mainly scribbled some sixty two years ago when as a student at Theological College each of us had to endure the ordeal of preaching to the College Community, then having the content of what we had said analysed by our colleagues. Certainly it was one of the most painful experiences of my life. Here it is, written not as a formal piece but as a number of comments jotted down at the time, and in no particular order. See what you think.

- The purpose of preaching is to encourage and to affirm people everywhere in the basic Christian belief that that every one of us is deeply loved and needed by God. And this regardless of who we are, whatever we've done or failed do. Whatever we believe or can't.
- Always remember that simple as this message may be, Faith in general and God in particular are mysteries deeper than we can ever explain or understand. Problems like suffering, evil, injustice will never be solved Don't therefore peddle easy answers. There are none. Even on the Cross Jesus screamed at God "WHY"?
- Each of us will experience God in our own way, living with doubt, anger, despair. So always be humble and sensitive in what you say. Many of those to whom you are speaking are likely to be miles further down their spiritual road than you, and may have suffered more than you can ever imagine.
- Don't try to be clever, witty or amusing. Preaching is about God not about you, however clever or saintly you may think yourself to be. Just as a good leader of worship aims to make himself or herself invisible, so will a good preacher.
- Learn (like Our Lord) to use stories from everyday life to make the Point you are trying to make. Stories which those listening can make their own, take away and think about later. Phrases like "I have found this helps me" can often be useful. It makes the point that you have problems too.
- Except on special occasions try not to speak for more than a maximum of 8 minutes. Not only does this demand of you discipline, but it helps to maintain the right liturgical balance in a service between a sermon and the prayers, the worship, the readings and the hymns.
- Prepare prayerfully always before you climb into the pulpit. Preaching is not easy (if you find it so you probably shouldn't be doing it). Sunday by Sunday and often to the same congregation is demanding. You will have days when it goes well. Days when it doesn't. It's the same in every walk of life. Just say your prayers, have one simple message you want to get across and hand it over to God. Helpful sermons may be so because the priest knows his flock and they know him. It is within the confidence of shared love and service that sometimes communication best takes place. End of my scribbles!

If I had remembered all that I suppose there's a chance that at least one of those 150 sermons may have been helpful. Even that some kind folk returned for a second visit!
