#### **Thought for the Month**

Although the meteorological autumn officially begins on 1st September, most of us probably think of autumn as beginning in earnest in October. Of course, this year, because it has been so dry, many trees started to lose their leaves much earlier than usual and we might already have found ourselves tramping through piles of leaves in September, or even late August.

Although there's no denying that the summer is over by the time we get to October, autumn has its compensations, particularly the beautiful colour of the leaves - the reds, the yellows and the various shades of orange and brown, as well as the vibrant autumn berries.

Change is part of life for all of us, whether it be a change in the seasons or change in our health or personal circumstances. Many of you will be familiar with the works of Patience Strong. Patience Strong was the pen name of Winifred Emma May (4 June 1907 - 28 August 1990). As well as writing many poems and short reflections she was also apparently a successful lyricist, composing English words for the tango "Jealousy" and "The Dream of Olwen", and an author of several books dealing with Christianity and practical psychology.



This is what Patience Strong had to say about change:

Changes come - it's Life - things cannot always be the same. Conditions alter - otherwise, life would seem very tame. So when there's an upheaval, don't resist the circumstances. Accept it - make the best of it - it's all a game of chance. But change is good for us sometimes, for we get in a rut. Our roots may be a long way down, but they must be cut. Move on and welcome changes, and no doubt, in time you'll see - the change you dreaded was a God-sent opportunity. For only outward things will change - the real things always stand, though life seems all confusion with distress on every hand. The inner things remain - our principles, our faith, our love, the confidence that we have placed in that great Power above. The secret places of the heart will always be secure - invincible and changeless, for the word of God is

We need to look for God in every season, every situation, every change in our lives. And if we look for him, we are more likely to find him!

#### A Canticle of Creation

Each year on 4<sup>th</sup> October, the Church remembers St Francis of Assisi. In art, he is often shown surrounded by birds and animals. St. Francis of Assisi viewed all of creation—people, animals, plants, and even inanimate objects—as a gift from a loving God, a reflection of His presence, and worthy of deep respect and care. He famously penned "The Canticle of the Creatures," a hymn of praise to God through all elements of nature, which he saw as his family and a mirror of God's goodness. This reverence led him to treat all beings as sisters and brothers, emphasizing a compassionate, interconnected relationship with the entire created world.

William Henry Draper, based his beautiful hymn "All Creatures of Our God and King," on the poem by St. Francis. It was first published in a hymn book in 1919.

...because they created the first powered plane and I would love to know how it was done. Jackson, *Year 6* 


#### **Book Review**


