Dear friends

This Sunday is the 13th after Trinity, Holy Cross Day and Education Sunday: so much to reflect upon, and that can be said in response to the various readings.

What struck me today are some of the words in the opening collect- 'you search us and you know us, may we rely on you in strength and rest on you in weakness.'

Words that indicate that we not only know our need of God, but that he knows us and we depend entirely upon him for our future.

Throughout our lives we experience relative times of strength and weakness. As we move through life, we move from being completely dependent upon our mother at birth as a vulnerable baby. Through loving, nurture and encouragement we grow to wanting to step

out and find our own way in life which can mean leaving the familiar family and fold, seeking out a new life for ourselves.

This was true in both of our readings today. The son and the sheep both left the familiarity of the fold to seek more exciting living; the world beckons, the grass can always seem 'greener on the other side'. We each stray from the fold and go our own way. I believe this is true of individuals but also of organisations, communities, nations.

Our God is a God of peace, justice and truth, love and forgiveness. It is only in the love of God that we will find true life, life in all its fullness. It is in trusting in him that we will find our way in life for he will make our paths straight. He asks us to follow him and he will guide us, lead us and provide for us. This does not mean that there will not be rockfalls, pot holes, distractions and barriers on our journey. At times we will wander off or even deliberately go in the opposite direction sometimes causing anguish and creating division, not only between those we love, but also with those who we are called to live with, who may be very different to ourselves.

Yet we are each made in his own image and called to be a reflection of that love which shines in the darkness. It is only in relationship with God that we can do that; the God who knows us better than we know ourselves and is always willing to receive us and forgive us when we come to him in faith.

Our families, our communities, our nations are in need of his compassionate love and forgiveness. Where we fail he never does, so may we ever be dependent upon him, 'may we rely upon him in strength and rest upon him in weakness', that this world may know peace and reconciliation.




