



But no. Abraham went as he was told.


As far as I can remember, the only prophet whom God called who actually protested on account of his age was Jeremiah and that was to object that he was too young.

Churchwarden's Letter

"May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude of mind towards each other that Christ Jesus had" [Romans 15:5]

You may have noticed that the church floodlights look a little brighter at night. This is because the church has installed new LED lights to our outdoor floodlights and our Vestry. This helps to make our church more environmentally sustainable and follows the Diocese greener churches aim to achieve net zero carbon by 2030 for churches. A big thank you goes to Jason our electrician and to Paddy for carrying out the work, and also to the diocese for giving us a grant to help us pay for the cost of carrying out the work.

If, like me, you enjoy reading, then this month you will be pleased to learn that on the 9th it's "Book Lovers Day". On this day we are encouraged to put down our smartphones, and read a book instead. Before 1439 all books were handwritten by Monks, (Scribes to give them their proper title). Books in this period were beautiful to look at, but slow and costly to produce. Johannes Gutenberg changed this when he invented a mechanized printing press, allowing a large number of books to be produced at one time. Books as a result became more accessible. The Bible was one of the first books printed on his machine, and today it is the best selling book of all time with an estimated five billion copies in print. So when you hear the Gospel being preached in church on Sunday you are hearing a story from an all-time best selling book, one that is printed in multiple languages and sold worldwide.

At the end of this month we remember the Freckleton Air Disaster and our thoughts go out to families who lost loved ones in this tragic event. I met Ruby, one of the few survivors of the crash, when she was giving a talk about the disaster to our Mothers Union.

Her story is amazing, especially when she mentions seeking shelter under her school desk as the plane crashed into the classroom, a very practical action for someone so young to take. Ruby remembers being reluctant to move away from its safety, until an American airman found her amongst the debris and coaxed her out.

Seeing the pictures of school friends, teachers and news articles from August 1944 you can begin to understand the devastating effect the crash had on the village and why strong ties still exist between America and Freckleton to this day.

We look forward to next month's "Benefice Mission Weekend" and the events to be held in both parishes. If you are unsure where and what is taking place then these dates need to be put in your diary:-

Friday September 19th, there will be "Chocolate Bingo" and Pizza Tea at St. Pauls School.

Saturday the 20th is **Fun Day** at Holy Trinity School Freckleton, with numerous events taking place.

Sunday the 21st our celebrations end with "Songs of Praise" with a Cream Tea afterwards at St Paul's Church.

All these events are free and I hope many of you will come along and join us to share a weekend full of laughter, games and food.

A hearty thank you goes to Rev Tracy, our PCC and the Blackburn Diocese for their support and for the hard work that has gone into planning and making this weekend possible.

Gill Maelzer, one of our Mother's Union members, kindly agreed to speak at our meeting in June. She decided to call her talk "Care Home Capers" reflecting the fun and adventures during her time in Wales.

In 1993 Gill and her husband Norman decided to have a complete change of career and ended up taking on a private care home in Powys, Wales. Gill, Norman, their cat CJ and dogs Patsy, Jo and Meg moved across country to the home which was one mile outside the village, surrounded by farmland and hundreds of sheep. It had three floors, nine bedrooms and along with the house, they inherited three gentlemen, Tom, Emery and Gordon. They had been placed there from institutions, as wards of court, and the farmhouse was their home.



They had many challenges to meet and overcome but much fun and laughter. Emery even used to wait up for Gill to come in, before he would go to bed. They also looked after gentlemen on respite, for a few days at a time. They were people from all walks of life and, after they had gone, they would sometimes drop by for a coffee and a chat.

They also rescued injured and orphaned animals. They had ducks, ducklings, swallows, a woodpecker, goslings, which they helped and returned to the mother goose, baby owls and rabbits which they bottle fed and released. It was a very happy time for Gill and Norman and after 13 wonderful years in Wales they moved to France, before moving back to the UK in 2020 and finding a home in Warton.

It was very kind of Gill to talk to us about her inspirational life and show us some fabulous photographs. It was a lovely, relaxed meeting, a great speaker, wonderful company, prayer, fellowship, lots of chatter, tea and cake.

We have our two summer trips coming up, thanks to Chris for organising these.

In July -Northwich Artisan Market and National Trust Castle. In August – A trip to Barnard Castle and Bowes Museum.

Please note that September's meeting has been brought forward to the **17**th of September.

We have recently had some visitors to our group, which is wonderful. If you would like to come and join us, even if you would just like to give it a go, you would be very welcome.

It was with great sadness that we received the news that Pamela Cawthorne passed away on Thursday 10th July.




