Dear Friends

This week we celebrate All Saints' Day at 9.30am on Sunday, as well as remembering the souls of our dearly departed in the 4pm Remembrance Eucharist.

All are welcome to come along, simply to take some time out and light a candle in memory of their loved ones.

Through baptism we become members one of another in Christ, members of a company of saints whose mutual belonging transcends death.

All Saints' Day celebrates men and women in whose lives the church as a whole has seen the grace of God powerfully at work. It is an opportunity to give thanks for the grace which has

helped to shape human life by the example of those who have grown in holiness through the crises and the ordinary circumstances of life.

The commemoration of the Faithful Departed gives us the opportunity to celebrate the saints in a more local and intimate key. We remember with thanksgiving before God those whom we have known more directly, those who gave us life or nurtured us in the faith.

Redemption is a work of God's grace. It is God who redeems us in Christ and there is nothing to be done beyond what Christ has done, but we still await the final comsummation of God's new creation in the coming of God's kingdom. Here we are joined together in prayer that God's kingdom will finally be revealed in all it's fullness.


10.30am Eucharist each Sunday at Bensham and Teams, St. Chad's
