We will remember them

On Remembrance **Sunday**, **9**th **November** services will be held all over the country to remember all those who died in two World Wars and in conflicts around the World since then. They did their duty and gave their lives in the service of their king and country. Two days later, on **11**th **November** at 11 in the morning there will be further ceremonies to mark the time in 1918 when the guns fell silent.

On **Tuesday 11th November** at 11am there will be a short, simple service led by the rector at Barton Church where the lych-gate is dedicated to those who fell in The Great War 1914 – 18.

This year has been especially poignant as the country remembered the service men and women who died in the Far East, the Forgotten Army who had to fight on after the war in Europe ended until Japan surrendered. Why do we do it? Why will some shops ask people to pause and be silent for two minutes, in the middle of the morning's shopping, at 11am on Tuesday the 11th? Because it is important to remember. to hold the memory of what was done for us all those years ago. They all fought and gave their lives for our freedom; for the freedoms we take for granted every day; for the things we don't even think about. Whenever I lead a communion service, in whichever church I find myself, I say these words of Jesus:

"Do this in remembrance of me...." Words which he said to his friends around the table at what has come to be known as 'The Last Supper'. We are called to Remember, we must not Forget.

Sadly the First World War was not 'The War to End All Wars' as so many hoped. We know that only too well: Korea, Suez, the Falklands, Iraq, Afghanistan. The list goes on, as does the duty and service of our young men and women to this day. Many of us will recognise these words:

"When you go home, tell them of us and say, For your tomorrow, we gave our today."

These are words from a war memorial in Kohima where so many of 'The Forgotten Army' are buried. There is also a Kohima prayer, almost unknown and unrecognised, but which Is as much a prayer for us today as it was a prayer for those who gave their lives for us

so long ago:

Ever-living God, we remember those whom you have gathered from the storm of war into the peace of your presence. May that sense of peace calm our fears, bring justice to all peoples and establish harmony among the nations.

Wildlife Notes

The month of October is a time of great movement in the world of wildfowl with many birds in northern countries moving south to avoid harsh weather. One of those is the Goldeneye Duck which usually arrives on Barton Broad in the last week of October and stays until March or April.

However, it is the sheer number of arrivals which is both surprising and impressive. For example, most of us take the humble Mallard for granted and are not surprised to hear that there are around 61.000 breeding pairs in the UK so a total of 122,000 birds before they start laying eggs. However, as Mallards fly into the UK from France, Holland, Finland, the Baltic States and Russia the number here in mid-winter may be as many as 675,000 birds> This is a massive increase. In the case of Wigeon, a duck which regularly spends the winter on Alderfen Broad and on nearby grazing marshes, the numbers are equally impressive. There is a breeding population of only around 200 pairs so a total of about 400 birds. The winter population is around 450,000 birds by the time that these ducks have arrived from Iceland, Scandinavia and Russia.

I use these figures just to demonstrate the huge number of birds involved in just two species. If you add thousands of Teal, Gadwall, Shoveler, Pochard and Tufted Duck you can see how the numbers of duck increase enormously. Clearly not all these birds are in the Broads but we have our share of them and what it does demonstrate is how important it is to protect wildfowl feeding areas along the migration routes as well as those in the UK.

Our winter swans will also arrive, the larger Whooper Swans from Iceland spend time on the grazing marshes around St Benets Abbey whilst the smaller Bewick's Swans which breed in Siberia are sometimes seen in small flocks around Ludham airfield. Both species have vellow colouration on their beaks unlike the orange beaks of our native Mute Swans. The number of Bewick's Swans wintering in the UK has dropped in recent years with many of them staying in Germany and other European countries as they no longer need to move so far south to avoid harsh winter weather. Add to these birds the Pink-footed Geese which many of you will have already seen flying over our villages. In addition, add the winter thrushes, the Fieldfare and its smaller cousin, the Redwing, plus the finches like Siskin and Brambling, and vou get an idea of not only the huge numbers of birds involved but the distances some of them

Wildlife Working Party

Autumn is here and the working party has finished its chores. Barton Common is again looking beautiful with huge numbers of hawthorn berries, blackberries and more rose hips than I've ever seen. Mast years happen every few years in which bumper crops of berries and nuts are produced because the conditions for their development have been good. Plants try to produce as many chances for next year's seed development as possible. It will take some enthusiastic berry eaters to finish everything on the common. It has been the same in my garden with plenty of walnuts, figs, apples and pears.

Sadly, the beautiful maple tree on the common near Claypits died last year. It seems likely this was caused by the flooding which starves the roots of sufficient oxygen. The same thing happened to the plum trees nearby. The maple had been home to many bird species particularly woodpeckers and nuthatches. However, it was rotting fast, several of the branches had fallen down and we took the decision for safety reasons to fell it. Interesting that the year in which the common was heavily flooded was followed this year by a very dry year and in fact the ponds have nearly completely dried out. Hopefully some winter rain will fill them ready for the great crested newt breeding season. Please let me know if you see any great crested newts and I will record them. Alternatively do it yourselves using recordpool.org.uk.

Roger Lamb again helped us to cut back the meadow and with his tractor-pulled hay raker, piled up the hay. This made made it easier for the working party to collect, remove and add to the grass snake compost heaps adjacent to the meadow. Talking of grass snakes, plenty are being seen on the common particularly under the corrugated iron, with varying sizes from newly hatched of about 15cm long to some whoppers of

over a meter long. On one occasion when we looked a very brave smooth newt, a favourite food of the grass snake, had challenged itself to sit next to three grass snakes which was very risky behaviour! Please


Knit & Stitch

to work. mobius is a two -dimensional surface with only one side and only one edge. These fidget toys are crocheted and the edge can be endlessly pulled out from the centre and used



as a tool for focusing attention or calming restless nerves. It is also great for using up oddments of yarn. A member's friend is a primary school teacher and thought these might be helpful for children who find it difficult to sit still. It was also a great starting project for those who wanted to learn to crochet as it uses only three stitches.

Weather Report for September/October

Drier than average weather continued

in September. The total rainfall recorded for September was 47.6mms/1.87in which is just 79% of average. The highest daily total was on the 17th when 11.6mms/0.46in fell. The highest temperature was 26°C on the 19th and the coldest overnight temperature was 5°C on the 28th/29th. The rainfall recorded for October to date (up to 14th) is 24mms/0.94in which is 34% of average, with 15.2mms/0.6in falling on the 3rd. This was courtesy of Atlantic storm Amy which also produced widespread gales on the 4th and 5th.


