Questions and Answers with Rev. Stephen Radford

You asked us to pose your questions to your local minister (or vicar) - we caught up with Stephen with a range of questions.

How long have you been ministering in this area, and how's it going?

We arrived in 2016 and have completed nine years in the Kirkby Steven, Appleby and Tebay Methodist Circuit. We've really enjoyed it, we've seen lots of new things happening, and had glimpses of God doing new things, some churches reviving, and ecumenical work being particularly powerful.

When you say 'ecumenical' what you do you mean?

Winton and Crosby Garrett are two examples of Local Ecumenical Projects with Baptists and Methodists working and worshipping together. Winton has flourished, being refurbished during COVID and now having a congregation two and a bit times larger than before, with youth services getting 50-60 young people. In Tebay we see the Methodist and Anglican churches worshipping together twice a month as well, so it can look different in different places.

Andrew Sterling has just left recently, will you be getting a replacement?

Andrew did seven years with the Methodist church before he moved on, over the Pennines. Eve Brett was also working with us as a youth worker, she has now gone to Bristol as an ordinand. Leagh Wilkinson has joined us and is now working with young people. I was really encouraged recently to see 45 young people going to <u>3Generate</u> (a Christian youth get

together), compared to just four when we started a few years ago.

Do you think God's only interested in people inside the church?

No, we're seeing something that's being called the "Quiet Revival" where young people are coming to faith and exploring spirituality, wanting to know more about God, and looking for new ways of being church, not necessarily only within existing structures and ways of doing things.

Do you have to be a member to come to a Methodist church?

It would be absolutely fabulous for people to just turn up, our churches will welcome people – we love seeing new people coming through the doors.

If people are finding life difficult, what do you suggest they do if they want to know God more?

There are lots of options – God is ready to respond to us however we come to him, even with just one small prayer. However, there is currently an Alpha course running at Orton, things happening in Tebay for reflective time in nature, work in schools with Northern Interschools Christian Union, and a new website called Sanctuary&Soul which is a spiritual space for people with questions, as well as lots of other options. Or, just get in touch with me or Brendan [Anglican vicar, based in Kirkby Stephen], or talk to someone in your local church.

And what about getting my child christened at church, even if I don't go to church? Or blessing a second marriage, or a cohabiting couple?

Yes! This often happens, it's about blessing the child and celebrating as a family and community, and you don't have to be a regular at church. Blessing people's love for each other, because God is Love, is really important to me. I believe God is a God of second and many more chances, and it's a great opportunity to ask God's blessing.

Any parting thoughts for the November link?

Advent, which starts at the end of November is a wonderful time of preparation, there will be opportunities for people to come together for carols and Christingles. I really hope that many people will find new ways of exploring the advent idea that Jesus is coming into the world as God's plan to reveal His love for everyone.





Orton Harvest Thanksgiving

There were three lovely parts of this!

Families Together in Tebay and Orton Apple Harvest Extravaganza: on the Saturday in Orton Market Hall. A day or two before this event we were afraid that hardly anyone was going to come – but in fact families and people of all ages came pouring in, to take part in all sorts of appley things - activities, races, competitions, songs, and of course food!

Before the various appley desserts, we did have non-appley hot dogs!! I counted 19 children there, as well as parents and grandparents. A lovely, happy time. Thanks, all who worked hard to plan and run this!

Harvest Thanksgiving Communion in church on Sunday. This year we sent out personalized invitations to 24 local farms and people associated with farming; and though quite a number of these people were involved that morning in the Young Farmers' Sports Day, we did have a good representation of the agricultural community at the service, to sing lustily "All good gifts around us are sent from heaven above!"

Harvest Supper in the Market Hall on the Monday. The Hall was packed, the noisy and happy conversations around the tables indicated that everyone was having a good time, and the food, prepared and served by our splendid team, (with the ham donated as usual by the Westmorland Family) was magnificent, and extremely good value, especially because of the second and third helpings we were invited to come back for!

For the first time there was a raffle, which brought in £250 for Derian House Children's Hospice – though it is in Chorley, Lancashire, they do cover our area of south Cumbria too. Their leaflet (which many people took away to read) tells us that in a typical year:

- They care for 400 babies, children, and young people
- They give 2,000 overnight respite stays at the hospice
- They care for 100 neonatal babies facing an uncertain future

- They give 200 families a free week's stay in one of 4 holiday lodges
- 150 siblings enjoy fun days out and memorymaking activities
- 100 parents, grandparents and siblings have access to counselling
- They provide 600 hydrotherapy sessions

As well as the raffle takings, the Orton with Tebay Parochial Church Council had voted to donate £500 to Derian house.

So there was a lot to say "Thank You" for!



TEBAY AND ORTON WI

Over the summer, the WI has enjoyed three meetings away from our base at Tebay Methodist Church. It was lovely to reconvene in September and welcome all of our members - some of whom were unable to join in all the summer activities - and two visitors.

The speaker for the September meeting was lan Jack, a volunteer with the Penrith and District Red Squirrel Group. His work as the head forester for the Lowther estate brought him into contact with red squirrels and his illustrated talk demonstrated his enthusiasm and knowledge of our only native squirrel.

Grey squirrels were first introduced to an English estate in the late 19th century and again in the 1930's. They are bigger, they breed twice a year and have litters of five to six kittens, whereas the red squirrel has one litter a year of only two or three kittens. They also carry the squirrel pox virus, which is deadly to the reds. It is not surprising that the red squirrel population declined rapidly in this country. The Penrith and District Red Squirrel Group covers an area of 611 square miles and employs rangers who control the grey squirrel population and encourage the reds to extend their habitat. Hazelnuts and the seeds of pine cones are the preferred food of red squirrels, but they also include berries, mushrooms and insects in their diet. Because of the toxic tannins red squirrels do not eat acorns.

lan's talk was all the more interesting because red squirrels are becoming a familiar sight in our parishes, and most of our members had a tale to tell of red squirrels in their gardens or on their land.

A donation was given to the Penrith and District Red Squirrel Group in appreciation of Ian's very interesting and informative talk.

Our next meeting, on October 15th, will begin at 12 noon at Tebay Methodist Church.

Karen Hanks, the Federation Chairman, will be giving a talk on Westmorland Women at War.

M6 Lune Gorge update

Following discussions and considerations with the local community and business leaders, we've made the decision to defer our work on the Lawtland House bridge structure, which carries the A685 over the M6.

We'll still need to maintain Lawtland House bridge and it's still part of our long-term work. However, we're prioritising work on the seven bridges that carry the M6 itself.

Westmorland and Furness Council has approved temporary closure of two footpath routes from Monday 6 October 2025 for a six month period, to allow us to carry out essential preparatory work.

Footpath routes:

an approximate 300 metre section of footpath, from just beyond the bottom of Low Lane to just beyond the Tebay M6 bridge

an approximate 642 metre section of footpath, from the entry off the B6260, near to Highbeck Lane, to just beyond Castle Howe

Save Junction 38

The local communities of Tebay, Orton, Kirkby Stephen, and surrounding villages face up to four years of complete disruption, when work begins to replace eight deteriorating M6 motorway bridges, resulting in the closure of Junction 38 in one direction for four years.

Our local MP, Tim Farron, has been actively working on this, alongside local councillors, residents and businesses — they are all appealing for National Highways to reconsider their plans in light of the damage it is going to cause the community.

'There's more to life than Lowry''

This was the intriguing title that faced Appleby Arts Society at their October Meeting in the Moot Hall. Lecturer Ed Williams explained that at the time Lowry was studying Art in Manchester between 1905-1915, the fashion in Art was for landscapes- think JWR Turner and Edward Landseer. Lowry's Tutor, the impressionist painter Adolphe Valette encouraged his students to paint en plain air, but also to stand back and depict the unfashionable modern life of cities. Which of course Lowry did and he is famous for it, though his seascapes and countryside paintings are pretty remarkable too.

Who and where are the other painters of Northern landscapes and cities? Most people could name David Hockney but who has heard of Atkinson Grimshaw or James Dickson Innes? Atkinson Grimshaw (1836painted northern cities including Glasgow, as inspiring places to be-mysterious, smoky places especially in moonlight; and Valette, Lowry's tutor, painted abstract Cezanne- like characters in Manchester's Albert Square, his adopted city. James Dickson Innes (1887-1914)- a Welshmanpainted his Welsh mountains as full of character and atmosphere and almost woodcut like, and not pretty pretty as was fashionable at the time.

It was delightful then that Ed Williams showed the most wonderful slides of the work of three Northern women painters-one well known in these parts too. Firstly, Sheila Fell, (1931-79) raised in Aspatria and who depicts Cumbria as it is at times-dark and brooding and whose work was the subject of a recent retrospective at Tullie House this year; Secondly Joan Eardley (1921-1963) who has a different approach to northern life as she gazes from her Glasgow Tenement window and captures in oil paint the life of the children on the streets; and finally Anne Redpath (1895-1965) a Scot whose portrayal of still life and interiors is packed full of the most joyous and vivid colour.

Finally, two artists mentored by Lowry himself. The most commercially successful women's artist in post war Britain was Pat Gerrard-Cooke (1935-2000) from Cheshire who painted village scenes and rollicking interiors, and from our lecturer's native Wales, Sir John Kyffin Williams (1918-2006), who painted the most wonderful, gritty landscapes of his beloved Anglesey.

Our lecturer encouraged us all to visit local art shows, county museums and art galleries to view our northern painters. Leeds and Scarborough museums have good collections of Atkinson Grimshaw for instance.

The next lecture, on November 12th is 'Women in Art making Music' by A d a m Busiakiewicz,




